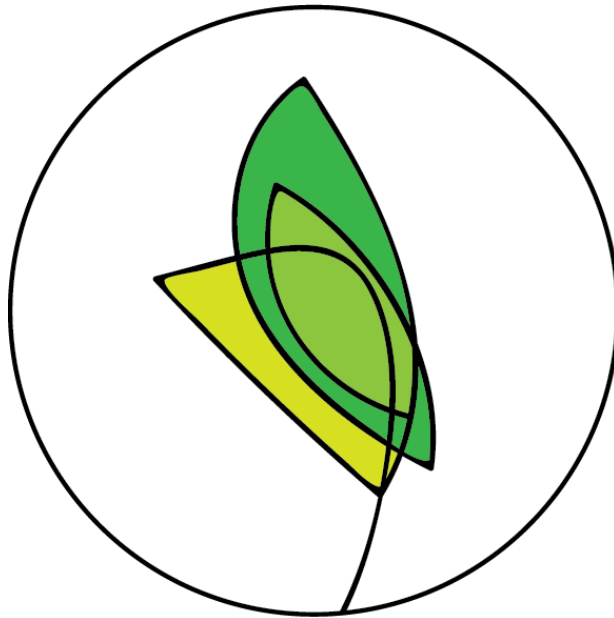

Executive Summary

Haverhill Stem, hereinafter referred to as “Stem”, is an adult-use cannabis dispensary providing a refined, curated shopping experience with a focus on distinctive edibles and signature-strain flowers. Catered toward the discerning cannabis consumer, Stem offers adult-use buyers access to a knowledgeable, professional staff of cannabis enthusiasts to help navigate and select cannabis products satisfying their personal tastes and palates.

Located in Haverhill, Massachusetts, Stem is owned and operated by Caroline Pineau, a long-time local resident and owner of The Yoga Tree, a community-centered yoga studio in the downtown area. Everything from the décor to the product is tailored to the tastes of the upscale, young professionals who are moving in and revitalizing the city. Stem attracts a refined consumer with an interest in learning about and participating in legal, responsible cannabis consumption. The business is located in downtown Haverhill, an area identified by the Cannabis Control Commission as an area of disproportionate impact, contributing to the city’s economic resurgence and core revitalization. Preference is given to local job applicants and contractors to build and sustain a business with strong local roots.

Stem recognizes that the legalization of adult-use cannabis does not align with the personal beliefs of all Haverhill residents. Committed to a community vision, Stem is dedicated to being a good neighbor, adhering to all regulations and ensuring that retail operations contribute to a positive town culture. Stem seeks to displace illegal cannabis dealers by providing a safe, regulated purchase location for consumers from Haverhill and surrounding communities. Further, Stem will implement strict guidelines to ensure the safety and security of its location and its neighbors.

The concept of community empowerment is at the heart of Stem. As the city of Haverhill experiences a rebirth, Stem represents a forward-looking Haverhill, led by local citizens with a desire to contribute to the continued growth of the city’s economy and a positive future for its citizens.

Stem is a female-owned and locally-owned cannabis retail shop dedicated to providing signature products to discerning consumers in a safe, secure setting, and to advancing the revitalization of downtown Haverhill. As one of the Merrimack Valley’s first dispensaries, Stem strives to be the model for the region’s finest dispensary, exemplifying the highest level of compliance, social responsibility and education, transparency, and will work to exceed expectations of community members, local law makers and state regulators.

Site Planning and Parking Analysis

Haverhill Stem LLC is committed to operating a community-centric business contributing to economic development and a revitalized city center. As such, Stem selected a downtown property on Washington Street in need of investment and renovation in order to further the city’s store-front improvement efforts and generate more foot traffic for neighboring businesses.

The property lease agreement for 124 Washington Street, Haverhill MA 01832 will be submitted with the Retail Marijuana Establishment application. The three-story building, with finished basement serving as a 4th usable floor, includes a total of 6400 square feet. Each floor is approximately 1610 square feet. Stem will lease the basement level floor for storage and the 1st floor space street level space for Stem's retail operation. The store location is not within 500 ft of any school (grades K-12) or any other licensed education establishment or daycare facility. The property is located in Haverhill's historic downtown, and is in the downtown marijuana overlay district Waterfront District-A (WD-A), which was included in the final marijuana zoning by the Haverhill City Council in Jan 2019.

Traffic and parking has been a large concern of the City of Haverhill zoning a dispensary in downtown Haverhill after seeing concerns with the openings of dispensaries in Leicester and North Hampton. It is Stem's desire always to work collaboratively with the city on solutions to address any potential concerns that may arise. Stem's research shows that in fact the downtown to be the most ideal location within the city as it pertains to parking.

Since seeing things calm down both in Leicester and North Hampton, Stem reached out to a community in Aurora Colorado and spoke to the woman in charge of marijuana oversight of that city (population 330,000). They have 24 dispensaries (4 in their downtown original Aurora area) and they have seen many old disheveled buildings now enhanced by dispensaries, saying it's had a positive impact on the city of Aurora and its citizens. Aurora has also been able to address a wide array of previously under-funded issues in their community, particularly homelessness through the tax revenue generated by these dispensaries. She stressed that they have never felt the need for a parking/traffic study and the only time they have seen an increase in traffic is opening week of a store and should a dispensary plan an event on 4/20. She also said that unlike restaurants, dispensaries have steady business throughout the day, whereas a restaurant acts more like an "event" with increased traffic at lunch and dinner hours.

Haverhill parking consultant, John Burke, shared some interesting statistics about downtown Haverhill Parking. The most recent Fall 2018 Parking Study, showed that at peak hours the 315 space MVRTA Parking Garage was only at 55% capacity, which I calculate to be approximately 142 unused spaces. The Goecke Deck, in a study done in July 2018, showed at peak weekday occupancy rate of 58% on the 130-space top deck and 40% on the 101-space lower deck approaching the lunch hour (12 noon). By Stem's calculations that's an additional 95 spaces. Cumulatively between those two parking structures (not even including the various other on street and public lots available nearby to 124 Washington St.) there is available parking for 237 spots. Haverhill's parking consultant also mentioned that restaurants are some of the toughest businesses on city parking. Aside from opening week, which will be very well planning with Haverhill officials and police department, this "event" like parking will not be the same with a marijuana dispensary, which will see more steady traffic through the day.

No other proposed retail marijuana establishment in Haverhill will have access to 237 unused parking spots as one in the downtown zone, particularly those in commercial zones on outskirts of town. One proposed dispensary on N. Main Street, which according to the Merrimack Valley Planning Commission is one of the highest trafficked areas in all of the Merrimack Valley, certainly won't have access to that much parking. The city won't benefit from paid parking in those locations either. The data strongly reinforces the downtown would make a fine location for a marijuana dispensary and Stem looks forward to being a part of the fabric of Haverhill's growing downtown.

Estimated Market Place

On November 8, 2016, 1.8 million Massachusetts constituents voted YES on Question 4, the historic ballot initiative that ended marijuana prohibition for adults 21 and older. As a result, marijuana became legal for adults to grow and possess in Massachusetts on December 15, 2016.

Legal marijuana sales, which are expected to begin fall 2018, are projected to reach \$1.2 billion statewide by 2021, bringing in approximately \$240 million in state and local tax revenue, according to multiple analyses.

New Frontier Data, a cannabis industry analytics firm based in Washington, D.C., forecasts \$450 million in Massachusetts marijuana sales in 2018, with sales figures gradually climbing each year as the fledgling industry gains traction. Under that projection, legal marijuana sales in Massachusetts would generate \$90 million in taxes the first year.

Since adult use retail stores have just begun to sell in MA, market projections have largely been based on Massachusetts medical marijuana sales which average \$8 million per-store. This is a fixed consumer base of about 52,500 patients statewide. With adult-use sales offering a much larger consumer base (1.2 million cannabis consumers state-wide), far greater sales can be expected.

Haverhill is uniquely geographically poised in Northeast MA on the New Hampshire border and I-495 corridor, and is the only community in the Merrimack Valley to not have enacted a ban on retail cannabis sales. Haverhill constituents voted overwhelmingly in favor of Question 4 with nearly 56% of voters favoring legal cannabis sales. Although several east lying communities will be opening in the coming months, most communities to the immediate west lying geographic areas of Haverhill will not be permitting licensed Retail Marijuana Establishments.

Stem will meet the needs of 21+ cannabis consumers from Haverhill, Groveland, Lawrence, West Newbury, Merrimac, Methuen, Georgetown, Andover, North Andover and Boxford, a consumer base of more than Stem's product service will help displace the illicit market by offering consumers to safe, regulated, and tested cannabis products.

Cannabis consumers are friends, colleagues, relatives, and neighbors, many with disposable incomes that they are willing to spend on cannabis. The average cannabis consumer spends \$2000 annually and its important and lucrative for Stem to maintain client loyalty and retention.

Pro Forma Financials

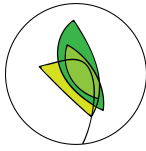
The pro forma financials are based on estimates derived from other retail facilities in other states, money generated by the MA medical market, and predictions of what the MA adult-use market could generate. Many of these numbers are subject to change, consequently the best estimates used are based on historical data which may not hold true in the future.

Assumptions Regarding Stem Pro-Forma Financial Statement

In preparing a pro forma financial statement for Stem, there are a number of assumptions factored into income and expense items and balance sheet items. The capital budget for Haverhill Stem LLC is \$1.5 Million. Stem was formed to provide consumers in Massachusetts with the highest quality of marijuana flower and related marijuana infused products in a safe, welcoming and healing environment. In order to meet this high standard, we have prepared a pro-forma financial statement that will reflect the operational and financial challenges of establishing a new adult-use dispensary that will strive to be the benchmark for others entering Massachusetts cannabis industry.

Each year is categorized as a full fiscal year, however, we are not sure when all permits and licenses will be issued and when Stem will be able to begin dispensing. Consequently, we are utilizing a full year's worth of pro forma data for comparison purposes.

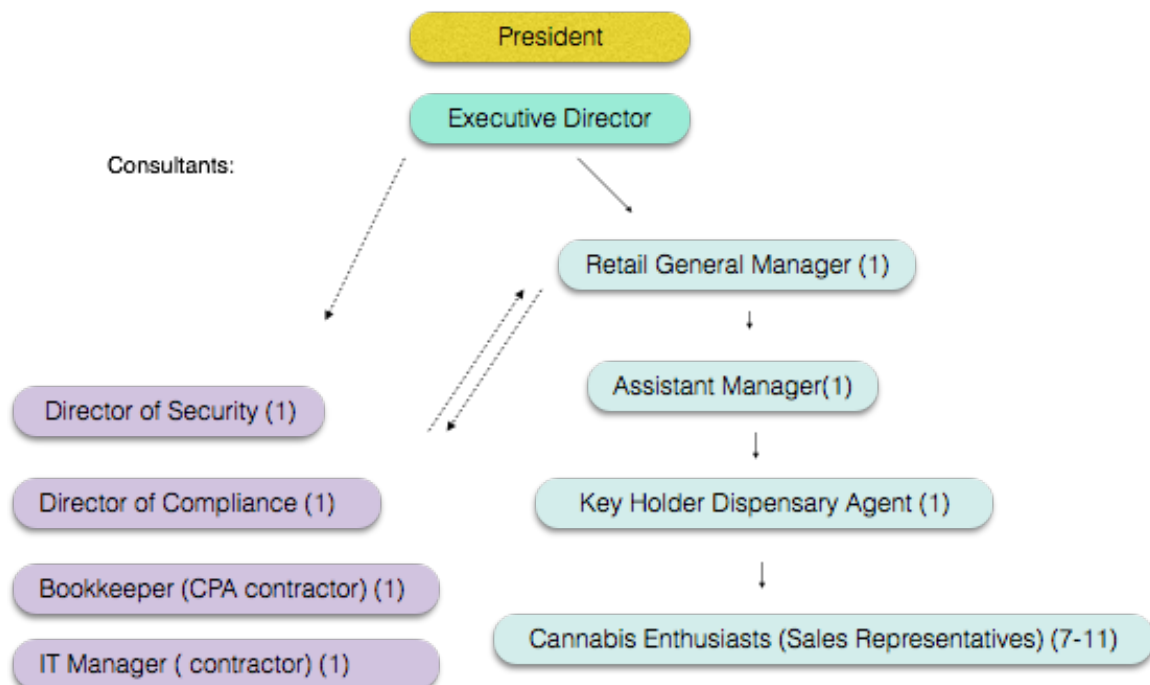

CEO/Executive Director/Owner- Caroline Pineau, Haverhill Stem LLC Retail Marijuana Establishment Licensee

- Responsible for the overall business direction and strategy
- Responsible for the vision of the organization and marketing strategy to build awareness of goods and services, how the business will work within the community.
- Responsible for the accountability of the organization to ensure that all governing laws and requirements are clearly stated and followed by the business and anyone that represents Stem
- Responsible for pricing of products and services as well as business deals with vendors to make sure they operate in accordance to the governing laws of a cannabis recreational facility.
- Responsible for recruitment of employees - Store management, security and sales representatives.
- Responsible for the payment of salaries and all applicable business taxes.
- Constant evaluation of business, its performance and success.

Store Manager

- Store Manager will report directly to Retail Marijuana Establishment Licensee and CEO, Caroline Pineau

Community Outreach Meeting

Store Location: 124 Washington Street, Haverhill MA

On Jan 28, 2019 Stem held a Community Outreach Meeting in line with Cannabis Control Commission's Guidance for License Applicants on Community Outreach. The meeting was held at UMass Lowell's Innovation Hub 2 Merrimac Street, in Haverhill. Within seven calendar days of the scheduled meeting, a copy of the meeting notice, including time place and subject matter, was published in the Lawrence Eagle Tribune, the Merrimac Valley's largest newspaper, as well as filed with the Haverhill's City Clerk, Planning Board, contracting authority, City Council and Mayor's office. Letters regarding the meeting were also mailed to abutters within 300 ft. of the proposed property address. The meeting had 30 attendees and was very positive.

Meeting Content Included:

- Location of proposed marijuana establishment as part of WDA pursuant to Haverhill's proposed marijuana overlay district to operate as a licensed Retail Marijuana Establishment.
- Review of Special Permitting Required by City of Haverhill to operate as a licensed Retail Marijuana Establishment
- Process taken by Stem to prevent diversion to minors.
- Discussion of proposed location compliance with the 500-ft (amended to 250-ft for WDA zone) buffer zone from existing public or private school buildings
- Demonstration property will comply with the security requirements set forth by 935 CMR 500.
- Information to demonstrating how Stem intends to ensure that the location will not constitute a nuisance to the community as defined by law
- Positively impact the community through local tax, prearranged through a Host Community Agreement with the City of Haverhill, charitable contributions
- Time for community members to ask questions and receive answers from Caroline Pineau and Stem's team of compliance and security experts.

Host Community Agreement

On Dec 28, 2018, Stem signed a Host Community Agreement with the City of Haverhill, including a Community Impact Fee of 3% of the store's annual gross. A copy of the signed Host Community Agreement Form will be submitted to the Cannabis Control Commission with the submission of Stem's Retail Marijuana Establishment application.

License to Operate

Stem will apply for a brick and mortar retail license with the Cannabis Control Commission, Massachusetts's agency that develops and enforces marijuana legislation and policy, to become a licensed Retail Marijuana Establishment. Stem was already approved as Economic Empowerment priority applicant by the Cannabis Control Commission on April x, 2018, qualifying the following areas:

- a. A majority of ownership belongs to people who have lived for five of the last preceding ten years in an area of disproportionate impact, as determined by the Commission.*

- b. *A majority of ownership has held one or more previous positions where the primary population served were disproportionately impacted, or there the primary responsibilities included economic education, resource provision or empowerment to disproportionately impacted individuals or communities;*
- c. *At least 51% of current employees or subcontractors reside in areas of disproportionate impact and by the first day of business, the ratio will meet or exceed 75%.*
- f. *Other significant articulable demonstration of past experience in business or practices that promote economic empowerment in areas of disproportionate impact.*

Once approved as a licensee by the Commission Stem will be a licensed “Marijuana Retailer”:

Pursuant to 935 CMR 500.000 a “Marijuana Retailer” means an entity licensed to purchase and transport cannabis or marijuana product from Marijuana Establishments and to sell or otherwise transfer this product to Marijuana Establishments and to consumers. Retailers are prohibited from delivering cannabis or marijuana products to consumers; and from offering cannabis or marijuana products for the purposes of on-site social consumption on the premises of a Marijuana Establishment.

Stem will need to apply for a special permitting with the Haverhill City Council to operate as a licensed Retail Marijuana Establishment in the city.

Licensing Costs:

- *Application Fee for Retail (brick and mortar) License: \$300*
- *Estimated costs associated with criminal background check fees: \$50*
- *Annual License Fee: \$5,000*
- *Fee for Special Permit (City of Haverhill): \$250 + \$100 Site Review Fee*

Funding Information

Stem’s start-up capital is privately sourced a promissory note from family. Detailed documentation from all sources of financing will be provided to the Cannabis Control Commission with the application outlining adequate capital resources to start up and operate a high-end Retail Marijuana Establishment. Stem has also secured financing on product as part of a Wholesaler Agreement with Revolutionary Clinics.

Insurance & Bond

Pursuant to 935 CMR 500.105(10)(a) Stem will obtain and maintain general liability insurance coverage for no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 in aggregate, annually, and product liability insurance coverage for no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,00 in aggregate, annually. The deductible for each policy shall be no higher than \$5,000 per occurrence.

Haverhill Stem LLC has secured a surety bond for a retail marijuana dispensary should the business need to wind down in the amount of \$5000.

Plan for Obtaining Marijuana and Marijuana Products

Stem has already formed relationships with multiple cultivators throughout the state to insure there is sufficient product for its customers. Stem has a signed wholesaler partnership agreement with **Revolutionary Clinics**, a well-established and vertically integrated cannabis company with medical dispensaries already operating in the state and large cultivation facility in Fitchburg MA.

Revolutionary Clinics is well poised for growth to support the retail market and retail operators like Stem. (Please see Supplier Agreement- Attachment A)

Stem also has a second wholesaler agreement signed with **Garden Remedies** to ensure consistent product access to our customers. (Please see Supplier Agreement- Attachment B)

Stem plans to memorialize its supplier agreements with Revolutionary Clinics and Garden Remedies once Stem receives its final license from the Commission. At this time, there will be final contracts in place with named marijuana product providers to assure the inventory at Stem is sufficient to meet demand.

Prior to arriving at Stem's Marijuana Establishment, all cannabis products will be tested by cultivator per the state's mandate by an outside laboratory for 1. Purity 2. presence of heavy metals 3. microbiological organisms such as yeast, mold, or other bacteria 4. Residues of pesticide 5.any

foreign matter 6. Cannabinoid content 7. Terpenoid Content.

In the unlikely event of a product recall originating from an outside vendor, we will have a plan in place to contact customers who have, or could have, obtained the product from our dispensary.

Marketing Plan

Marketing Strategy

Stem will comply with all Cannabis Control Commission and relevant state regulations and restrictions covering marketing and advertising. Stem will have educational materials on responsible cannabis use available to all customers.

To compete the emerging adult-use cannabis market in Massachusetts, Stem will offer a wide array of products and seek customer retention. Stem's customers will return time and time again to Stem's convenient downtown location for product consistency, availability, and to shop in a safe, discreet and sophisticated environment. Consumers will be greeted by knowledgeable sales staff who will help them make an educated decision on which cannabis product(s) are most appropriate for them. Despite one in five Massachusetts citizens use marijuana, the stigma surrounding the cannabis continues to exist. Stem's sophisticated and professional environment will help to educate consumers and mitigate stigma and stereotype about cannabis use.

Positive Impact & Economic Empowerment Plan

As a designated economic empowerment applicant, Caroline Pineau, Stem's CEO and founder, has a comprehensive plan for positive impact at the heart of her business model. For the past eight and a half years Caroline has owned and operated a community-centered yoga studio in downtown Haverhill, designated by the Cannabis Control Commission as an area of disproportionate impact. As a woman business owner and long-time Haverhill resident, Caroline has created a yoga studio that serves as a sanctuary for people within the Haverhill community, where the primary population served is disproportionately impacted. The Yoga Tree is a place of empowerment--- a place that fosters health, wellness, education and community.

Caroline will use this same community-centered approach to building Stem. [Stem will also work with these organizations to create employment opportunities and to help with job training.](#)

A. Community Programming with Haverhill Boys and Girls Club

The mission of the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club is "to inspire and enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens, and to provide the youth of Greater Haverhill with a safe, clean, wholesome environment that will allow our members to strive towards excellence." Stem and its employees will commit community service time to support special programming at the Club through quarterly in person volunteer visits to the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club, Stem employees will help club staff facilitate the success of the below named programs. As a respected female business owner within Haverhill, Caroline Pineau will personally participate in the club's female empowerment program called "SMART Girls." Caroline has had a long relationship with the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club through her yoga studio and has met with board members and the Executive Director to commit volunteer hours with following programs.

- **SMART Girls** – This program helps girls develop healthy attitudes. It is a small-group health, fitness, prevention/education and self-esteem enhancement program designed to meet the developmental needs of girls in three age groups, spanning ages 8 to 18. Through dynamic sessions, participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own and societal attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good health care and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.
- **Passport to Manhood Program** -- Passport to Manhood encourages boys aged 8 to 14 to develop and mature into young men. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young boys in discussions and activities that reinforce character, leadership and positive behavior. Each participant receives a "passport" to underscore the notion that he is on a personal journey of maturation and growth. Each of the program's 14 sessions use interactive activities to focus on a

specific aspect of character and manhood. It also includes a service project where boys learn the importance of giving back to the community.

- **SMART Moves (Skills Mastery and Resilience Training) prevention and education program** – This program addresses problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity. SMART Moves uses a team approach that involves Club staff, peer leaders, parents and community representatives. Young people ages 6 to 15 engage in discussion and role-playing, practicing resilience and refusal skills, developing assertiveness, strengthening decision-making skills and analyzing media and peer influence. The ultimate goal is to promote abstinence from substance abuse and adolescent sexual involvement through the practice of responsible behavior.

B. Community Programming with Emmaus House

Another charity that Caroline has been involved with in Haverhill for years is Emmaus House, Inc. Emmaus's mission is "We affirm the value of human dignity and self-respect for every person. We are called by our collective spiritual and social responsibility to serve all people in need—the homeless, disadvantaged, disabled, unemployed, and oppressed. Our goal is to enhance societal and personal advancement through provision of housing and support services that empower individuals and families to reach their fullest potential." Emmaus helps people rebuild their lives by creating and renewing a sense of community.

Caroline and Stem will aid Emmaus House through bi-annual service opportunities with Stem staff including off-site projects such as running food or supply drives, preparing and delivering meals, and putting together hygiene or other kits for Emmaus residents. Emmaus House has been contacted by Stem and can receive financial donations that Stem plans on making to their organization and will work with Stem in the furthering goals of the Emmaus House.

C. Participate in local job fairs bi-annually to ensure that 75% of Stem's staff is from Haverhill, an area of disproportionate impact. Stem will employ local citizens with diverse socio-economic backgrounds wherever possible. Through local hiring, Stem will promote and support economic empowerment in Haverhill, a community impacted by high arrests and incarceration. Stem will host its first local Haverhill job fair in July 2019.

D. Participate in at least 100 hours of community service annually in the city of Haverhill. This will be a company-wide initiative in which each employee will participate to help some of the wonderful organizations working to revitalize and economically empower Haverhill. Organizations will include but not limited to the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club, Emmaus House, and Team Haverhill. As attachments to these plans are letters from all the above named Non-Profit organizations memorializing Stem's pledge to partner with the organization.

In addition to Stem's previously stated plans for bi-annual off-site service projects with Emmaus House and quarterly volunteer commitment with the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club, Caroline also wants to further positively impact the Haverhill community and Stem's specific geographic location within Haverhill through its work with Team Haverhill.

Stem will participate in two volunteer opportunities annually with Team Haverhill. The first annual volunteer opportunity with Team Haverhill is its River Ruckus Festival, an annual festival that showcases everything Haverhill has to offer, including the Merrimack River. This community offering is a way to bring community together, to showcase Haverhill's budding historic district, to highlight business and promote commerce in the downtown area. Stem will also volunteer annually with Team Haverhill's Annual "Small Projects Big Impact". Several examples of Small Projects Big Impact include ongoing projects to beautify and brightening up the downtown through clean-up efforts and landscaping. There is also an annual book drive to contribute to 'Haverhill Promise', an initiative started by State Representative Andy Vargas to help acquire books so that kids can get up to grade level reading proficiency by grade 3.

E. Community Education- Stem will host educational seminars bi-annually about the cannabis industry throughout the community to help minimize the stigma surrounding the cannabis plant and industry as whole. Topics discussed in these seminars will include youth use and prevention, impaired driving, and responsible cannabis consumption. Stem will be a good neighbor and corporate citizen.

F. Business Referral Program- In addition to being active participants in the Greater Haverhill Chamber of Commerce and staying very connected to the Haverhill business community, Stem remains committed to being a good neighbor and corporate citizen. With Stem's unique downtown location, Stem will support other local businesses in the WDA & WDA B (Waterfront Districts A & B) by referring its customers on a daily basis to the wonderful restaurants, coffee shops and other retail establishments within walking distance of Stem. Stem believes in synergistically working with other businesses for communal success and empowerment. Stem can play its part on in this by highlighting all of the wonderful things our growing city epicenter has to offer. When customers patron Stem, they will be given digital recommendations through their ecommerce presence and through written collateral with recommendations by Stem staff of where to visit either while they wait or prior to or post visiting Stem's Licensed Marijuana Establishment, so that downtown Haverhill can become a destination shopping experience.

Program Assessments

Yearly upon application for renewal, Stem will utilize the following proposed metrics to assess its Positive Impact and Economic Empowerment Plan and to account for the progress of the plan.

- Accounting of how many youth have gone through the above-mentioned Boys and Girls Club Programs.
- Assessment of how many people have been impacted by Emmaus House financial donations as well directly impacted through Stem staff participation in off-site volunteer projects such as running food or supply drives, preparing and delivering meals, and putting together hygiene or other kits for Emmaus residents.
- Post mortem debriefs with organizers of Team Haverhill's River Ruckus and Small Projects Big Impact to assess Haverhill community participation in each event and how to enhance such participation in future years.
- Documentation from job fairs attended or hosted by Stem's demonstrating participation and impact with these local job fairs. This documentation will include the number of interviews and or discussions between potential job applicants and Stem at each event.
- Acquiring testimonials from abutters, fellow business owners, and residents in the WDA and WDB districts as to Stem's Positive Impact in the downtown business community and effectiveness of Stem's business referral plan.

Requirements to Enter Store: Restricting Access to age 21 and Older

The primary layer of security to resist access to consumers age 21 and older begins the moment the individual walks into the facility from the street entrance. Every individual seeking access to the Marijuana Establishment will be greeted by an employee, seated in a secure guard booth, wearing a clearly visible picture ID who will examine the customer's form of identification to ensure he or she is over 21 years of age, and the document presented is indeed authentic. Proper forms of ID will be a valid driver's license, state issued ID, military ID or passport. A scanner and / or software authentication technology will be on hand should clarification be required. This sally-port location will serve as a secure vestibule, to which access is controlled by the ID checker, ensuring and strictly limiting entry to the main sales floor to only those age 21 and older.

Marijuana Establishment Agents

Stem shall apply for Marijuana Establishment Agent Registrations for all board members, directors, employees, executives, managers, and volunteers who are associated with the Marijuana Establishment. The Cannabis Control Commission will issue a Marijuana Establishment Agent registration card to each individual determined to be suitable for registration. All individuals shall: be at least 21 years old, never been convicted of an offense involving distribution to minors and be determined to be suitable for registration consistent with provisions of 935 CMR 500.800 and 500.802. Registration cards are valid for one year from the date of issue and shall be renewed on an annual basis upon determination by the Commission.

Stem will immediately terminate employment of any Marijuana Establishment Agent who has:

- Diverted Marijuana, which shall be reported to law enforcement officials and the Commission;
- Engaged in unsafe practices with regard to operation of the Marijuana Establishment, which shall be reported to the Commission; or
- Been convicted or entered a guilty plea, plea of nolo contendere, or admission to sufficient facts of felony drug offense involving distribution to a minor in the Commonwealth, or a like violation of the laws of another state, the United States or a foreign jurisdiction, or a military, territorial, or Native American tribal authority.

Marijuana Establishment Staffing Goals & Training

The sale of cannabis and cannabis related products will require a certain level of expertise to ensure that our customers receive the information needed to make an informed purchasing decision. Wherever possible, we will look to recruit experienced and qualified individuals coming from the medical cannabis industry or other licensed marijuana establishments, especially as it pertains to the foundational staff. These foundational employees will be required to have an understanding or willingness to understand the rules and regulations around recreational cannabis sales. They will need to demonstrate knowledge of cannabis plant, various product benefits and effects, able to answer consumer questions and educate consumers on safe use.

A secondary goal, since this is a consumer business, will be to employ honest and customer centric individuals that are willing to put the time in to help us grow this new business and maintain long-term customer relations. They will need to be fully educated on the product, process and needs of each customer including past purchases and any eligibility for customer loyalty benefits.

Training of Marijuana Establishment Agents

Stem strives to become the premiere recreational cannabis business in Haverhill Massachusetts and looks forward to working with members of the community, which includes the hiring and training of qualified applicants within the city. Through a comprehensive *Responsible Vendor Training Program* under 935 CMR 500.105(2)(b), the organization will have the ability to develop product experts who share our passion for the city and its residents. Staff will also be required to receive 8-hr of ongoing training annually. While we look to employ passionate individuals with industry experience, the organization is confident that it can work with vendors to develop this knowledge over time with residents who have intimate relationships with future customers, community leaders and cooperative businesses in the city of Haverhill, MA.

Marijuana Establishment Agents will go through the state's mandatory licensing regulations including fingerprinting, a criminal record check, and background check.

The specific protocols the all Stem agents will be trained in include:

- A. Stem agents will be trained in the specific uses of cannabis, cannabis derived products, and cannabis plant science.
- B. Stem agents will be trained to use state of the art software to ensure valid 21+ IDs and to look up customer's allowable daily purchase limit.
- C. Stem agents will be trained to wear their ID badges at all times during their work shift.
- D. Stem agents will be trained in the risks and side effects of marijuana
- E. Stem agents will be trained in the specific strains of marijuana which can provide relief for different physical ailments
- F. Stem agents will be trained in transaction management and the point of sale system.
- G. Stem agents will be trained on cash drops, inventory security, and inventory and cash reconciliation.
- H. Stem agents will be trained in CPR and first aid.
- I. Stem agents will be trained in recommended dosages for consumers with specific ailments
- J. Stem agents will be trained to recognize symptoms of substance abuse and report it to management.

- K. Stem agents will be trained in safe food handling techniques for the sale of edibles.
- L. Stem agents will be trained in emergency procedures and responses for burglary, theft, discovered diversion of product, accidents, and any other issue that may arise during business hours.

Diversity Plan

1. Stem's Commitment to Diversity

- Following through on broader external social responsibilities by educating employees in multicultural perspectives.

2. As part of its comprehensive diversity plan, Stem has adopted the following general program goals:

- a. To identify areas of underrepresentation of racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, the disabled and members of the LGBTQ community and outline the action steps necessary to increase their representation in those areas where they are significantly underrepresented.
- b. To employ racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, the disabled and members of the LGBTQ community throughout all levels of the organization and throughout all job classifications and occupational categories.
- c. To prevent discriminatory practices relating to employment, or access to promotion for racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, the disabled and members of the LGBTQ community.
- d. To identify and define problem areas and barriers to achieving workforce diversity and take

- affirmative action where necessary.
- e. To outline and implement management actions and targeted recruitment plans for the attainment of program goals.

4. Action Steps

Stem has and will continue to work with various state and local agencies to work towards its goals of hiring a diverse workforce, supporting that workforce, and promoting a culture of diversity and inclusiveness. Stem will train employees in open and respectful communication and respecting the diversity of all people at all levels of the industry including customers. Stem intends to work with a number of organizations that will assist it with meeting its diversity goals and will network with their constituencies for employment opportunities.

Stem will work with state and local organizations that advocate for LGBTQ communities, to assist Stem in meeting its diversity goals with respect to the LGBTQ communities. Stem will engage with the Merrimack Valley Branch of the NAACP to assist in meeting its diversity goals with respect to African Americans. The NAACP is an advocacy organization whose purpose is to eliminate racial hatred and discrimination and to ensure the political, social, and economic equality of rights of all persons.

Additionally, Stem will work with local organizations that advocates for the disabled and veterans, including the Veterans Northeast Outreach Center in Haverhill and The Arc Greater Haverhill Newburyport to assist Stem in meeting its diversity goals with respect to veterans and persons with disabilities. The Veterans Northeast Outreach Center in Haverhill's primary mission is to "The mission of the Veterans Northeast Outreach Center is to provide the highest quality of services to assist, support, and advocate for all Veterans and their families in Essex, Middlesex, Barnstable and Rockingham Counties. The Arc of Greater Haverhill Newburyport works with disabled populations and mission is to work "tirelessly to strengthen the voice and leadership of people with disabilities while at the same time taking our lead from the self-advocates by listening to what they need and want."

Finally, Stem plans to partner with the Mt. Washington Alliance, a non-profit organization whose mission is to build "A strong, unified Haverhill where all people—with a focus on residents of Mt. Washington—are healthy, safe, proud, and thriving." The Mt. Washington Alliance supports all diversity generally, but it has specific outreach efforts focused on Latino outreach, which will assist Stem in meeting its diversity goals with respect to Hispanics. The overarching goal of the Alliance is to align social and economic opportunities for residents of Mt. Washington with those for the rest of Haverhill and the state of Massachusetts. To achieve this goal, the Alliance coordinates neighborhood efforts, connects residents with job and education resources, and promotes neighborhood initiatives in areas such as housing, health, safety, and community life.

Specifically, Stem will engage the above-mentioned organizations to promote participation in Stem's bi-annual job fairs that promote diversity and recruit women, minorities, veterans, disabled & LGBTQ. To identify a diverse and talented workforce, Stem has already slated its first job fair for July 2019 in the Mt. Washington neighborhood, hosted by the Mt. Washington Alliance, a program of Haverhill based non-profit Community Action. Secondly, Stem will invite all of these above-named organizations to attend Stem's bi-annual training workshops, open to diverse socio-economic backgrounds including women, minorities, vets, disabled & LGBTQ, with topics tailored toward public speaking, professional development, resume writing, management and leadership. Thirdly, Stem will also host bi-annual educational seminars about equity and diversity in the cannabis industry. Stem's engagement with these diverse organizations during Stem's special permit process and hiring process will promote a culture of diversity and inclusiveness, which are at the heart of Stem's mission.

In order to gauge success of Stem's Diversity Plan, Stem has implemented the following metrics for assessing success, impact and effectiveness of its plan. Stem will monitor these metrics on a quarterly basis to assess its plan and demonstrate proof of success or progress upon the yearly renewal of license.

Program Assessment:

- Assess number of persons contacted at Stem's bi-annual job fairs that are minorities, veterans, women, and LGBTQ and include supporting documentation of job fairs.
- Tracking number of individuals from the above referenced demographic groups who were hired and retained after the issuance of a license through the Commission.
- Assess number of persons attending bi-annual training workshops that are minorities, veterans, women, and LGBTQ and include supporting documentation of training workshops.
- Assess number of persons attending Stem's bi-annual educational seminars and include supporting documentation of educational seminars.

Compliance with Federal and State Laws.

Stem will adhere to the requirements set forth in 935 CMR 500.105(4) which provides the permitted and prohibited advertising, branding, marketing, and sponsorship practices of every Marijuana Establishment.

Any actions by the applicant, Caroline Pineau of Haverhill Stem LLC, will not violate the Commission's regulations with respect to limitations on ownership or control or other applicable laws.

Stem will comply with the following federal and state laws regarding, among other things, diversity, discrimination, and equal pay:

The Civil Rights Act makes it illegal to discriminate against someone based on race, color, religion, national origin, or sex.

The Pregnancy Discrimination Act prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of pregnancy and pregnancy-related conditions and requires employers to accommodate pregnant workers.

Pregnant Workers Fairness Act expressly prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of pregnancy and pregnancy-related conditions and requires employers to accommodate pregnant workers.

The Equal Pay Act requires that men and women be given equal pay for equal work in the same establishment.

The Age Discrimination in Employment Act forbids age discrimination against people who are age 40 or older.

The Americans with Disabilities Act prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

Fair Employment Practices Act prohibits sexual orientation discrimination in the workplace.

Comprehensive Security Plan

The safety of Stem's employees and our clientele is our primary operational focus. The team at Stem will design and implement a comprehensive plan consisting of, but not limited to, physical and data protection systems which are fully compliant with all Cannabis Control Commission requirements set forth in MA 935-CMR-500.110, and integrate the latest technology and best practices within the industry. These systems will work hand in hand with Stem's state of the art Point of Sale system to ensure the safety of Stem's guests and to prevent shrinkage.

Plan Specifics:

The primary layer of security will begin when the guest enters the Marijuana Establishment from the sidewalk. They will be greeted by an employee, seated in a secure guard booth, wearing a clearly visible picture ID who will examine the customer's form of identification to ensure he or she is over 21 years of

age, and the document presented is indeed authentic. Proper forms of ID will be a valid driver's license, state issued ID, military ID or passport. A scanner and / or software authentication technology will be on hand should clarification be required. This sally-port location will serve as a secure vestibule, and to limit the number of customers let into the retail sales location, to which access is controlled by the ID checker. We believe it is important to manage the ratio of employees to guests in the retail space to ensure a safe and educational experience for Stem's clients.

The exterior of the property will be well lit and clear of materials both natural and manmade which would encourage loitering or interfere with pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Haverhill Police detail officers will be utilized as needed to assist with patrons and downtown pedestrians to ensure the safety of Stem's clients and our neighboring businesses. Haverhill P.D. also staffs a walking beat officer(s) as a matter of course in order to increase visibility and to discourage crime and disorder in the downtown neighborhood.

Product identified for disposal will be stored in a limited access area separate from salable product. Methodology of disposal will be fully compliant with guidelines set forth in 935 CMR 500.105. Stem will maintain and make available records of disposal transactions in written and/or electronic format for at least three years.

All entrances and exit points will be secured by utilizing a security plan which integrates security personnel, state of the art security cameras and access control devices such as key card readers, scramble pads or biometric technology.

Limited Access Areas as defined in 935 CMR 500.110(4) have been delineated in the architectural design to ensure only the minimum number of employees required to maintain the efficient and safe operation of the dispensary have access. These areas include the area behind the P.O.S. sale counter, daily secure product storage and the cash/product vault area. Depending on their role, employees will be granted the appropriate level of access to perform their specific job within the organization.

Stem shall utilize a multi-layered concept to make the product vault location as secure as possible to prevent, deter and delay unauthorized entrance.¹ The vault will be a separately designed and fortified room requiring the highest level of clearance to access. The vault will have security camera coverage. All limited access storage areas and vaults will be securely locked and protected from entry, except for the actual time required to remove or replace Cannabis.²

No keys will be left unattended or left in locks or placed in a location accessible to persons other than specifically authorized personnel.³ Stem will implement a proactive maintenance, inspection and testing schedule to ensure all security equipment is in good working order, not to exceed 30 calendar days from the previous inspection and test.⁴

In planning the design of Stem, great care went into preventing passersby from being able to observe cannabis products within the dispensary from the sidewalk or a passing vehicle without the use of binoculars or other visual aids, as required by 935 CMR 500.110(1)(L)

All employees of Stem will be given training by instructors certified in certain subjects related to the safe operation of the dispensary. These will include, but not be limited to, fire related emergencies, basic medical response training, active assailant situations, robbery mitigation and crowd management.

Stem will utilize a combination of a monitored alarm service, cameras, door window and motion sensors to provide a safe and secure retail location in downtown Haverhill. A separate duress alarm with switches strategically located at different points within the dispensary will be linked to the Haverhill Police Station via the alarm monitoring company. The alarm system shall be monitored by a UL certified monitoring company. Camera locations will be placed to ensure coverage of all critical locations inside and outside the building. Ninety days of continuous camera data will be stored using redundant raid storage with accurate date/time stamps and overlays in an exportable format easily accessible should it be required.

A backup security system will be in place, or an adequate substitute approved by the Commission to ensure continuous operation of security systems in the event of a power outage. The video and alarm systems are also connected to battery backups to allow the systems to remain functional until the situation can be resolved. The on-site IT equipment will be housed in a secure limited access and environmentally controlled office to protect the equipment from temperature extremes. All alarm and cameras will have remote monitoring and access capabilities. Retail transactions will be recorded and be available upon request of the CCC or law enforcement.

Our intent is to work hand in hand with our local and state organizations and keep an open dialog to ensure the free flow of vital communication. Haverhill Police Chief Alan Denaro has chosen Captain Robert Pistone as his designee as liaison to the Haverhill cannabis retail industry. Stem has already spoken with the Captain and plans on working closely with him and keeping Haverhill P.D. in the loop with Stem's progress.

Hours of Operation and After Hour Contact Information

Stem's proposed hours of operation will be from 11am-8pm (M-Sat) and 12-8 (Sunday). The following after hours contact information will be on file with the Cannabis Control Commission and local law enforcement officials and updated pursuant to 935 CMR 500.000.

Security Procedures & Emergency Protocols

All employees will be trained in our store's protocol for specific emergencies. It is imperative that we keep our customers safe, and that we safeguard the inventory through our implemented security measures.

- A. Our security plan is designed to deter and prevent entry into and theft from restricted areas containing marijuana products or currency.
- B. Our security plan covers not only the dispensary, but our consumers and dispensary agents while on our premises.

- C. Dispensary agents are responsible for ensuring that all doors are locked to ancillary offices, storage, inventory rooms unless being utilized.
- D. Dispensary Agents must create “VISITOR” passes for any vendors or people visiting the dispensary.
- E. Each visitor must sign our log book, and there must be a separate log book for each day.
- F. All visitors must provide a valid government issued ID card, including driver’s license, passport, military ID showing they are 21+.
- G. Dispensary agents will constantly visually survey consumers on premises, and notify a manager if someone becomes disorderly, or attempts to enter any part of the dispensary designated for employees only.
- H. The dispensary agents must insure that all marijuana inventory remains in locked storage which is accessible only to authorized dispensary agents.
- I. Dispensary agents will check all locks and security equipment as part of written closing protocol before leaving at night.
- J. Any keys for dispensary doors or storage cabinets, etc., must be signed out through the manager on duty and signed for. A master key system shall be used, and a key log shall be maintained. The key log shall be checked as part of the 30-day security equipment maintenance inspection.
- K. All areas of limited access will be clearly identified by posting signs that state “DO NOT ENTER. LIMITED ACCESS AREA. ACCESS LIMITED TO AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY”.

Inventory Theft

Inventory theft comes in two forms- inside theft and outside theft. Inside theft occurs when an employee removes inventory without permission and without paying for it. Outside theft occurs when a non-employee steals an item(s) from the dispensary. There is also a hybrid version when an employee collaborates with an outside person to steal inventory from the dispensary.

Our surveillance system is capable of recording all incidents, except those that happen in the bathrooms. However, theft is a crime of opportunity, and with employees it may occur when something is being moved, something is not given to a customer when it is paid for, or when an accounting error occurs and excess inventory over what is reported is either brought to the dispensary or is there after an inventory count.

We have two ways to detect theft –actual observance, or inventory reports that indicate something is missing. If an employee observes a theft by another employee, he or she is obligated to bring it to the dispensary manager’s attention. The manager will observe tapes and inventory counts and determine the correct course of action. When inventory is stolen by an outsider, the police and the executive director are alerted, and the previous robbery procedures are followed in reporting the incident by the director.

Stem has a policy of immediate dismissal of any marijuana establishment agent who has:

- Diverted marijuana, which shall be reported to law enforcement officials and to the Commission;
- Engaged in unsafe practices with regard to operation of the Marijuana Establishment, which shall be reported to the Commission; or
- Been convicted or entered a guilty plea, plea of *nolo contendere*, or admission to sufficient facts of a felony drug offense involving distribution to a minor in the Commonwealth, or a like

violation of the laws of another state, the United States or a foreign jurisdiction, or a military, territorial, or Native American tribal authority.⁵

Fire In Facility

Stem has developed the following fire emergency plan and it shall be taught to all employees and implemented in the event of a fire on the premises.

- A. In the event of noticing smoke or a fire, pull the fire alarm and begin evacuation.
- B. If there is time, the dispensary manager, if time allows, should move all inventory from the say storage to the safe, along with cash from the registers. This should only occur if the dispensary manager does not see open flames, or smoke that is too dense to walk through.
- C. The dispensary manager, is safe to do so, should move through all of the rooms in the dispensary, and insure that everyone has made it out safely.
- D. In the event that fire is small and containable (like a toaster oven fire), there are portable fire extinguishers throughout the dispensary. Use with extreme caution, and if the fire is in an electrical juncture box, move away and insure the facility is empty.
- E. Make sure the entrance to the facility is unobstructed for the fire department vehicles.
- F. When firefighters arrive, detail where you think the fire started, and where it is the heaviest.
- G. Immediately inform the executive director of the fire and current situation. Remember acronym RACER

R- rescue people from the immediate area. Move people away from the smoke and fire, and yell to insure the dispensary is empty.

A - Activate the nearest alarm, and contact 911 with the address of the facility. Provide your name, the location, where the fire might be coming from, and stay on the line while they respond.

C - Contain the fire by closing all windows or doors if possible

E - Extinguish the fire with an appropriate fire extinguisher for the type of fire being fought (i.e. electrical, chemical, etc.) Only do so if it does not involve any risk of life

R - Relocate to a designated safe area. Make sure the dispensary is cleared, and move people away from the entrance and any windows. Have Manager perform a head count of employees.

Fire Extinguisher Use

Policy is to evacuate the building upon hearing the fire alarm. A fire extinguisher is only to be used if fire or smoke is blocking the evacuation route.

The following steps shall be followed to safely exit an area if all exits are blocked by fire:

- If possible and safe to do so, sound the fire alarm and call the fire department. The fire department must be notified of all fires.
- Identify a safe evacuation path before approaching the fire. Do not allow the fire, heat, or smoke to come between you and your evacuation path.
- Discharge the extinguisher within its effective range using the P.A.S.S. technique (pull, aim, squeeze, sweep).
- Back away from an extinguished fire in case it re-ignites.
- Evacuate immediately as soon as it is safe to do so.

NOTE: All fires must be reported to the Fire Department immediately, regardless of size or status is. Even fires that are extinguished must be reported immediately.

P.A.S.S. technique is not intended to fight a fire; it is only meant to assist with an escape or put out a small fire such as a toaster oven.

The P.A.S.S. Technique

1. **PULL...** Pull the pin. This will also break the tamper seal.
2. **AIM...** Aim low, pointing the extinguisher nozzle (or its horn or hose) at the base of the fire.
3. **SQUEEZE...** Squeeze the handle to discharge the extinguishing agent.
4. **SWEEP...** Sweep from side to side aiming at the base of the fire until it is out. Watch the area; do not turn your back to the fire area. If the fire re-ignites, repeat steps 2 - 4.

If you can do so safely....EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY!

Prevention of Diversion & Prevention of Diversion to Minors

In order to prevent diversion, Stem will rely heavily on promoting an awareness around the very systems and operational procedures used to deter and prevent diversion. Video surveillance cameras will be positioned in all areas containing marijuana, at all points of entry and exit, parking lots, safes, sales areas, storage areas, and marijuana handling areas. Surveillance cameras will be running 24 hrs a day. Cameras will be strategically positioned to immediately capture a clear and color still photo of any person, with date and time stamp embedded. Exterior lighting will be installed near video surveillance devices to ensure proper illumination for the identification of people both behind the building in the city's public parking lot as well as on the front entry public city sidewalk, leading into the facility. Stem will use a commercial grade integrated security system to prevent and detect diversion, theft, or unauthorized access. The security system installed will be fully compliant with security requirements required under 935 CMR 500.110(d). Stem will take proactive measures to reduce exposure and likelihood of violent crime. Professional security personal will be present during all hours of operation. This will greatly

increase the safety and security of the store and create a visible deterrent to diversion, theft and other violent crimes.

All marijuana products shall be stored in such a manner as to prevent diversion, theft or loss, and will be returned to its secure location immediately after the completion of the process of at the end of the scheduled business day. In order to ensure that cannabis is securely stored and avoid any threat of loss and diversion, Stem shall:

- Not maintain cannabis in excess of the quantity required for normal, efficient operation.
- Store all marijuana and marijuana in secured locked safe;
- Keep all approved safes and areas used for storage of cannabis securely locked, except for the actual time required to remove or replace cannabis;
- Keep all locks and security equipment in good and working order;
- Not allow keys to be left in locks and not store or place keys in locations accessible to persons other than specifically authorized personnel;
- Not allow other security measures, such as combination numbers, passwords or electronic or biometric security systems, to be accessible to persons other than specifically authorized personnel; and
- Keep limited-access areas securely locked and protected from authorized entry at all times.

The outside perimeter of the premises will be sufficiently lit to allow for surveillance cameras. Trees, bushes, and other foliage outside of Stem will be maintained to prevent a person or persons from concealing themselves from sight. Loitering on or near Stem will be strictly prohibited. Only individuals engaging in activity expressly or by necessary implication permitted by 935 CMR 500.110(b), and its enabling statute are allowed to remain on the premises. Local law enforcement will be called if individual(s) remain on premises after prior request to leave is ignored. Stem's security personnel will routinely patrol the store perimeter and grounds to prevent nuisance activity, diversion, and crime.

Stem will utilize a comprehensive inventory control and seed-to-sale tracking system, intended to prevent diversion of cannabis to the black market and minors. The system requires Marijuana Establishment Agents handling the product to note their taking custody of the product in the system. The chain of custody of all marijuana and marijuana products will be documented, through scanning and logging at all times as it move through each process within the Retail Establishment. Real-time inventory tracking will be conducted and verbally recorded. Stem's POS system will be able to identify patterns in customer purchases that may suggest product diversion and/or excess customer possession. Stem will prominently post and educate consumers on possession limits and reserves the right to refuse sales to a customer who exhibits suspicious purchasing patterns. All Stem employees will be rigorously trained on compliance regulations and diversion prevention prior to performing any job functions, which includes completing Responsible Vendor Training Program Pursuant to 935 CMR 500.105(2)(b).

If loss, theft, or diversion of cannabis has occurred at Stem, the Manager shall notify the Commission and local law enforcement immediately. The Commission and local law enforcement shall determine the appropriate storage and security requirements for all cannabis in the location and may require additional

safeguards to ensure the security of the cannabis.

All marijuana and marijuana products will be sold in child resistant packaging that will be plain and opaque. All product labels will include a required statement: KEEP THIS PRODUCT AWAY FROM CHILDREN, a symbol that indicates the product is harmful to children, and a symbol indicating the package contains THC. Customers will be provided educational materials about the penalties of diversion to minors.

Storage of Marijuana

Stem will store marijuana in compliance with 935 CMR 500.105 (11). Stem will provide adequate lighting, ventilation, temperature, humidity, space and equipment in accordance with applicable provisions of 935 CMR 500.105 and 500.110. Stem will have separate areas for storage of marijuana that is outdated, damaged, deteriorated, mislabeled, or contaminated, or whose containers or packaging have been opened or breached, until such products are destroyed. Stems storage areas will be maintained in a clean and orderly condition and be free from infestation by insects, rodents, birds or pests of any kind.

Security is paramount in all of Stem's storage areas, monitored by 24-hour video surveillance. Stem's storage areas shall be maintained in accordance with the security requirements of 935 CMR 500.110. This is to include marijuana products stored by Stem in established limited access areas pursuant to 935 CMR 500.110 (4) which shall be accessible only to specifically authorized personnel limited to include only the minimum number of employees essential for efficient operation. All marijuana products will be stored in a secured, locked vault in such a manner as to prevent diversion, theft and loss.

All vaults used for storage of marijuana will be kept securely locked except for the actual time required to remove to replace marijuana. Stem will ensure that all marijuana products from the exterior of Stem's premises are kept out of plain sight and are not visible from a public place without the use of binoculars, optical aids or aircraft.

Waste Disposal Procedures

Stem is committed to recycling disposable waste wherever possible, and also to insuring that there is no diversion or any of its marijuana products by being taken out with the trash and then retrieved during the night. The dispensary generates waste from its usual course of business, and on a rare occasion, a package of marijuana may break open or be returned by a customer.

Any solid or liquid waste will be stored, secured and managed in accordance to the procedures specified in 935.500.105(12). Solid and liquid waste derived from marijuana or marijuana products will be properly stored in a locked location under 24/7 video surveillance. Any mixture of products with marijuana waste will be considered "marijuana waste" and disposed of accordingly.

Stem will work with a licensed disposal contractor and/or a licensed waste transfer facility in accordance to EPA guidelines. All waste collection and removal will be fully documented through electronic record stipulating the date, time, type of waste, quantity being disposed of, location of the licensed facility and

agents present during the disposal process. Once properly disposed of, the records will show sign-off from the two agents witnessing the transaction.

The following are the specific procedures for emptying waste at the dispensary:

- a. During the day, all waste is to be placed in the storage container in the work room.
- b. The manager on duty will help put the stored waste in disposal bags, insuring there is no inventory along with it.
- c. The manager will bring the garbage bag of waste outside and immediately lock the door from which he/she disposed of it.
- d. If there is any marijuana waste from a damaged package or customer return it will be placed into a quarantined red bin in the locked secured access area separately from the rest of the marijuana inventory. This area will be monitored by 24/7 video surveillance. The marijuana waste and returns will be inventoried at the end of the next day, with a report being filled out with the weight, product identification number, etc., which will be turned into the book keeper. The manager will coordinate appropriate disposal "marijuana waste" in accordance with MA state law.
- e. All recyclables and waste, including organic waste composed of or containing finished marijuana and marijuana products, will be stored, secured, and managed in accordance with applicable state and local statutes, ordinances, and regulations.
- f. Liquid waste containing marijuana or by-products of marijuana processing will be disposed of in compliance with all applicable state and federal requirements, including but not limited to, for discharge of pollutants into surface water or groundwater (Massachusetts Clean Waters Act, M.G.L. c. 21 §§ 26 through 53; 314 CMR 3.00: Surface Water Discharge Permit Program; 314 CMR 5.00: Groundwater Discharge Program; 314 CMR 12.00: Operation Maintenance and Pretreatment Standards for Wastewater Treatment Works and Indirect Dischargers; the Federal Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq., the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit Regulations at 40 CFR Part 122, 314 CMR 7.00: Sewer System Extension and Connection Permit Program), or stored pending disposal in an industrial wastewater holding tank in accordance with 314 CMR 18.00: Industrial Wastewater Holding Tanks and Containers.
- g. Organic material, recyclable material and solid waste generated at Stem will be redirected or disposed of as follows: Organic material and recyclable material must be redirected from disposal in accordance with the waste disposal bans described at 310 CMR 19.017: *Waste Bans*.
- h. To the greatest extent feasible: Any recyclable material as defined in 310 CMR 16.02: *Definitions* must be recycled in a manner approved by the Commission. Any remaining marijuana waste must be ground and mixed with other organic material as defined in 310 CMR 16.02: *Definitions* such that the resulting mixture renders the marijuana unusable for its original purpose. Once such marijuana waste has been rendered unusable, the mixture may be composted or digested at an aerobic or anaerobic digester at an operation that is in compliance with the requirements of 310 CMR 16.00: *Site Assignment Regulations for Solid Waste Facilities*.
- i. Cannabis waste generated at a marijuana establishment may be ground up and mixed with solid

wastes such that the resulting mixture renders the cannabis unusable for its original purposes. Once such cannabis waste has been rendered unusable, it may be brought to a solid waste transfer facility or a solid waste disposal facility (e.g., landfill or incinerator) that holds a valid permit issued by the Department of Environmental Protection or by the appropriate state agency in the state in which the facility is located. No fewer than two Stem agents will witness and document how the marijuana waste is disposed or otherwise handled (recycled, composted, *etc.*). When marijuana products or waste is disposed or handled, Stem will create and maintain a written or electronic record of the date, the type and quantity disposed or handled, the manner of disposal or other handling, the location of disposal or other handling, and the names of at least two Stem employees present during the disposal or other handling, with their signatures.

Stem will keep these records for at least three years. This period must automatically be extended for the duration of any enforcement action and may be extended by an order of the Commission.

Limited Access Areas

Limited Access areas pursuant to 935 CMR 500.110(4), shall be restricted to employees, agents, or volunteers specifically permitted by Stem, agents of the Commission, state and local law enforcement and emergency personnel. Employees of Stem shall visibly display an employee identification badge issued by Stem at all times while on Stem's premises or transporting marijuana.

All Stem's limited access will be identified by the posting of a sign that shall be a minimum of 12 x 12 and states: "Do Not Enter—Limited Access Area—Access Limited to Authorized Personnel Only" in lettering no smaller than one inch in height. All limited access areas shall be clearly described by the filing of a diagram of Stem's premises to reflect entrances and exits, walls, partitions, storage, disposal and retail sales area.

Stem will ensure all outside vendors, contractors and visitors obtain a visitor identification badge prior to entering a limited access area, and shall be escorted at all times by a Stem agent authorized to enter the limited access area. The visitor badge shall be visibly displayed at all times while the visitor is in any limited access area. All visitors must be logged in and out and that log shall be available for inspection by the Commission at all times. All visitor identification badges shall be returned to Stem upon exit.

Transportation of Marijuana

Stem will, as an element of its Marijuana Establishment License, be licensed to transport its marijuana products from other licensed Marijuana Establishments, and also permitted to contract with licensed Marijuana Establishments to transport that licensee's marijuana products to other licensed marijuana establishments. All transportation times and routes will be randomized and will remain within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Marijuana products being transported shall all be linked to the seed-to-sale tracking program. For the purposes of tracking, seeds and clones will be properly tracked and labeled in a form and manner determined by the Commission.

Any marijuana product that is undeliverable or is refused by Stem will be transported back to the originating establishment. All vehicles transporting marijuana products will be staffed with a minimum of two marijuana establishment agents. At least one agent will remain with the vehicle at all times that the vehicle contains marijuana or marijuana products.

Prior to leaving a marijuana establishment for the purpose of transporting marijuana products, the originating Marijuana Establishment will weigh, inventory, and account for, on video, all marijuana products to be transported. Within eight hours after arrival at Stem, Stem will re-weigh, re-inventory, and account for, on video, all marijuana products transported. When videotaping the weighing, inventorying and accounting of marijuana products before transportation or after receipt, the video will show each product being weighed, the weight and the manifest.

Marijuana products will be packaged in sealed, labeled, and tamper or child resistant packaging prior to and during transportation. In the case of an emergency stop during the transportation of marijuana products, a log will be maintained describing the reason for the stop, the duration, the location and any activities of personnel exiting the vehicle.

All vehicles and transportation equipment used in the transportation of cannabis products or edibles requiring temperature control for safety will be designed, maintained, and equipped as necessary to provide to provide adequate temperature control to prevent the cannabis or edibles from becoming unsafe during transportation, consistent with the applicable requirements pursuant to 21 CFR 1.908 (c).

Transportation Reporting:

Stem Marijuana Establishment agents will document and report any unusual discrepancy in weight or inventory to the Commission and law enforcement authorities not more than 24 hours of the discovery of such a discrepancy. Stem Marijuana Establishment Agents will report to the Commission and law enforcement authorities any vehicle accidents, diversions, losses, or other reportable incidents that occur during transport, not more than 24 hours of such accidents, diversions, losses or other reportable incidents.

Transportation Vehicles:

1. A vehicle used for transportation of marijuana products will be, owned or leased by the Marijuana Establishment or the Marijuana Transporter;
 - a. Properly registered, inspected, and insured in the commonwealth (documentation of such status will be maintained as records of Stem of the Marijuana Transporter, and will be made available to the Commission upon request);
 - b. Equipped with an alarm system approved by the Commission; and
 - c. Equipped with functioning heating and air conditioning systems appropriate for maintaining correct temperatures for storage of marijuana products.

Marijuana products will not be visible from the outside of the vehicle and any vehicle used to transport marijuana products will not bear any markings indicating that the vehicle is being used to transport marijuana products, and any such vehicle will not indicate the name of the Marijuana Establishment or the Marijuana Transporter. When transporting marijuana products, no other products will be transported or stored in the same vehicle. No firearms will be located within the vehicle or possessed by a marijuana establishment agent.

Transportation Storage Requirements

Marijuana products will be transported in a secure, locked storage compartment that is a part of the vehicle transporting the marijuana products. The storage compartment will be sufficiently secure that it

cannot be easily removed. If a Marijuana Establishment, pursuant to a Marijuana Transporter License, or a Marijuana Transporter is transporting marijuana products for more than one Marijuana Establishment at a time, the marijuana products for each Marijuana Establishment shall be kept in a separate locked storage compartment during transportation and separate manifests shall be maintained for each Marijuana Establishment. If a Marijuana Establishment is transporting marijuana products to multiple other establishments, it may seek the Commission's permission to adopt reasonable alternative safeguards.

Transportation Communication Requirements

Any vehicle used to transport marijuana products will contain a global positioning system (GPS) monitoring device that is not a mobile device that is easily removable, attached to the vehicle at all times that the vehicle contains marijuana products, monitored by Stem or Marijuana Transporter during transport of marijuana products, and is inspected by the Commission prior to initial transportation of marijuana product, and after any alteration to the locked storage compartment. Each marijuana agent transporting marijuana products shall have access to a secure form of communication with personnel at the originating location at all time that the vehicle contains marijuana and marijuana products. Secure types of communication include, but are not limited to two-way digital or analog radio (UHF or VHF), cellular phone or satellite phone. The Marijuana Establishment or Marijuana Transporter when choosing a type of secure communications, will consider cellular signal coverage, transportation area, base capabilities, antenna coverage, and frequency of transportation.

Prior to and immediately after leaving the originating location, the marijuana establishment agents will use the secure form of communication to contact the originating location to test communications and GPS operability. If communications or the GPS system fail while on route, the marijuana establishment agents transporting marijuana products will return to the originating location until the communication system of GPS system is operational. The marijuana establishment agents transporting marijuana products will contact the originating location when stopping at and leaving any scheduled location, and regularly throughout the trip, at least every 30 minutes. The originating location will have a marijuana establishment agent assigned to monitoring the GPS and the secure form of communication, who will log all official communications with marijuana establishment agents transporting marijuana products.

Manifests will be filled out in triplicate, with the original manifest remaining with the originating Marijuana Establishment, a second copy provided to the destination Marijuana Establishment upon arrival, and a copy to be kept with the licensed marijuana establishment agent during transportation and return to the Marijuana Establishment or Marijuana Transporter upon completion of the transportation. Prior to transport, the manifest will be securely transmitted to the destination Marijuana Establishment by facsimile or email. Upon arrival at the destination Marijuana Establishment, a marijuana establishment agent at the destination Marijuana Establishment shall compare the manifest produced by the agents who transported the marijuana products to the copy transmitted by facsimile or email.

The manifest shall be maintained within the vehicle during the entire transportation process, until the delivery is completed and Stem will retain all transportation manifests for no less than one year and make them available to the Commission upon request.

The manifest will include:

- The originating Marijuana Establishment name, address, and registration number;

- The names and registration numbers of the agents who transported the marijuana products;
- The name and registration number of the marijuana establishment agent who prepared the manifest;
- The destination of the Marijuana Establishment name, address, and registration number;
- A Description of the marijuana products being transported, including the weight and form or type of product;
- The mileage of the transporting vehicle at departure from originating Marijuana Establishment and mileage upon arrival at destination Marijuana Establishment, as well as mileage upon return to originating Marijuana Establishment;
- The date and time of departure from originating Marijuana Establishment and arrival at destination Marijuana Establishment for each transportation;
- A signature line for the marijuana establishment agent who receives the marijuana products.
- The weight and inventory before departure and upon receipt;
- The date and time that the transported products were re-weighed and re-inventoried;
- The name of the marijuana establishment agent at the destination Marijuana Establishment who re-weighed and re-inventoried products; and
- The make, model, and license plate number.

Requirements for Marijuana Transporters and Marijuana Transporters

Each employee or agent transporting or otherwise handling marijuana products for a Marijuana Transporter will be registered as a marijuana establishment agent and have a driver's license in good standing issued by the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles for all classes of vehicle the marijuana establishment agent will operate for the Marijuana Transporter prior to transporting or otherwise handling marijuana products. A marijuana establishment agent will carry his or her registration card at all times when transporting marijuana products, and will produce his or her registration card to the Commission or law enforcement officials upon request. Marijuana Transporters will use best management practices to reduce energy and water usage, engage in energy conservation and mitigate other environmental impacts.

Inventory Procedures

The inventory control of Stem is designed to account for all the marijuana that enters and leaves Stem's facility. All of the marijuana arrives pre-packaged from the licensed cultivation facility, where it is weighed, inventoried, and bar coded. Marijuana that arrives from the cultivation facility is accompanied by a manifest inside a sealed storage container. The Marijuana Establishment manager is responsible for opening the container, and matching the manifest to the received product. Any discrepancies must be immediately reported to Stem's Executive Director and documented. The container can only be opening in a secure area designated as such, and all of the unpacking is filmed. Stem will use software compliant with the state mandated seed-to-sale inventory management system, Metrc. All of Stem's inventory tracking begins at the seed level, not the cultivation point. The cultivation facility manager maintains supply of specific seeds that have either been purchased or cultivated in house. When finished inventory arrives the dispensary, these are the procedures for controlling the inventory.

- A. All product will arrive to Stem's facility from a licensed transporter arranged through the cultivator. It will arrive in a locked storage container, with an inventory listing attached, and also a copy of the inventory listing inside the sealed container.
- B. The Marijuana Establishment manager receives the storage container, and opens it in the presence of a dispensary agent in the storage room. At all times, the opening and inventory procedures are done in front of one of the surveillance cameras, and the table on which it is done has a surveillance camera mounted directly above it.
- C. The dispensary manager confirms the receipt of all inventory shipped by comparing it to the manifest delivered with the storage container. Upon agreement that the manifest matches the contents of the container, the dispensary manager and the dispensary agent initial the document and before closing fax it to the internal auditors' private fax machine.
- D. The inventory has been placed into the Metrc system at the cultivation facility where it was prepared and labeled, and the dispensary manager confirms that it has been delivered and re-designated as inventory for sale at the dispensary.
- E. The dispensary manager puts all of the inventory into the storage safe. The other copy of the manifest is put into the safe.
- F. As the Stem sells its inventory, Stem's manager removes pre-ticketed packages of marijuana product from the secured access inventory storage room and moves them to the selling floor of the dispensary into the active storage lockers behind the limited access retail point of sales area.
- G. At the end of the day, the dispensary manager completes an inventory reconciliation report that documents what was sold during the day, and the manager adds the manual count to the report. In the event any inventory has damaged packaging or is past its usable date, the dispensary manager moves this particular inventory to a storage container marked "UNUSABLE INVENTORY". The dispensary manager then updates the software to show what specific packages of marijuana product have been moved from the active database to the "dead" inventory file.
- H. When finished, the dispensary manager faxes the reconciliation report to the bookkeeper, who compares the dispensary's inventory with a report produced by the point of sale system that tells what exactly should be present.
- I. If the bookkeeper notices any sort of discrepancy between active inventory and out of date inventory, they flag it on the report and bring it to the internal auditor, and also bring a copy to the Executive Director.
- J. The next business day, the Executive Director will go to the dispensary and an inventory reconciliation to research where the issue may be.
- K. If there is no obvious explanation the executive director will review the dispensary's tapes for the week prior to the issue, and also view all sales and inventory reports produced by the point of sales system for the same time period.
- L. The executive director will act on the inventory issue after documenting where the inventory went missing, and will interview the appropriate personnel to determine whether his or her conclusions are correct.
- M. In the event inventory was taken by dispensary employee they will be terminated and the police will be contacted for possible prosecution.
- N. In the event inventory was inaccurately counted, the executive director will create a report stating such and provide to the CEO. The executive director will also review his or her findings with the dispensary manager in order to flag any compliance issues and if necessary create new procedures to avoid the issue again.

Thorough tracking, and inventory control is critical to the Stem's success. Stem will limit its store inventory of marijuana to reflect the projected needed of consumers in the local market area. Stem will tag and track all marijuana products, using a Commission required seed-to-sale inventory management software. Real-time inventory will be maintained as specified by the Cannabis Control Commission and pursuant to 935 CMR 500.105 (8)(c) and (d). This includes any inventory of marijuana ready for dispensing; all marijuana products stored; all damaged, defective, expired, or contaminated marijuana, and marijuana products awaiting disposal. Stem will establish and maintain responsible inventory controls and procedures, conduct daily and monthly inventory reviews, conduct comprehensive annual inventory reports by use of an oral recording device. The record of each inventory will include, the date of the inventory, a summary of the inventory findings, and the names, signatures, and titles of the individual who conducted the inventory review.

Record Keeping Procedures

Stem will ensure that the records for Stem are available for inspection by the Commission, upon request. Stem will maintain all records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Written records that are required and subject to inspection include, but are not necessarily limited to, all records required in any section of 935 CMR 500.000, in addition to the following:

- a. Written Operating Procedures as required by 935 CMR 500.105(1);
- b. Inventory Records as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8);
- c. Seed-to-sale tracking records for all marijuana products as required by 935 CMR 500.105 (8)(e);
- d. The following personnel records:
 1. Job descriptions for each employee and volunteer portion, as well as organizational charts consistent with the job descriptions;
 2. A personnel record for each marijuana establishment agent. Such records shall be maintained for at least 12 months after termination of the individual's affiliation with the Marijuana Establishment and shall include, at a minimum, the following:
 - a. All materials submitted for the Commission pursuant to 935 CMR 500.030(2);
 - b. Documentation of verification of references;
 - c. The job description or employment contract that includes duties, authority, responsibilities, qualifications, and supervision
 - d. Documentation of all required training, including training regarding privacy and confidentiality requirements, and the signed statement of the individual indicating the date, time, and place he or she received said training and the topics discussed, including the name and title of presenters;
 - e. Documentation of periodic performance evaluations;
 - f. A record of any disciplinary action taken; and
 - g. Notice of completed responsible vendor and eight-hour related duty training.
 3. A staffing plan that will demonstrate accessible business hours and safe cultivation conditions;
 4. Personnel policies and procedures; and
 5. All background check reports obtained in accordance with 935 CMR 500.030.
- e. Business Records, which shall include manual or computerized records of:
 1. Assets and liabilities;

2. Monetary transactions;
 3. Books of accounts, which shall include journals, ledgers, and supporting documents, agreements, checks, invoices, and vouchers;
 4. Sales records including the quantity, form, and cost of marijuana products; and
 5. Salary and wages paid to each employee, stipend paid to each board member, and any executive compensations, bonus, benefit, or item of value paid to any individual affiliated with a Marijuana Establishment.
- f. Waste Disposal Records as required under 935 CMR 500.105(12); and
 - g. Following closure of a Marijuana Establishment, all records will be kept for at least two years at the expense of the Marijuana Establishment and in a form and location acceptable to the Commission.

Quality Control & Testing

No marijuana or marijuana product may be sold or otherwise marketed for adult use at Stem that is not capable of being tested by an Independent Testing Laboratory, except as allowed under 935 CMR 500.000 (in compliance with the *Protocol for Sampling and Analysis of Finished Medical Marijuana Products and Marijuana-infused Products*) and the product must be deemed to comply with the standards required under 935 CMR 500.160. As a Marijuana Retailer Stem will only purchase and accept delivery of marijuana and marijuana products that have been certified to have been tested and exceeded testing standards. Store inventory will be purchased from a variety of licensed marijuana cultivators, craft cooperatives, micro-businesses, and marijuana product manufacturers, which are responsible for testing their marijuana and marijuana products prior to initiating sales with Stem. All marijuana products will be tested for potential contaminants including pesticides, heavy metals, mycotoxins and microbiological contaminants, as well as cannabinoid profiles and ratios. The results from all testing will be incorporated into product labeling information. In the event that Stem is notified that its inventory contains a product that is the subject of a product recall for failing to meet testing standards Stem will immediately remove said products and follow CCC protocols for the disposal of said product.

All marijuana handled in preparation for sale, will be secured in a limited access production area with handwashing sink. The floors, walls and ceilings of this area will be constructed in such a manner that they may be adequately kept clean and in good repair. Antimicrobial paint will be used in Stems production area, and vaults where product is stored and handled. All contact surfaces in Stem's Production Area, including utensils and equipment, will be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Storage and transportation of finished marijuana products will be kept under conditions that protect them against physical, chemical, and microbial contamination, as well as deterioration of them or their containers.

Marijuana Establishment Agents whose job includes direct contact with marijuana or non-edible marijuana products must comply with the requirements for the food handlers specified in 105 CMR 300.000. Marijuana will be prepared in a safe and sanitary manner. Cannabis will be well cured and free of seeds and stems, free of dirt, sand, debris, and other foreign matter; free of contamination by mold, rot, other fungus, and bacterial diseases; prepared and handled on food-grade stainless steel tables; and packaged in a secure area. Marijuana Establishment Agents will use sanitary practices that include; adequate personal cleanliness and thorough hand-washing. Adequate and convenient hand-washing facilities with running water at a suitable temperature will be located in any production areas. The

production area will be supplied with hair nets and rubber gloves. All Marijuana Establishment Agents will wash hands, apply gloves and hair nets any time working with marijuana products. Any time marijuana products are handled in the Production Area, Stem agents will take necessary sanitary precautions to make sure marijuana products are processed and packaged properly, and ensure all edible products will be prepared, handled, and stored in compliance with the sanitation requirements in 105 CMR 590.000.

All storage and transportation of finished marijuana products by Stem Marijuana Agents will be conducted under conditions that will protect the products against physical, chemical, and microbial contamination as well as against deterioration of finished products or their containers.

Stem will comply with state and local plumbing codes to ensure the Marijuana Establishment's water supply will be sufficient for necessary operation. Any private water source shall be capable of providing a safe, potable, and adequate supply of water to meet Stem's needs. All plumbing on Stem's premises will be of adequate size and design and compliant with state and local plumbing codes. Stem will adequately install and maintain plumbing on the premise to carry sufficient quantities of water to required locations throughout the Marijuana Establishment. Plumbing on Stem's premises will properly convey sewage and liquid disposable waste from the Marijuana Establishment. There will be no cross-connections between potable and waste water lines.

Stem will provide its employees with an ADA complaint and readily accessible restroom on the first floor of the premises. All toilet facilities will be cleaned daily and kept in good repair. Stem will have a designated mop closet with sufficient space for the placement of equipment and storage of materials for the maintenance of sanitary operations. Any toxic cleaning items will be identified, held, and stored in our designated mop closet away from any marijuana or marijuana products. Stem will hire a pest control company for monthly inspections of premises and form a pest control binder to document monthly inspections. There will be a dumpster designated outside, with an industrial dead lock with key. Stem's operating systems for waste disposal will be maintained in an adequate manner pursuant to 935 CMR 500.105 (12).

Dispensing Procedures

Dispensing marijuana at Stem will be accomplished by cannabis consumers coming into the safe and secure store to make his or her purchase. Access to the Marijuana Establishment will only be granted to those presenting a valid government issued ID indicating they are 21+ at the guard station upon entering the Marijuana Establishment's secured entry port. When one of the cannabis enthusiasts, Stem's sales agents, makes a sale they will first check the consumers ID a second time to confirm a valid 21+ ID and then that agent will be required to logon to our POS system with Stem's Marijuana Establishment registration number and the agent's identification number and password.

- a. Pursuant to state regulations, all adult use marijuana is dispensed only in pre-sealed, child-proof packaging that contains labeling with the strain, weight, date of packing, and identification as to the grow cycle it originated from.

- b. All packaged adult-use marijuana is bar coded for easier dispensing. It is pre-priced, and the point of sale system will read the barcode and create and invoice with all of the package information on it.
- c. Consumers are not allowed to handle packaged marijuana at anytime. Our display jars are to be handled by Marijuana Establishment Agents only. Consumers are allowed to smell the product in display jars, but the container may only be handled by Stem agents.
- d. In the event the label price doesn't match up to the price on the register, the manager must override the system and charge the consumer the lower of the two prices. After completing this sale, the manager on duty will take samples of pre-packaged product and use the point of sale system in their office to insure the labeled prices match up to price in the online inventory database.
- e. For each transaction, there will be a video camera or cameras recording at each post of sale location allowing for the identification of the dispensary agent distributing the cannabis and any qualifying 21+ cannabis consumer purchasing adult-use cannabis. The camera or cameras shall capture the sale, the individuals and the computer monitors/point of sale system for the sale. Each point of sale station will have a sign conspicuously posted that all transactions are video and audio recorded.
- f. When the consumer has made a choice on a particular strain or marijuana, edible, or other infused product, the Marijuana Establishment agent will retrieve the item from the secure daily inventory case behind the Point of Sale Station, scan the bar code to determine the price, and to insure the product description that shows up on the point of sale register matches the item(s) being purchased, affixing the necessary required label.
- g. The POS system will subtract the product from Stem's inventory list and add all applicable taxes, calculating the final sale amount for collection from the consumer.
- h. The Marijuana Establishment Agent will offer the customer any sort of consumer educational material that may be appropriate, or offer to answer any questions they may have about the product.
- i. All purchases must leave the store in a secure child-proof exit bag inside one of our generic brown paper bags. Stem Marijuana Establishment Agents will ensure the consumer is either offered the receipt by hand, or offered to have it put into the paper bag with their purchase(s).
- j. When accepting currency, always announce "Out of Twenty, out of fifty" or out of whatever denomination bill they provide you. This is to ensure that they realize what bill they had given you, and what change to accept. All \$50 and \$100 bills must be tested with the special pen next to the point of sale system. Simply draw a short line, and if it changes color it is counterfeit.
- k. No programs, flash drives, or any other ancillary equipment may be attached to any computer or point of sale system in the dispensary.
- l. If a consumer appears to be abusing marijuana products, inform the dispensary manager and the consumer that you will have them assist them further with any transactions.
- m. At the conclusion of the sales process, customers will leave the sales area and proceed to Stem's exit corridor.

In accordance with M.G.L. c. 94G, § 7, Stem will not sell more than one ounce of marijuana or five grams of marijuana concentrate to a consumer per transaction. Stem may refuse to sell marijuana products to a consumer if, in the opinion of the marijuana establishment agent based on the information available to the agent at that time, the consumer or the public would be placed at risk. Stem will not sell marijuana products containing nicotine or sell marijuana products containing alcohol, if sales of such alcohol would require licensure pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138.

Stem may utilize a sales recording module approved by the DOR and will not use software or other methods to manipulate or alter sales data. Stem will conduct a monthly analysis of its equipment and sales data to determine that no software has been installed that could be utilized to manipulate or alter sales data and that no other methodology has been employed to manipulate or alter sales data. Stem will maintain records that it has performed the monthly analysis and produce it upon request to the Commission. If Stem determines that software has been installed for the purpose of manipulation or alteration of sales data or other methods have been utilized to manipulate or alter sales data:

- Stem will immediately disclose the information to the Commission;
- Stem will cooperate with the Commission in any investigation regarding manipulation or alteration of sales data; and
- Stem will take such other action directed by the Commission to comply with 935 CMR 500.105.

Stem will adopt separate accounting practices at the point-of-sale for marijuana and marijuana product sales, and non-marijuana sales. The Commission and the DOR may audit and examine the point-of-sale system used by a retailer in order to ensure compliance with Massachusetts tax laws and 935 CMR 500.000;

Stem will make consumer educational materials about marijuana products available to consumers and will have an adequate supply of current educational material available for distribution. Educational materials must be available in commonly spoken languages designated by the Commission, which will include, but not be limited to appropriate materials for the visually- and hearing-impaired. Stem will make such materials available for inspection by the Commission upon request and understands the Commission will establish fines or other civil penalties for a Marijuana Establishment's failure to provide these materials. The educational material will include at least the following:

- A warning that marijuana has not been analyzed or approved by the FDA, that there is limited information on side effects, that there may be health risks associated with using marijuana, and that it should be kept away from children;
- A warning that when under the influence of marijuana, driving is prohibited by M.G.L. c. 90, § 24, and machinery should not be operated;
- Information to assist in the selection of marijuana, describing the potential differing effects of various strains of marijuana, as well as various forms and routes of administration;
- Materials offered to consumers to enable them to track the strains used and their associated effects;
- Information describing proper dosage and titration for different routes of administration. Emphasis shall be on using the smallest amount possible to achieve the desired effect. The impact of potency must also be explained;
- A discussion of tolerance, dependence, and withdrawal;
- Facts regarding substance abuse signs and symptoms, as well as referral information for substance abuse treatment programs;
- A statement that consumers may not sell marijuana to any other individual;
- Information regarding penalties for possession or distribution of marijuana in violation of Massachusetts law;
- Any other information required by the Commission.

Maintaining of Financial Records

Stem will utilize a Point of Sale (POS) system, approved by the Cannabis Control Commission to integrate with Metrc, to maintain business financial records. The POS system will catalogue every activity and sales transaction that occurs at Stem. All sales will be recorded accurately and completely and entered in the POS system. Separate accounting practices at the POS will be used for marijuana sales, marijuana product sales, and non-marijuana product sales.

If the POS system should fail or become unavailable for any reason, all sales will be halted, and the Cannabis Control Commission will be immediately notified. Stem will temporarily close until the POS system is fully operational and functioning again. The Commission will be notified when the POS system becomes available before sales can resume.

The following fields will be tracked in the POS System:

- Date and Time of each sales
- The retail price of purchased products
- The barcode of each purchased product
- Tax collected for each item.

Stem will conduct and record monthly analysis of its POS equipment and sales data. If the analysis determines that the software has been installed for the purposed of manipulation or alteration of sales data, the Commission will be notified immediately. The Commission and the DOR may audit and examine the POS System in order to ensure compliance with Massachusetts tax laws and 935 CMR 500.000. Financial Information and recorded will be stored on redundant, secure servers that employ multiple layers of information security and tamper resistance, and under 24-hour video surveillance. Physical records will also be stored in a secure storage room under 24-hour surveillance. All records will be retained for a minimum of (6) six years.

Cash Handling Requirements

Stem will implement responsible policies and procedures to effectively prevent marijuana sales revenue from supporting any criminal enterprise. President and CEO Caroline Pineau will also serve as CFO, and will be responsible for managing all financial tasks for the business, including financial accounting and reporting, payroll preparation and administration budget preparation, project management accounting and risk management.

The POS system is designed to collect data associated with business management including assets, liabilities, and monetary transactions. An organized and secure retention of all business records will be kept including: assets and liabilities, monetary transactions, written or electronic accounts that include bank statements, journals, ledgers and supporting documents, agreements, checks, invoices and vouchers, and any other financial accounts reasonably related to Stem.

Frequent cash counts throughout the day will let employees know that money is being closely monitored. Management will be responsible for making frequent sweeps of cash drawers and placing cash inside a secure safe, located inside the limited access area. Randomly scheduled cash pickups will be arranged to deliver cash from the store to the bank via an armored car service.

Cannabis Handling Requirements

All marijuana handled or processed in preparation for sale, will be secured in a limited access production area. Marijuana will be prepared in a safe and sanitary manner. Cannabis will be well cured and free of seeds and stems, free of dirt, sand, debris, and other foreign matter; free from contamination by mold, rot, other fungus, and bacterial diseases; prepared and handled on food-grade stainless steel tables; and packaged in a secure area. Marijuana Establishment Agents, whose job includes direct contact with marijuana or non-edible marijuana products, must comply with the requirements for food handlers specified in 105 CMR 300.000. Agents must use sanitary practices that include: adequate personal cleanliness and thorough hand-washing. A handwashing station will be provided inside the secured marijuana repacking room. All contact surfaces, including utensils and equipment will be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.

Storage and transportation of finished marijuana products will be kept under conditions that protect them against physical, chemical, and microbial contamination as well as deterioration of them or their containers.

How Much Cannabis Can We Sell to Customers

In accordance with M.G.L. c.94G, a marijuana retailer may not sell more than (1) one ounce of marijuana or (5) five grams of marijuana concentrate to a consumer per transaction.

Unauthorized Sales & Right to Refuse Sales

Stem will refuse to sell marijuana or marijuana products to any consumer for the following reasons:

- The person is unable to produce a valid proof of identification.
- In the opinion of the marijuana establishment agent at the time, the consumer or the public would be at risk.
- The transaction amount exceeds (1) one ounce of marijuana or (5) grams of marijuana concentrate

Packaging and Labeling

In compliance with 935 CMR 500.105(6), Stem will adhere to all mandated packaging and labeling requirements. The Cannabis Control Commission will approve all packaging and labeling before products can be offered for sale to consumers. All cannabis packaging will be child resistant (certified by a qualified third-party tamper/ child resistant packaging testing firm) and will protect the product from potential

contamination or exposures to harmful/ toxic substances. All marijuana packaging will be plain and opaque.

Child resistant packaging will include re-sealable packaging for any marijuana product intended for more than one use or containing multiple servings. For products that are unreasonably impracticable for standard child resistant packaging, product will be in appropriate exit packaging. This type of packaging is capable of being resealed and made child resistant again after it has been opened and includes the required statement "KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN."

Legible labels will be firmly affixed to all containers of marijuana products sold by Stem, prior to any products retail sale on Stem's premises. The labels will include the following state mandated information:

- The name and registration number of the product manufacturer that produced the marijuana product, together with the product manufacturer's business telephone number, email address, and website information, if any;
- The marijuana product's identity & strain name
- The type of marijuana used to produce the product, including what, if any, processing technique or solvents were used;
- A list of ingredients, including the full Cannabinoid profile or the marijuana contained within the Marijuana Product, including the amount of delta-nine-tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) and other cannabinoids in the package and in each serving of a Marijuana Product
- Net Weight (ounces, grams or volume as appropriate) of usable marijuana in package
- The date each marijuana product was packaged and notation of the batch number, sequential serial number, and bar code when used, to identify the batch associated with manufacturing and processing
- Directions for use of the marijuana product if relevant
- A statement and seal that the product has been tested for contaminants, and that there were no adverse findings, and the date of testing in accordance with M.G.L. c. 94G, 15
- A warning if nuts or other known allergens are contained in the product.
- Required Statement, including capitalization: "This product has not been analyzed or approved by the FDA. There is limited information on the side effects of using this product, and there may be associated health risks. Marijuana use during pregnancy and breast-feeding may pose potential harms. It is against the law to drive or operate machinery when under the influence of this product. KEEP THIS PRODUCT AWAY FROM CHILDREN."
- An easily recognizable symbol issued by the Commission that indicates the product is harmful to children.
- An easily recognizable symbol issued by the Commission that indicates the package contains marijuana product.

Edible MIP Limitations & Labeling Requirements

Stem will not sell or otherwise transfer an Edible MIP with potency levels exceeding the following (as tested) in accordance with 935 CMR 500.150:

- Each single serving- (5) milligrams of active THC

- In a single package of multiple Edible MIPs-not more than (20) servings or (100) milligrams of active THC
- Each serving of an Edible MIP within a multi-serving package must be easily separable in order to allow an average-person, 21 years of age and over, to physically separate individual servings of the product
- Packaging will identify “SINGLE SERVING” or “INCLUDES MULTIPLE SERVINGS”

Stem will ensure that the following information and statement is firmly affixed to every container holding an Edible MIP:

- Product Manufacturers name, registration number, telephone number, electronic mail address, and website information
- Name of marijuana product
- If the retail Edible MIP is perishable, a statement that the Edible MIP must be refrigerated
- Net weight in US customary and metric units
- Quantity of usable marijuana contained within the product, as measured in ounces
- Type of marijuana used to produce the product, including what, if any, processing technique or solvents were used
- Batch number, sequential serial number, and bar code when used, to identify the batch associated with manufacturing and processing
- List of ingredients, including Cannabinoid profile of the marijuana contained within the Marijuana Product, including the amount of THC and other cannabinoids in the package and in each serving of marijuana product as expressed in absolute terms and as a percentage of volume
- Serving size of marijuana product in milligrams if the package is a multiple-serving package
- Number of serving sizes within the marijuana product based on the limits provided in 935 CMR 500.150
- The amount in grams: sodium, sugar, carbohydrates, and total fat per serving
- Date of creation and expiration date
- Directions for use of the marijuana product if relevant
- A warning if nuts or other known allergens are contained in the product
- Test analysis date, statement and a seal certifying that the product has been tested for contaminants, and that there were no adverse findings
- Required Statement: “The impairment effects of edible products may be delayed by two hours or more. This product has not been analyzed or approved by the FDA. There is limited information on the side effects of using this product, and there may be associated health risks. Marijuana use during pregnancy and breast-feeding may pose potential harms. It is against the law to drive or operate machinery when under the influence of this product. KEEP THIS PRODUCT AWAY FROM CHILDREN.”
- Symbol or recognizable mark issued by the Commission that indicates product is harmful to children
- Symbol or recognizable mark issued by the commission indicating the package contains marijuana or marijuana product
- Information regarding the size of each serving for the product by milligrams, the total number of servings of marijuana in the product, and the total amount of active THC in the product in milligrams

Concentrate and Extract Limitations & Labeling Requirement

Stem will ensure that the following information and statement is affixed to every container holding a Concentrate or Extract:

- Product Manufacturers name, registration number, telephone number, electronic mail address, and website information
- Name of marijuana product
- Product identity including the word “concentrate” or “extract” as applicable
- Net weight of volume expressed in US customary units and metric units
- Type of marijuana used to produce the product, including what, if any, processing technique or solvents were used
- Batch number, sequential serial number, and bar code when used, to identify the batch associated with manufacturing and processing
- List of ingredients, including Cannabinoid profile of the marijuana contained within the Marijuana Product, including the amount of THC and other cannabinoids in the package and in each serving of a marijuana product as expressed in absolute terms and as a percentage of volume
- Serving size and number of servings per container or amount suggested for use based on the limits provided in 935 CMR 500.150
- Date of creation and expiration date
- Directions for use of the marijuana product if relevant
- A warning if nuts or other known allergens are contained in the product
- Test analysis date, statement and a seal certifying that the product has been tested for contaminants, and that there were no adverse findings
- Required Statement: “This product has not been analyzed or approve by the FDA. There is limited information on the side effects of using this product, and there may be associated health risks. Marijuana use during pregnancy and breast-feeding may pose potential harms. It is against the law to drive or operate machinery when under the influence of this product. - Name of marijuana product
- Net weight of volume as expressed in US customary units and metric units

- Type of marijuana used to produce the product, including what, if any, processing technique or solvents were used Batch number, sequential serial number, and bar code when used, to identify the batch associated with manufacturing and processing
- List of ingredients, including the full Cannabinoid profile of the marijuana contained within the Marijuana Product, including the amount of THC and other cannabinoids in the package and in each serving of a Marijuana Product as expressed in absolute terms and as a percentage of volume
- Date of product creation
- Directions for use of the marijuana product if relevant
- A warning if nuts or other known allergens are contained in the product
- Test analysis date, statement and a seal certifying that the product has been tested for contaminants, and that there were no adverse findings
- Required Statement: “This product has not been analyzed or approve by the FDA. There is limited information on the side effects of using this product, and there may be associated health risks. Marijuana use during pregnancy and breast-feeding may pose potential harms. It is against the law to drive or operate machinery when under the influence of this product. KEEP THIS PRODUCT AWAY FROM CHILDREN.”
- Symbol or recognizable mark issued by the Commission that indicates product is harmful to children
- Symbol or recognizable mark issued by the Commission indicating the package contains marijuana or marijuana product

Consumer Education

Stem’s state-of the art Marijuana Establishment will have an educational area with a number of consumer educational materials, many of which will be specific to particular conditions and the uses for cannabis products. Materials will be available in commonly spoken languages, and available to the hearing and visually impaired. Educational materials will be available in brochures, as well as on PC’s/tablets for consumer reference including the following information:

- Dosing information- Recommendations for starting with low dosing, how to read the labels of all products, and dosing chart explaining grams and ounces.
- A warning that marijuana has not been analyzed or approved by the FDA, that there is limited information on side effects, that there may be health risks associated with using marijuana, and that it should be kept away from children;
- A warning that when under the influence of marijuana, driving is prohibited by M.G.L., c.90 s.24, and machinery should not be operated;
- Information to assist in the selection of marijuana, describing the potentially different effects of various marijuana strains, Difference between THC (psychoactive element and CBD products, lesser psychoactive elements, as well as different routes of administration.
- Types of products sold within Marijuana Establishment: flower, extracts, edibles, tinctures, capsules, vape products, spa products, topicals
- Difference between different strains of marijuana- Indica, Sativa, Hybrid

- A discussion of tolerance, dependence and withdrawal. With information for assistance with drug addiction.
- A statement that consumers may not sell marijuana to another individual;
- Information regarding the penalties for possession or distribution of marijuana in violation of Massachusetts law; and
- Any other information required by the Cannabis Control Commission.

Complaints Process

In a time and manner determined by the Commission, a dedicated telephone number, email address or other means shall be provided for members of the public or consumers to notify the Commission of complaints regarding Stem or Stem Marijuana Establishment Agents. The Commission may, at its discretion, investigate or decline to investigate any complaint or refer a complaint to another law enforcement or regulatory authority.

Inspections, Compliance & Plans of Correction

Onsite inspections and compliance checks are considered a critical part of Stem's success. Marijuana on the federal level is a Schedule One Controlled Substance, so Massachusetts takes the growing, selling, taxation, and marketing very seriously. In order to stay compliant, it is critical to constantly check the readiness of the facility for a surprise visit from the Cannabis Control Commission. Certain checklists can help Stem do this on a daily basis, which will help avoid playing catch up when an inspection is scheduled or done randomly.

In order to maintain order and compliance, the workflow will be documented and compared to Massachusetts regulatory scheme. Stem has crafted a checklist used in maintaining safe and lawful practices, but Stem will also constantly monitor local and state guidelines as each city/town as well as the state maintains its own regulatory scheme for dispensing adult use marijuana. Regulation is a dynamic and every changing set of rules, as such Stem's checklist must be updated regularly.

The Commission or its agents may inspect Stem and Stem's vehicles at any time without prior notice in order to determine compliance with the Act and 935 CMR 500.000. All areas of the Marijuana Establishment, all Marijuana Establishment Agents and activities, and all records are subject to inspection. Any information the Commission request will be promptly provided.

After an inspection in which a violation of 935 CMR 500.000 or the Act, is observed or a violation is otherwise determined to have occurred, the Commission shall issue a Deficiency Statement citing every violation identified. A Marijuana Establishment will submit to the Commission a Plan of Correction for any violations cited pursuant to 935 CMR 500.310 within (10) ten business days after receipt of the Deficiency Statement. The Plan of Correction will state, with respect to each deficiency, the specific corrective steps to be taken, a timetable for such steps, and the date by which compliance will be achieved. The Commission will review the Plan of Correction for compliance with requirements of 935 CMR 500.000 and the Act and will notify the Marijuana Establishment of either acceptance or rejection of the plan. An unacceptable plan must be amended and resubmitted within (5) five business days after receipt of such

notice.

If the Commission determines that the Marijuana Establishment does not substantially comply with applicable provisions of 935 CMR 500.000 or the Act, the Commission may order that store not sell marijuana, after a date specified. The Commission will not make such a determination until the Marijuana Establishment has been notified that store does not comply with applicable provisions, that an order to limit sales is being contemplated, and reasonable opportunity is being provided to correct the deficiencies. An order to not sell marijuana may be rescinded when the Commission finds that the Marijuana Establishment is again within substantial compliance with applicable provisions of 935. CMR 500.000. A hearing will be scheduled.

Energy Efficiency & Conservation

In December 2018, Haverhill was awarded the “Green City” designation by the state of Massachusetts Green Communities Program. At the core of Stem’s vision is maintaining a low carbon footprint and implementing energy efficiency wherever possible in its operation and site build-out. In Stem’s dedication to being a good corporate citizen, Stem will work closely with the City of Haverhill on its mission toward becoming a more energy efficient and energy conscious community.

Stem will work closely with its general contractor, Flock Construction, so that all new lighting is energy efficient and will qualify for Mass Saves Rebate Program. We will use occupancy sensors when applicable to help with energy saving measures. Stem plans to utilize as much natural lighting as possible in the space. Considerations for HVAC will also rely on energy saving best practices.

Stem will work closely with its staff to identify any potential energy use reduction opportunities on Stem’s premises and to implement sustainable business practices. Stem will aim to partner with cultivators who are also interested in sustainability that use renewable energy and high-efficiency lighting. Stem’s green initiative will be known to customers, staff and even vendors. Stem is committed to saving the environment making responsible choices.

Stem’s green initiative is simple. As a retailer, we will “Reduce, Reuse, Recycle” for improved social-responsibility. Some simple ways Stem can curb its carbon footprint is to:

- Recycle paper, plastic, aluminum, ink cartridges.
- Reuse office packing materials and cardboard boxes.
- Use double-sided printing when possible.
- Reduce paper transactions by going digital for bill payment, vendor orders, invoices, online banking, e-mail and faxing directly from Stem’s computers.
- Eliminate disposable cups, plates, and utensils in the break room. Replace with permanent dishware.
- Switch to rechargeable batteries. Large office supply stores even have collection centers for recycling dead rechargeable batteries.
- Use eco-friendly cleaning products that are biodegradable and non-toxic.
- Purchase energy-efficient PCs, printers, and other equipment with the EnergyStar label.
- Donate or recycle old computers and equipment.

- Keep up with regular maintenance of all mechanical equipment.
- Employee reward programs for energy saving measures including employees that use alternate modes of transportation to get to work such as biking, walking, public transit.
- Enlist help of Stem employees with conservation to institute policy to turn off equipment/ unnecessary lighting when not in use.

Employee Handbook

Stem has an Employee Handbook (“Handbook”) that is designed to summarize certain personnel policies and benefits of Haverhill Stem LLC and to acquaint employees with many of the rules concerning employment with Stem. This Handbook applies to all employees, and compliance with Stem’s policies are a condition of employment. This handbook supersedes any previous employment policies, written and oral, express and implied. Stem reserves the right to modify, rescind, delete, or add to the provisions of this Handbook from time to time in its sole and absolute discretion. The Employee Handbook is not a binding contract between Stem and its employees, nor is it intended to alter the at-will employment relationship between Stem and its employees. Stem reserves the right to interpret the policies in this Handbook and to deviate from them when, in its discretion, it determines it is appropriate.

Personnel Policies

Equal Employment Opportunity Policy

It is the policy of Stem to provide equal employment opportunities to all employees and employment applicants without regard to unlawful consideration of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition including medical characteristics, marital status or any other classification protected by local, state, or federal laws. This policy prohibits unlawful discrimination based on the perception that anyone has any of those characteristics, or is associated with a person who has or is perceived as having any of those characteristics. This policy applies to all aspects of employment, including, but not limited to hiring, job assignment, working conditions, compensation, promotion, benefits, scheduling, training, discipline, and termination. Reasonable accommodation is available for qualified individuals with disabilities, upon request.

Stem expects all employees to support our equal opportunity policy, and to take all steps necessary to maintain a workplace free from unlawful discrimination and harassment.

In compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Stem provides accommodation to the disabled to the full extent required by law. Stem may require medical certification of both the disability and the need for accommodation. Keep in mind that Stem can only seek to accommodate the known physical or mental limitations of an otherwise qualified disabled individual. Therefore, it is the employee’s responsibility to come forward if they are in need of accommodation. Stem will engage in an interactive process with the employee to identify possible accommodations, if any will help the applicant or employee perform the job. Stem further recognizes that employees with life threatening illnesses, including but not limited to cancer, heart disease, and AIDS, may wish to continue engaging in as many of their normal pursuits as their condition allows, including work. As long as the employees are able to meet

acceptable performance standards with or without reasonable accommodation, and medical evidence indicates that their working does not present a substantial threat to themselves or others, they will be permitted to do so.

Harassment/Sexual Harassment Policy

Stem is committed to providing a work environment free of sexual or any form of unlawful harassment or discrimination. Harassment or unlawful discrimination against individuals on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition including medical characteristics, marital status or any other classification protected by local, state or federal laws is illegal and prohibited Stem policy. Such conduct by or towards an employee, contract worker, customer, vendor, or anyone else who does business with Stem will not be tolerated. Any employee or contract worker who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination of his or her employment or engagement. To the extent of a customer, vendor or other person with whom Stem does business engages in unlawful harassment or discrimination, Stem will take appropriate corrective action.

Prohibited Conduct:

- A. Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment or engagement;
- B. Submission or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as a basis for decisions concerning that individual's employment or engagement.
- C. It creates a hostile or offensive work environment,

Prohibited harassment includes unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and lewd, vulgar or obscene remarks, jokes, posters or cartoons, and any unwelcome touching, pinching, or other physical contact. Other forms of unlawful harassment or discrimination may include racial epithets, slurs and derogatory remarks, stereotypes, jokes, posters or cartoons based on race, national origin, disability, marital status or other legally protected categories. Prohibited harassment might also be transmitted using Stem's electronic communication system, or through other online content.

Complaint Procedure:

Employees of contract workers who feel that they have been harassed or discriminated against or who witness any harassment or discrimination by an employee, contract worker, customer, vendor, or anyone else who does business with Stem should immediately report such conduct to their supervisor or any other member of management.

Employees should not allow an inappropriate situation to continue by not reporting it, regardless of who is creating the situation. No employee, contract worker, customer, vendor, or other person who does business with this organization is exempt from the prohibitions in this policy. In response to every complaint, Stem will conduct an investigation and, if improper conduct is found, take appropriate corrective action.

To the extent that an employee or contract worker is not satisfied with Stem's handling of a harassment or discrimination complaint, he or she may also contact the appropriate state or federal enforcement agency for relief.

Alcohol, Smoke and Drug-Free Workplace Policy

Stem is committed to providing its employees with a safe and productive work environment. In keeping with this commitment, it maintains a strict policy against the use of alcohol and the unlawful use of drugs in the workplace. Consequently, no employee may consume or possess alcohol, or use, possess, sell, purchase, or transfer illegal drugs at anytime while on Stem's premises.

No employee may report to work with illegal drugs (or their metabolites) or alcohol in his or her bodily system. The only exception to this rule is that employees may engage in moderate consumption of alcohol that may be served and/or consumed as part of an authorized Stem social or business event. "Illegal drug" means any drug that is not legally obtainable or that is legally obtainable but has not been legally obtained. It includes prescription drugs not being used for prescribed purposes or by the person to whom it is prescribed or in prescribed amounts. It also includes any substance a person holds out to another as an illegal drug.

Any violation of this policy will result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.

Any employee who feels he or she has developed an addiction to, dependence upon, or problem with alcohol or drugs, legal or illegal, is strongly encouraged to seek assistance before a violation of this policy occurs. Any employee who requests time off to participate in a rehabilitation program will be reasonably accommodated. However, employees may not avoid disciplinary action, up to and including termination, by entering a rehabilitation center after a violation of this policy is suspected or discovered. When, in Stem's sole and absolute discretion, Stem determines it is appropriate, an employee may be offered the option of participating in and satisfactorily completing a Stem-approved drug and/or alcohol rehabilitation in lieu of termination.

No Weapons Policy

Stem employees are prohibited from carrying or bringing any weapon, as defined herein, to the workplace. This provision applies to all employees, including any employee who is licensed to carry a firearm or weapon, with the sole purpose to help ensure a safe workplace for employees. Weapon means any firearm, whether loaded or unloaded, from which a shot may be discharged including but not limited to pistol, revolver, shotgun, rifle, bb gun or any knife including a switchblade knife, gravity knife, or any knife with a blade longer than 3 inches, or billy, blackjack, bludgeon, metal knuckles, bow and arrow, electronic stunning device, etc. An employee who is uncertain whether an instrument or device is prohibited under this policy is obligated to request clarification to insure he or she is not in violation of this policy. A violation of this policy will be subject to immediate termination, possible criminal prosecution, and/or civil injunctive orders.

Confidentiality Policy

In the course of employment with Stem, employees may have access to "Confidential Information" regarding Stem, which may include its business strategy, future plans, financial information, contracts, suppliers, customers, personnel information or other information that Stem considers proprietary and confidential. Maintaining the confidentiality of this information is vital to Stem's competitive position in the industry and, ultimately, to its ability to achieve financial success and stability. Employees must protect this information by safeguarding it when in use, using it only for the business of Stem and

disclosing it only when authorized to do so and to those who have legitimate business need to know about it. This duty of confidentiality applies whether the employee is on or off Stem's premises, and during and even after the end of the employee's employment with Stem. This duty of confidentiality also applies to communications transmitted by Stem's electronic communications. A violation of this policy will lead to immediate termination and possible civil suit.

As a condition of employment with Stem, all employees must sign a Non-Disclosure Agreement.

Final Summary

It's rare, if ever, entrepreneurs get the opportunity to be the first movers in a brand new industry, helping to shape it from its infancy. With just a handful of adult-use cannabis dispensaries open in the state, Haverhill Stem LLC looks forward to being amongst the first economic empowerment and women-owned business applicants in Massachusetts to open its doors. With this comes great responsibility and Stem will set an exemplary standard for what it means to operate a state-of-the art adult use Marijuana Establishment in Massachusetts. Stem's CEO and Executive Director Caroline Pineau's vision is for Stem to be welcoming, community focused and use education to further diffuse the stigma of cannabis, offering consumers a safe, secure and welcoming atmosphere to purchase a cannabis products.

In conclusion, Stem will implement responsible business practices in full compliance with 935 CMR 500.000 and with its proposed location in one of the state's designated areas of disproportionate impact, positively contribute to the city of Haverhill's economic resurgence and core revitalization.

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Plan to Remain Complaint with Local Zoning

Stem, as a proposed Marijuana Establishment at 124 Washington Street in Haverhill, is currently compliant with zoning requirements and will have been granted a special permit by the Haverhill City Council prior to opening.

Stem will pay a \$250 fee to the City of Haverhill for a special permit, and adhere to all of the following special permitting requirements:

Haverhill Marijuana Special Permit Requirements:

a. MA Cannabis Control Commission License

This should be a copy of the license or registration of the applicant as an LME from the MA Cannabis Control Commission or documentation that demonstrates that the proposed facility and its owner/operators qualify and are eligible to receive a Certificate of Registration and meet all of the requirements of an LME in accordance with the Commission's regulations.

b. Site Plan

c. Safety Plan

The plan should detail how you will ensure the safety of employees, patrons and the public to protect the premises from theft or other criminal activity. It will be reviewed for approval by the Chief of Police or his designee and must include the following: [1] and interior floor plan including secured areas, windows, doors, etc.; exterior lighting, fencing and gates (if any), alarms and any additional security measures required by the Police Chief.

d. Traffic Study

This should include any plans pertaining to the management of traffic and efforts to reduce congestion and a negative impact on normal travel in the area. The City Council may also require a traffic study that includes an analysis of traffic generation, circulation, and off-street parking demand to determine sufficient parking and optimum configuration for site egress and ingress.

e. Proof of Site Control

Evidence that the applicant has site control and the right to use the site for an LME i.e. a signed deed, valid lease, purchase & sale (P&S) agreement or a notarized statement from the property owner certifying that the applicant has firm site control.

f. Odor Control Plan

This plan should show that the applicant has adequately provided for the ongoing safe operation of the establishment and minimizes any adverse impacts to abutting properties from odor-emitting activities to be conducted onsite.

g. 10% Contributors

(This should be a list of all persons or entities contributing 10% or more to the initial capital to operate the LME, including capital in the form of land or buildings.)

h. Proof of Notification

Applicants seeking to locate in the WDA must notify adjacent property owners as well as any existing child care facility for children under 18, church or other place of worship, or youth center - any within 300 feet of the proposed site. An abutters' list can be acquired from the City Assessor in Room 115 of Haverhill City Hall. Proof would include a copy of that list along with a copy of the notification used and proof of distribution.

OPERATING AGREEMENT OF HAVERHILL STEM, LLC

This Operating Agreement of **HAVERHILL STEM, LLC**, a Massachusetts limited liability company organized pursuant to G.L.c. 156C, is entered into as of this **13th** day of **April, 2018** by and between **Caroline Pineau**, an individual residing at **25 Bradfields Drive, Haverhill, Massachusetts 01830** and those persons who shall hereafter be admitted as members of the Company in accordance with this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement wish to form and constitute a limited liability company on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual representations, covenants and agreements made herein, and intending to be legally bound, the parties hereby agree to constitute a limited liability company as follows:

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

The following terms in this Agreement shall have the following meanings (unless otherwise expressly provided herein):

“Act” shall mean the Limited Liability Company Act, as set forth in Massachusetts G.L.c. 156C, as amended.

“Agreement” means this written Operating Agreement, which is binding on all Members, as such Agreement may be amended in writing from time to time by the Members. No oral agreements or any documents or writings shall be part of the agreement, unless such document or writing constitutes a properly approved amendment or restatement of this Agreement pursuant to Section 12.2 hereof and is properly attached hereto and kept as part of the records of the Company.

“Capital Account” shall mean, with respect to any Member, an account maintained in accordance with Section 6.3.

“Capital Interest” shall mean each Member’s capital interest in the Company set forth in Exhibit C.

“Certificate” shall mean the Certificate of Organization of the Company, as filed with the Massachusetts Secretary of State, and as the same may be amended from time to time by a Majority of the Members.

“Company” shall refer to **HAVERHILL STEM, LLC**.

“Majority of the Members” shall mean the Members whose Capital Interests in the Company represent more than one-half (½) of all of the Capital Interests in the Company

“Manager” shall mean any individual selected to manage the affairs of the Company pursuant to Article V hereof and in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. In the aggregate, the Managers must own at least twenty percent (20%) of the Capital Interests.

“Member” shall mean each of the parties who execute this Agreement, or a counterpart to the same, as a Member, and each of the parties who may thereafter become Members. A Member need not be a Massachusetts resident.

“Member-Manager” shall mean a Member selected to manage the affairs of the Company pursuant to Article V hereof and in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. A Member-Manager need not be a Massachusetts resident. All Member-Managers shall also be considered Managers herein.

“Membership Interest” shall mean a Member’s entire interest in the Company at any particular time, including such member’s right to participate in the management and affairs of the Company, the right to vote on, and consent to, or otherwise participate in any decision or action of or by the Members granted pursuant to this Agreement and the Act.

“Secretary of State” shall mean the Massachusetts Secretary of State.

ARTICLE II FORMATION OF COMPANY

Section 2.1 Formation. The Members hereby agree to organize the Company as a Massachusetts limited liability company by executing and filing a Certificate of Organization with the Massachusetts Secretary of State in accordance with and pursuant to the Act. A copy of such Certificate of Organization is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 2.2 Name. The name of the Company is **HAVERHILL STEM, LLC**, and all business of the Company shall be conducted under that name or under any other name selected by the Member-Managers, only to the extent provided by the Act.

Section 2.3 Principal Place of Business. The principal place of business of the Company shall be **124 Washington Street, Haverhill, Massachusetts 01830**.

Section 2.4 Registered Office and Registered Agent. The Company’s registered office shall be at **124 Washington Street, Haverhill, Massachusetts 01830**, and the name of the registered agent at such address shall be **Caroline Pineau**. The Member-Managers may, from time to time, change the registered agent or office through appropriate filings with the Secretary of State. In the event the registered agent ceases to act as such for any reason or the registered office shall change, the Member-Managers shall promptly designate a replacement registered agent or file a notice of change of address as the case may be.

Section 2.5 Term. The term of the Company shall commence on the date of the filing of the Certificate of Organization with the Secretary of State and shall continue until dissolved in

accordance with Article IX hereof.

ARTICLE III BUSINESS OF COMPANY

The business of the Company shall be:

- (a) To **own and operate recreational marijuana dispensaries,**
- (b) To exercise all other powers necessary to or reasonably connected with the Company's business that may be legally exercised by limited liability companies under the Act; and
- (c) To engage in all activities necessary, customary, convenient, or incident to any of the foregoing.
- (d) To transact any, lawful business for which a limited liability company may be organized.

ARTICLE IV RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERS

Section 4.1 Member Vote. All Members shall be entitled to vote on any matter submitted to a vote of the Members. Except as provided hereunder, on any such matter, an affirmative vote of a Majority of the Members shall be determinative.

Section 4.2 Meetings of Members: Place of Meetings. Meetings of the members may be held for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prohibited by statute, the Articles or this Agreement and may be called by any Member(s) holding twenty percent (20%) of the membership Interest or by any Member if there has been no meeting of the members for more than twelve (12) months.

Section 4.3 Proxies. At any meeting of the members, every member having the right to vote thereat shall be entitled to vote in person or by proxy appointed by instrument in writing signed by such Member and bearing a date not more than two (2) months prior to such meeting.

Section 4.4 Action without Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of members may be taken without a meeting, if the action is evidenced by one (1) or more written consents describing the action to be taken which are tendered to all Members and are approved and executed by such Members as hold the requisite Capital Interest in the Company necessary to approve the described action.

Section 4.5 Meetings by Conference Telephone or Similar Communications Equipment. Any or all Members may participate in a meeting by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in a meeting pursuant hereto shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.

Section 4.6 Liability of Members. No Member shall be liable as either a Member or a Manager for the liabilities of the Company. The Failure of the Company to observe any formalities or requirements relating to the exercise of its powers or management of its business or affairs under this Agreement or the Act shall not be grounds for imposing personal liability on the Members for the liabilities of the Company.

Section 4.7 Indemnification. The Company shall indemnify the Members, Managers and their agents of all costs, losses, liabilities and damages paid or accrued by such Member, Manager or agent in connection with the business of the Company, to the fullest extent provided or allowed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Section 4.8 Representations and Warranties. Each Member, and in the case of an organization, the person(s) executing this Agreement on behalf of such organization, hereby represents and warrants to the Company and each member that: (i) if that Member is an organization, that is duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the law of its state of organization and that it has full organizational power to execute and agree to this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder; (ii) the member is acquiring his interest in the Company for the Member's own account and investment and without the intent to distribute the interest; (iii) the Member acknowledges that the interests have not been registered under the Securities Act of 1933 or any state securities laws, and may not be resold or transferred by the Member without appropriate registration or the availability of any exemption from such requirements.

ARTICLE V RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF MANAGERS

Section 5.1 Management. The business and affairs of the Company shall be managed by the Managers. The Managers shall direct, manage, and control the business of the Company to the best of their ability. Except for situations in which the approval of the members is expressly required by this Agreement or by nonwaivable provisions of applicable law, the Managers shall have full and complete authority, power, and discretion to manage and control the business, affairs, and properties of the Company, to make all decisions regarding those matters, and to perform any and all other acts or activities customary or incident to the management of the Company's business and objectives. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement to the contrary, the Managers shall not have the authority to enter into any employment agreement, including the setting of compensation, for any manager or managers of any business operation owned by the Company, unless such agreement is duly approved by a unanimous vote of the Members.

Section 5.2 Number, Tenure and Qualifications. The Company shall initially have **one (1)** Manager. The initial Manager is identified in Exhibit B. The number of managers of the Company shall be thereafter fixed from time to time by the affirmative vote of a Majority of the Members, but in no instance shall there be less than one Manager. Managers shall be appointed by the unanimous vote of Members. Managers need not be residents of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or Members of the Company. The Managers shall own an aggregate of at least 20% of the Company's profits, losses and capital.

Section 5.3 Certain Powers of Managers. Only the Managers and agents of the Company authorized by the Managers shall have the authority to bind the Company. No Member who is not either a Manager or otherwise authorized as an agent shall take any action to bind the Company, and each Member shall indemnify the Company for any costs or damages incurred by the Company as a result of the unauthorized action of such Member. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, each Manager shall have the power, on behalf of the Company, to do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the business and affairs of the Company, including, without limitation:

- (a) The institution, prosecution and defense of any proceeding, legal or otherwise, in the Company's name;
- (b) The purchase, receipt, lease or other acquisition, holding, improvement, use and other dealing with property, real or personal, wherever located;
- (c) The sale, conveyance, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange and other disposition of property, real or personal, wherever located, in the ordinary course of the Company's business;
- (d) The entering into contracts and guaranties; incurring of liabilities; borrowing money, issuance of notes, bonds and other obligations; and the securing of any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of any of its property or income, in the ordinary course of the Company's business;
- (e) The lending of money, investment and reinvestment of the Company's funds, and receipt and holding of property as security for repayment, including, without limitation, the loaning money to, and otherwise helping members, officers, employees and agents, in the ordinary course of the Company's business;
- (f) The conduct of the Company's business, the establishment of Company offices, and the exercise of the powers of the Company's business;
- (g) The appointment of employees and agents of the Company, the defining of their duties and the establishment of their compensation;
- (h) The payment or donation, or any other act that furthers the business and affairs of the Company;
- (i) The payment of compensation to any or all Members, and employees on account of services previously rendered to the Company, whether or not an agreement to pay such compensation was made before such services were rendered;
- (j) The purchase of insurance on the life or disability of any Member, Manager or employee for the benefit of the Company;
- (k) The participation in partnership agreements, joint ventures, or other associations of

any kind with any person or persons; and

- (l) The indemnification of members or any other persons.

Notwithstanding anything in this Section 5.3 to the contrary, no Manager shall have the authority, without the unanimous consent of the Members, to: (i) acquire or lease any assets other than in the ordinary course of the Company's business; (ii) borrow or lend money from or to the Company; (iii) sell or reorganize the business or significant assets of the business of the Company; (iv) hire or fix compensation for key employees or create pension, profit sharing or other employee benefit plans; or (v) gift or donate money.

Section 5.4 Managers Standard of Care. A Manager's duty of care in the discharge of the Manager's duties to the Company and the Members is limited to refraining from engaging in grossly negligent or reckless conduct, intentional misconduct, or knowing violation of law or of any contract to which the Company is a party. In discharging his duties, a Manager shall be fully protected in relying in good faith upon the records required to be maintained under the Certificate of Organization and upon such information, opinions, reports or statements by any of its Members as to matters the Manager reasonably believes are within such other person's professional or expert competence and who has been selected with reasonable care by or on behalf of the Company, or any other facts pertinent to the existence and amount of assets from which distributions to Members might properly be paid. Each Member shall review all contracts to which the Company is a party and for purposes of this Agreement shall be deemed to have knowledge of all requirements thereunder.

Section 5.5 Compensation for Managers. Each manager shall be reimbursed all reasonable expenses incurred in managing the Company only and no Member-Manager shall be entitled to any other compensation for serving as Member-Manager, unless by unanimous vote the Members elect to pay such compensation, in which event, the Members shall determine the nature and amount thereof.

Section 5.6 Resignation of Manager. Any Manager of the Company may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Members of the Company. The resignation of any Manager shall take effect upon receipt of that notice or at such later time as shall be specified in the notice; and unless otherwise specified in the notice, the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make the same effective. The resignation of a Manager who is also a Member shall not affect the Manager's rights as a Member and shall not constitute a withdrawal of a Member.

Section 5.7 Managers and Members Have No Exclusive Duty to Company. The Manager shall not be required to manage the Company as such Manager's sole and exclusive function and such Manager (and any Manager and/or Member) may have other business interests and may engage in other activities in addition to those relating to the Company. Neither the Company nor any Member shall have any right, by virtue of this Operating Agreement, to share or participate in such other investments or activities of the Manager and/or Member or to the income or proceeds derived therefrom. Neither the Manager nor any Member shall incur any liability to the Company or to any of the Members as a result of engaging in any other business or venture.

ARTICLE VI

CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE COMPANY AND CAPITAL ACCOUNTS

Section 6.1 Capital Contributions by the Members. Each Member has made a capital contribution equal to the amount of money and value of any property listed next to his or her name in Exhibit C attached hereto. Except as expressly provided elsewhere herein, the interests of the Members are not assessable by the Company.

Section 6.2 Other Matters Relating to Capital Contributions. Except as provided in this Agreement, no Member shall be entitled to withdraw, or to a return of, any part of his capital contributed pursuant to this Article VI or to receive property or assets other than cash in return thereof. No Member shall be entitled to interest on his capital so contributed.

Section 6.3 Capital Accounts. A Capital Account shall be maintained for each Member. Such Capital Account shall be increased by (1) the amount of money contributed by the Member to the Company, (2) the fair market value of the property contributed by the Member to the Company (net of liabilities secured by such contributed property that the Company is considered to assume or take subject to under section 752 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code")), and (3) allocations to the Member of Company income and gain (or items thereof), including income and gain exempt from tax and income and gain described in Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1(b)(2)(iv)(g), but excluding income gain described in Treasury Regulation 1.704-1(b)(4)(i); and is decreased by (4) the amount of money distributed to the member by the Company, (5) the fair market value of property distributed to the Member by the Company (net of liabilities secured by such distributed property that such Member is considered to assume or take subject to under section 752 of the Code), (6) allocations to such Member of expenditures of the Company described in section 705 (a)(2)(B) or Treasury Regulation 1.704-1 (b)(iii); and is otherwise adjusted in accordance with the additional rules set forth in Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1(b)(2)(iv). Whenever the Company would be permitted to adjust the Capital Accounts of the members pursuant to Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1 (b)(2)(iv)(f) to reflect revaluations of Company property, (i) the Capital Accounts of the Members shall be adjusted in accordance with Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1 (b)(2)(iv)(g) for allocations of depreciation, depletion, amortization and gain or loss, as computed for book purposes, with respect to such property; and (ii) the Members' distributive shares of depreciation, depletion, amortization and gain or loss, as computed for tax purposes, with respect to such property shall be determined so as to take account of the variation between the adjusted tax basis and book value of such property in the same manner as under section 704© of the Code. If section 704© of the Code applies to Company property, the Capital Accounts of the Members shall be adjusted in accordance with Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1 (b)(2)(iv)(g) for allocations of depreciation, depletion, amortization and gain and loss, as computed for book purposes, with respect to such property. To the extent the Company is eligible to use more than one method of making adjustments required to be made in accordance with section 704© of the Code and the Treasury Regulations thereunder with respect to any Company item, the Managers shall determine the appropriate method.

Section 6.4 Loans. Subject to the limitations of Article V, the Members hereby authorize the Company to borrow such amounts from time to time as are approved pursuant to Section 4.1. If any borrowing of the Company is secured by any mortgage, pledge or other lien, such borrowing and the document securing the same shall provide in substance and legal effect that neither the Company nor any Member shall have any personal liability for the payment of such indebtedness, but the sole recourse of any secured party shall be to the Company property securing the borrowing, unless one or more Members specifically agrees in writing to be subject to liability for such indebtedness.

ARTICLE VII ALLOCATIONS AND DISTRIBUTIONS

Section 7.1 Allocations. All items of Company income gain, loss and deduction as determined for Federal income tax purposes shall be allocated among the Members, and shall be credited or debited to their respective Capital Accounts in accordance with Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1(b)(2)(iv), so as to ensure to the maximum extent possible (i) that such allocations satisfy the economic effect equivalence test of Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1(b)(2)(ii)(i) (by allocating items that can have economic effect in such a manner that the balance of each Member's Capital Account at the end of any taxable year (increased by sum of (a) such Member's "share of partnership minimum gain" as defined in Treasury Regulation Section 1.704-2(g)(1) and (b) such Member's "share of partner nonrecourse debt minimum gain" as defined in Treasury Regulation section 1.704-2 (i)(5)) would be positive in the amount of cash, if any, that such Member would receive (or would be negative in the amount of cash, if any, that such Member would be required to contribute to the Company) if the Company sold all of its property for an amount of cash equal to the book value (as determined pursuant to Treasury Regulation section 1.704-1 (b)(2)(iv)) of such property (reduced, but not below zero, by the amount of nonrecourse debt to which such property is subject) and all of the cash of the Company remaining after payment of all liabilities (other than nonrecourse liabilities) of the Company were distributed in liquidation immediately following the end of such taxable year pursuant to Article IX hereof) and (ii) that all allocations of items that cannot have economic effect (including nonrecourse deductions) are allocated to the Members in accordance with the Members' interests in the Company, which, unless otherwise required by section 704(b) of the Code and the Treasury Regulations thereunder, shall be in proportion to their respective percentages of Company interest, which shall be set forth in Exhibit C hereof. Notwithstanding the foregoing, partner non-recourse deductions shall be allocated to the Member that bears the economic risk of loss for the corresponding partner non-recourse debt in accordance with Treasury Regulation section 1.704-2 (i).

Section 7.2 Distributions. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Section 7.2, the Members, by a unanimous vote of the Members, may at any time other than upon liquidation of the Company, cause the Company to distribute cash or property to the Members in accordance with their Capital Interests. Any such cash or property shall be distributed in the following order:

- (a) First, in payment of, or in reserve for payment of, obligations and liabilities of the Company, including obligations to Members (which shall not be considered to include only contributions to capital under Article IV); then

- (b) The Members in proportion to their Capital Interests.

Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, the Managers shall cause the Company to distribute, in accordance with the terms of this Section 7.2, an amount of cash or property that the Managers, in their discretion, deem sufficient for each Member to pay his or her federal income tax liability due to taxable income of the Company, to the extent of available cash or property after funding such reserve or reserves that the Managers deem reasonable and necessary. The Members shall review the financial results of the business on a quarterly basis to determine which distributions, if any, are appropriate.

Section 7.3 Tax Allocations: Code Section 704(c).

(a) In accordance with Code Section 704(c) and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder, income, gains, losses and deductions with respect to any property contributed to the capital of the Company shall, solely for tax purposes, be allocated among the Members so as to take account of any variation between the adjusted basis of such property to the Company for federal income tax purposes and its initial agreed fair market value.

(b) In the event the value of any Company Property is adjusted or revalued, subsequent allocations of income, gain, loss and deduction with respect to such asset shall take account of any variation between the adjusted basis of such asset for federal income tax purposes and its adjusted value in the same manner as under Code Section 704© and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder.

© Any elections or other decisions relating to such allocations shall be made by the Members in any manner that reasonably reflects the purpose and intention of this Agreement. Allocations pursuant to this Section 7.3 are solely for purposes of federal, state and local taxes and shall not affect or in any way be taken into account in computing any Member's Capital Account or share of Profits and Losses or other items or distributions pursuant to any other provision of this Agreement.

Section 7.4 Compliance with Code. It is the intention of the Members that the maintenance of each Member's Capital Account and the determination and allocation of Profits and Losses in accordance with the provisions of this Assignment will comply with Sections 704(b), 704(c) and other applicable provisions of the Code. If at any time the Company is advised by its counsel or accountant that such provisions of this Agreement are more than likely not to be respected for federal income tax purposes, the Members shall amend this Agreement to the minimum extent necessary to satisfy the applicable requirements of the Code; provided, however, that no Member shall be required to consent to any such amendment which could, under any circumstances, increase the amount of Capital Contributions otherwise required to be made by such Member or alter the timing or the amount of any distributions to which such Member otherwise would be entitled under the terms of this Agreement.

ARTICLE VIII TRANSFERABILITY OF MEMBER'S INTEREST

Section 8.1 New Members. Except as otherwise provided in this Article VIII hereof, no person shall be admitted to the Company as a Member unless and until:

- (a) The transferor has stated such intention in the instrument of assignment, provided such transferor is legally able to execute such assignment;
- (b) The transferee has executed an instrument accepting and adopting the terms and provisions of this Agreement;
- © The transferee has paid all reasonable expenses of the Company in connection with the admission of the transferee as a Member;
- (d) All of the Members consent in writing to such transferee becoming a Member; and
- (e) The transferor has provided the Managers with a legal opinion satisfactory to the Managers that the transfer is in compliance with all applicable state and federal laws including the Securities Act of 1933.

Upon satisfaction of all of the foregoing conditions with respect to a particular transferee, the Members shall cause Exhibit C to be amended to reflect the admission of the transferee as a Member.

Section 8.2 Effect of Admission as a Substitute Member. Unless and until admitted as a Member pursuant to Section 8.1, a transferee, including an assignee of a Member's Interest, shall not be entitled to:

- (a) Exercise any rights of a Member in the Company, including the right to vote, grant approvals or give consents with respect to such interest, or
- (b) Inspect the Company's books and records or any information or accounting of the Company's business.

A transferee shall only be entitled to receive, to the extent of the interest transferred to him, the distributions to which the transferor would be entitled. A transferee who has become a Member has, to the extent of the Interest transferred to him, all the rights and powers of the person for whom he is submitted and is subject to the restrictions and liabilities of a Member under this Agreement and the Act.

Section 8.3 Sale Upon Consent of Members. A Member may sell his Membership Interest only after receipt of the written consent of all the Members. In the absence of such consent, a Member may not sell, gift or otherwise transfer his Membership Interest except as provided for in Section 8.4 below. Each Member hereby acknowledges the reasonableness of the restrictions on transfer imposed by this Agreement in view of the Company purposes and the relationship of the

Members. Accordingly, the restrictions on transfer contained herein shall be specifically enforceable. Each Member hereby further agrees to hold the Company and each Member (and each member's successors and assigns) wholly and completely harmless from any costs of enforcing this indemnity incurred by any of such indemnified Members as a result of a transfer or an attempted transfer in violation of this Agreement.

Section 8.4 Permitted Transfers. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, a Member's Membership Interest may be transferred to (i) the duly-appointed executor, guardian or their legal representative of a Member in case of death or incapacity; (ii) another Member; or (iii) a duly formed Family Limited Partnership or other form of ownership agreed upon by the Members in which ownership interests are held by members of a Member's immediate family.

Section 8.5 Insurance. The Company may, from time to time, procure policies of life insurance on the lives of each Member, and make such policies subject to this Agreement in order to provide the cash necessary to complete the purchases contemplated by this Agreement.

ARTICLE IX DISSOLUTION AND WINDING UP

Section 9.1 Dissolution. The Company shall be dissolved and its affairs wound up upon the first to occur of the following:

- (a) The unanimous written consent of all Members; or
- (b) Upon the death, retirement, resignation, expulsion, bankruptcy or dissolution of a Member or occurrence of any other event which terminates the continued membership of a Member, unless the business of the Company is continued by the consent of all of the remaining Members within ninety (90) days after such occurrence and there are at least two remaining Members.

I Section 9.2 Effect of Dissolution. Upon dissolution, the Company shall cease carrying on its business and wind up the affairs of the Company.

Section 9.3 Distribution of Assets on Dissolution. Upon the winding up of the affairs of the Company, the Company's assets shall be distributed:

- (a) To creditors, including Members who are creditors, to the extent permitted by law, in satisfaction of the liabilities of the Company; and
- (b) To Members in accordance with positive capital account balances, taking into account all capital account adjustments for the Company's taxable year in which the liquidation occurs. Liquidation proceeds shall be paid within sixty (60) days of the end of the Company's taxable year or, if later, within ninety (90) days after the date of the liquidation. Such distributions shall be in cash or property (which need not be distributed proportionately) or partly in both, as determined by the Member-Managers.

Section 9.4 Winding Up and Certificate of Cancellation. The winding up of the affairs of the Company shall be completed when all debts, liabilities and obligations of the Company have been paid or discharged or reasonably adequate provision therefor has been made, and all of the remaining property and assets of the Company have been distributed to the Members. Upon the completion of the winding up of the Company, a certificate of cancellation shall be delivered to the Secretary of State, containing the information required under the Act.

ARTICLE X ACCOUNTING

Section 10.1 Accounting Method. The profits and losses of the Company shall be determined in accordance with accounting principles applied on a consistent basis using the cash method of accounting, or as may be otherwise required by the Internal Revenue Service.

Section 10.2 Accounting Period. The Company's accounting period shall be the calendar year.

Section 10.3 Books and Records. All books of account shall, at all times, be maintained in the principal office of the Company, and shall be open during reasonable business hours for the reasonable inspection and examination by the Members or their authorized representatives. Such reasonable inspection shall include the right to make copies of the records and accounts of all operations and expenditures of the Company.

Section 10.4 Tax Matters Partner. **Caroline Pineau** is designated the "Tax Matters Partner" (as defined in Section 6231 of the Internal Revenue Code) and required to represent the Company (at the Company's expense) in connection with all examinations of the Company's affairs by tax authorities, including without limitation, administrative and judicial proceedings, and to expend Company funds for professional services and costs associated therewith. The Members agree to cooperate with each other and to do or refrain from doing any and all things reasonably required to conduct such proceedings.

Section 10.5 Federal Income Tax Returns. The Managers shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, Federal income tax returns for the Company, and, in connection therewith, make any available or necessary elections, including elections with respect to the useful lives and rate of depreciation of the properties of the Company. By the first of April of each calendar year of the Company, the Managers shall use their best efforts to cause to be delivered to the members such information as shall be necessary for the preparation by the Members of their Federal, state and local and other tax returns.

Section 10.6 Reports and Statements. The Managers shall furnish such information to the Members as, in the judgment of the Managers, shall be reasonably necessary for the members to be advised of the financial status and results of operations of the Company.

ARTICLE XI BANK ACCOUNTS

Section 11. The Managers shall open and maintain (in the name of the Company) a special bank account or accounts in which shall be deposited all funds of the Company. Withdrawals from such account or accounts shall be made upon the signature or signatures of such person or persons as the Managers shall designate.

ARTICLE XII MISCELLANEOUS

Section 12.1 Notices. Whenever a provision is made in this Agreement for giving, service, or delivery, of any notice, such notice, shall be deemed to have been duly given, served and delivered if mailed by the United States registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the Member entitled to receive the same at the address or principal place of business of such Member.

Section 12.2 Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the sole and entire agreement and understanding of all parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. Any and all prior discussions, negotiations, commitments and understanding relating thereto are hereby merged herein. This Agreement cannot be amended or modified orally, but may only be amended or modified by a written amendment or modification duly voted and adopted by a unanimous vote of the Members in accordance with Article IV hereof.

Section 12.3 Binding Effect. The covenants and agreements herein contained shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective legal representatives, heirs, successors, and assigns. Should the death of any Member occur, the legal representative of such deceased Member shall hold such interest subject to this Agreement and be bound hereby.

Section 12.4 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original but all such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same instrument.

Section 12.5 Invalid Provisions. Should any part of this Agreement for any reason be declared invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of any remaining portion, which remaining portion shall remain in force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid provision thereof eliminated and it is the declared intention of the parties that they have executed the remaining portion of this Agreement without including therein any such part or portion which may be declared invalid.

Section 12.6 Captions. All headings or captions in this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and are not meant to change, expand, modify or in any way affect the meaning of any section or paragraph herein.

Section 12.7 Applicable Law. This Agreement, the relations, rights, and duties of the Members among themselves and all matters pertaining to the Company and the Company properties and this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of



DIVERSITY PLAN

1. Stem's Commitment to Diversity

Stem is committed to providing equitable employment opportunity; to eliminating discrimination in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, or disability; to maintaining a work environment which is free from any form of unlawful discrimination, including sexual harassment; to promoting a progressive affirmative action program for achieving a representative workforce; to providing prompt, fair and impartial review and adjudication of discrimination complaints.

This commitment will be supported by positive practical efforts to ensure equity for racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, people with disabilities and members of the LGBTQ community in both securing employment and in advancement opportunities at all levels and occupational categories. Stem is also committed to contracting with vendors who have a similar philosophy in maintaining a diverse workforce.

Stem is committed to the following mission:

- Reflecting the contributions and interests of diverse cultures in its mission, operations, and instructional services;
- Eradicating racism and social oppression of all forms within the Stem organization;
- Recognizing differences between people as strengths;
- Using management practices and policies that emphasize participation and empowerment of all people in the organization;
- Creating an equitable working environment where all people are valued; and
- Following through on broader external social responsibilities by educating employees in multicultural perspectives.

2. As part of its comprehensive diversity plan, Stem has adopted the following general program goals:

- a. To identify areas of underrepresentation of racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, the disabled and members of the LGBTQ community and outline the action steps necessary to increase their representation in those areas where they are significantly underrepresented.
- b. To employ racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, the disabled and members of the LGBTQ community throughout all levels of the organization and throughout all job classifications and occupational categories.
- c. To implement the following measurable goals to ensure Stem's employment of diverse backgrounds. In its first year in operation Stem seeks to employ 50% women, 20% racial/ethnic minorities, 10% veterans and 10% employees from the LGBTQ community.
- d. To prevent discriminatory practices relating to employment, or access to promotion for racial/ethnic minorities, women, veterans, the disabled and members of the LGBTQ community.
- e. To identify and define problem areas and barriers to achieving workforce diversity and take affirmative action where necessary.
- f. To outline and implement management actions and targeted recruitment plans for the attainment of program goals.

- g. To implement a workforce diversity evaluation process in order to systematically gauge Stem's progress towards goals and the effectiveness of action plans.
- h. To provide a quarterly progress report to Stem's Executive Director.

3. Roles of Staff in Upholding Stem's Commitment to Diversity

- a. Management will:
 - i. Show its commitment to diversity through its actions and decision making;
 - ii. Demonstrate and embrace the principles of diversity in the organization;
 - iii. Foster a culture of inclusiveness; and
 - iv. Incorporate diversity training into Stem's training programs.
- b. The Manager and supervisors will:
 - i. Consistently and actively encourage their staff to participate in workplace diversity principles;
 - ii. Promptly deal with any complaints or observations of harassment or bullying in the workplace;
 - iii. Uphold merit principles when recruiting and selecting employees; and
 - iv. Support and assist staff to access flexible working arrangement or conditions.
- c. Employees will be encouraged to:
 - i. Behave in ways that will actively contribute to the enhancement of a culture in which diversity is valued among the people they work with;
 - ii. Demonstrably value diversity through team building and consultative processes, and the decisions and actions that they take;
 - iii. Draw on their own and others' diverse skills and talents to enhance work outputs;
 - iv. Not condone or ignore harassing or bullying behavior in the workplace; and
 - v. Conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the diversity values and mission of Stem.

4. Action Steps

Stem has and will continue to work with various state and local agencies to work towards its goals of hiring a diverse workforce, supporting that workforce, and promoting a culture of diversity and inclusiveness. Stem will train employees in open and respectful communication and respecting the diversity of all people at all levels of the industry including customers. Stem intends to work with a number of organizations that will assist it with meeting its diversity goals and will network with their constituencies for employment opportunities.

Stem will work with state and local organizations that advocate for LGBTQ communities, to assist Stem in meeting its diversity goals with respect to the LGBTQ communities. Stem will engage with the Merrimack Valley Branch of the NAACP to assist in meeting its diversity goals with respect to African Americans. The NAACP is an advocacy organization whose purpose is to eliminate racial hatred and discrimination and to ensure the political, social, and economic equality of rights of all persons.

Additionally Stem will work with local organizations that advocates for the disabled and veterans, including the Veterans Northeast Outreach Center in Haverhill and The Arc Greater Haverhill Newburyport to assist Stem in meeting its diversity goals with respect to veterans and persons with disabilities. The Veterans Northeast Outreach Center in Haverhill's primary mission is to "The mission of the Veterans Northeast Outreach Center is to provide the highest quality of services to assist, support, and advocate for all Veterans and their families in Essex, Middlesex, Barnstable and Rockingham Counties. The Arc of Greater Haverhill Newburyport works with disabled populations and mission is to work "tirelessly to strengthen the voice and leadership of people with disabilities while at the same time taking our lead from the self-advocates by listening to what they need and want."

Finally, Stem plans to partner with the Mt. Washington Alliance, a non-profit organization whose mission is to build "A strong, unified Haverhill where all people—with a focus on residents of Mt. Washington—are healthy, safe,

proud, and thriving.” The Mt. Washington Alliance supports all diversity generally, but it has specific outreach efforts focused on Latino outreach, which will assist Stem in meeting its diversity goals with respect to Hispanics. The overarching goal of the Alliance is to align social and economic opportunities for residents of Mt. Washington with those for the rest of Haverhill and the state of Massachusetts. To achieve this goal, the Alliance coordinates neighborhood efforts, connects residents with job and education resources, and promotes neighborhood initiatives in areas such as housing, health, safety, and community life.

Specifically, Stem will engage the above-mentioned organizations to promote participation in Stem’s bi-annual job fairs that promote diversity and recruit women, minorities, veterans, disabled & LGBTQ. To identify a diverse and talented workforce, Stem has already slated its first job fair for summer 2019 in the Mt. Washington neighborhood, in collaboration with the Mt. Washington Alliance, a program of Haverhill based non-profit Community Action. Secondly, Stem will invite all of these above-named organizations to attend Stem’s bi-annual training workshops, open to diverse socio-economic backgrounds including women, minorities, vets, disabled & LGBTQ, with topics tailored toward public speaking, professional development, resume writing, management and leadership. Thirdly, Stem will also host bi-annual educational seminars about equity and diversity in the cannabis industry. Stem’s engagement with these diverse organizations during Stem’s special permit process and hiring process will promote a culture of diversity and inclusiveness, which are at the heart of Stem’s mission.

In order to gauge success of Stem’s Diversity Plan, Stem has implemented the following metrics for assessing success, impact and effectiveness of its plan. Stem will monitor these metrics on a quarterly basis to assess its plan and demonstrate proof of success or progress upon the yearly renewal of license.

Program Assessment:

- Assess number of persons contacted at Stem’s bi-annual job fairs that are minorities, veterans, women, and LGBTQ and include supporting documentation of job fairs.
- Tracking number of individuals from the above referenced demographic groups who were hired and retained after the issuance of a license through the Commission.
- Assess number of persons attending bi-annual training workshops that are minorities, veterans, women, and LGBTQ and include supporting documentation of training workshops.
- Assess number of persons attending Stem’s bi-annual educational seminars and include supporting documentation of educational seminars.

Compliance with Federal and State Laws.

Stem will adhere to the requirements set forth in 935 CMR 500.105(4) which provides the permitted and prohibited advertising, branding, marketing, and sponsorship practices of every Marijuana Establishment. Any actions by the applicant, Caroline Pineau of Haverhill Stem LLC, will not violate the Commission’s regulations with respect to limitations on ownership or control or other applicable laws.

Stem will comply with the following federal and state laws regarding, among other things, diversity, discrimination, and equal pay:

The Civil Rights Act makes it illegal to discriminate against someone based on race, color, religion, national origin, or sex.

The Pregnancy Discrimination Act prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of pregnancy and pregnancy-related conditions and requires employers to accommodate pregnant workers.

Pregnant Workers Fairness Act expressly prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of pregnancy and pregnancy-related conditions and requires employers to accommodate pregnant workers.

The Equal Pay Act requires that men and women be given equal pay for equal work in the same establishment.

The Age Discrimination in Employment Act forbids age discrimination against people who are age 40 or older.

The Americans with Disabilities Act prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

Fair Employment Practices Act prohibits sexual orientation discrimination in the workplace.



Maintaining of Financial Records

Stem will utilize a Point of Sale (POS) system, approved by the Cannabis Control Commission to integrate with Metrc, to maintain business financial records. The POS system will catalogue every activity and sales transaction that occurs at Stem. All sales will be recorded accurately and completely and entered in the POS system. Separate accounting practices at the POS will be used for marijuana sales, marijuana product sales, and non-marijuana product sales.

If the POS system should fail or become unavailable for any reason, all sales will be halted, and the Cannabis Control Commission will be immediately notified. Stem will temporarily close until the POS system is fully operational and functioning again. The Commission will be notified when the POS system becomes available before sales can resume.

The following fields will be tracked in the POS System:

- Date and Time of each sales
- The retail price of purchased products
- The barcode of each purchased product
- Tax collected for each item.

Stem will conduct and record monthly analysis of its POS equipment and sales data. If the analysis determines that the software has been installed for the purposed of manipulation or alteration of sales data, the Commission will be notified immediately. The Commission and the DOR may audit and examine the POS System in order to ensure compliance with Massachusetts tax laws and 935 CMR 500.000. Financial Information and recorded will be stored on redundant, secure servers that employ multiple layers of information security and tamper resistance, and under 24-hour video surveillance. Physical records will also be stored in a secure storage room under 24-hour surveillance. All records will be retained for a minimum of (6) six years.



Personnel Policies including background checks

Marijuana Establishment Agents

Stem shall apply for Marijuana Establishment Agent Registrations for all board members, directors, employees, executives, managers, and volunteers who are associated with the Marijuana Establishment. The Cannabis Control Commission will issue a Marijuana Establishment Agent registration card to each individual determined to be suitable for registration. All individuals shall: be at least 21 years old, never been convicted of an offense involving distribution to minors and be determined to be suitable for registration consistent with provisions of 935 CMR 500.800 and 500.802. Registration cards are valid for one year from the date of issue and shall be renewed on an annual basis upon determination by the Commission.

Stem will immediately terminate employment of any Marijuana Establishment Agent who has:

- Diverted Marijuana, which shall be reported to law enforcement officials and the Commission;
- Engaged in unsafe practices with regard to operation of the Marijuana Establishment, which shall be reported to the Commission; or
- Been convicted or entered a guilty plea, plea of nolo contendere, or admission to sufficient facts of felony drug offense involving distribution to a minor in the Commonwealth, or a like violation of the laws of another state, the United States or a foreign jurisdiction, or a military, territorial, or Native American tribal authority.

Background Checks

Marijuana Establishment Agents will go through the state's mandatory licensing regulations including fingerprinting, a criminal record check, and background check.

Employee Handbook

Stem has an Employee Handbook ("Handbook") that is designed to summarize certain personnel policies and benefits of Haverhill Stem LLC and to acquaint employees with many of the rules concerning employment with Stem. This Handbook applies to all employees, and compliance with Stem's policies are a condition of employment. This handbook supersedes any previous employment policies, written and oral, express and implied. Stem reserves the right to modify, rescind, delete, or add to the provisions of this Handbook from time to time in its sole and absolute discretion. The Employee Handbook is not a binding contract between Stem and its employees, nor is it intended to alter the at-will employment relationship between Stem and its employees. Stem reserves the right to interpret the policies in this Handbook and to deviate from them when, in its discretion, it determines it is appropriate.

Personnel Policies

Equal Employment Opportunity Policy

It is the policy of Stem to provide equal employment opportunities to all employees and employment applicants without regard to unlawful consideration of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition including medical characteristics, marital status or any other classification protected by local, state, or federal laws. This policy prohibits unlawful discrimination based on the perception that anyone has any of those characteristics, or is associated with a person who has or is perceived as having any of those characteristics. This policy applies to all aspects of employment, including, but not limited to hiring, job assignment, working conditions, compensation, promotion, benefits, scheduling, training, discipline, and termination. Reasonable accommodation is available for qualified individuals with disabilities, upon request.

Stem expects all employees to support our equal opportunity policy, and to take all steps necessary to maintain a workplace free from unlawful discrimination and harassment.

In compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Stem provides accommodation to the disabled to the full extent required by law. Stem may require medical certification of both the disability and the need for accommodation. Keep in mind that Stem can only seek to accommodate the known physical or mental limitations of an otherwise qualified disabled individual. Therefore, it is the employee's responsibility to come forward if they are in need of accommodation. Stem will engage in an interactive process with the employee to identify possible accommodations, if any will help the applicant or employee perform the job. Stem further recognizes that employees with life threatening illnesses, including but not limited to cancer, heart disease, and AIDS, may wish to continue engaging in as many of their normal pursuits as their condition allows, including work. As long as the employees are able to meet acceptable performance standards with or without reasonable accommodation, and medical evidence indicates that their working does not present a substantial threat to themselves or others, they will be permitted to do so.

Harassment/Sexual Harassment Policy

Stem is committed to providing a work environment free of sexual or any form of unlawful harassment or discrimination. Harassment or unlawful discrimination against individuals on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition including medical characteristics, marital status or any other classification protected by local, state or federal laws is illegal and prohibited Stem policy. Such conduct by or towards an employee, contract worker, customer, vendor, or anyone else who does business with Stem will not be tolerated. Any employee or contract worker who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination of his or her employment or engagement. To the extent of a customer, vendor or other person with whom Stem does business engages in unlawful harassment or discrimination, Stem will take appropriate corrective action.

Prohibited Conduct:

- A. Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment or engagement;
- B. Submission or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as a basis for decisions concerning that individual's employment or engagement.
- C. It creates a hostile or offensive work environment,

Prohibited harassment includes unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and lewd, vulgar or obscene remarks, jokes, posters or cartoons, and any unwelcome touching, pinching, or other physical contact. Other forms of unlawful harassment or discrimination may include racial epithets, slurs and derogatory remarks, stereotypes, jokes, posters or cartoons based on race, national origin, disability, marital status or other legally protected categories. Prohibited harassment might also be transmitted using Stem's electronic communication system, or through other online content.

Complaint Procedure:

Employees of contract workers who feel that they have been harassed or discriminated against or who witness any harassment or discrimination by an employee, contract worker, customer, vendor, or anyone else who does business with Stem should immediately report such conduct to their supervisor or any other member of management.

Employees should not allow an inappropriate situation to continue by not reporting it, regardless of who is creating the situation. No employee, contract worker, customer, vendor, or other person who does business with this organization is exempt from the prohibitions in this policy. In response to every complaint, Stem will conduct an investigation and, if improper conduct is found, take appropriate corrective action.

To the extent that an employee or contract worker is not satisfied with Stem's handling of a harassment or discrimination complaint, he or she may also contact the appropriate state or federal enforcement agency for relief.

Alcohol, Smoke and Drug-Free Workplace Policy

Stem is committed to providing its employees with a safe and productive work environment. In keeping with this commitment, it maintains a strict policy against the use of alcohol and the unlawful use of drugs in the workplace. Consequently, no employee may consume or possess alcohol, or use, possess, sell, purchase, or transfer illegal drugs at anytime while on Stem's premises.

No employee may report to work with illegal drugs (or their metabolites) or alcohol in his or her bodily system. The only exception to this rule is that employees may engage in moderate consumption of alcohol that may be served and/or consumed as part of an authorized Stem social or business event. "Illegal drug" means any drug that is not legally obtainable or that is legally obtainable but has not been legally obtained. It includes prescription drugs not being used for prescribed purposes or by the person to whom it is prescribed or in prescribed amounts. It also includes any substance a person holds out to another as an illegal drug.

Any violation of this policy will result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.

Any employee who feels he or she has developed an addiction to, dependence upon, or problem with alcohol or drugs, legal or illegal, is strongly encouraged to seek assistance before a violation of this policy occurs. Any employee who requests time off to participate in a rehabilitation program will be reasonably accommodated. However, employees may not avoid disciplinary action, up to and including termination, by entering a rehabilitation center after a violation of this policy is suspected or discovered. When, in Stem's sole and absolute discretion, Stem determines it is appropriate, an employee may be offered the option of participating in and satisfactorily completing a Stem-approved drug and/or alcohol rehabilitation in lieu of termination.

No Weapons Policy

Stem employees are prohibited from carrying or bringing any weapon, as defined herein, to the workplace. This provision applies to all employees, including any employee who is licensed to carry a firearm or weapon, with the sole purpose to help ensure a safe workplace for employees. Weapon means any firearm, whether loaded or unloaded, from which a shot may be discharged including but not limited to pistol, revolver, shotgun, rifle, bb gun or any knife including a switchblade knife, gravity knife, or any knife with a blade longer than 3 inches, or billy, blackjack, bludgeon, metal knuckles, bow and arrow, electronic stunning device, etc. An employee who is uncertain whether an instrument or device is prohibited under this policy is obligated to request clarification to insure he or she is not in violation of this policy. A violation of this policy will be subject to immediate termination, possible criminal prosecution, and/or civil injunctive orders.

Confidentiality Policy

In the course of employment with Stem, employees may have access to “Confidential Information” regarding Stem, which may include its business strategy, future plans, financial information, contracts, suppliers, customers, personnel information or other information that Stem considers proprietary and confidential. Maintaining the confidentiality of this information is vital to Stem’s competitive position in the industry and, ultimately, to its ability to achieve financial success and stability. Employees must protect this information by safeguarding it when in use, using it only for the business of Stem and disclosing it only when authorized to do so and to those who have legitimate business need to know about it. This duty of confidentiality applies whether the employee is on or off Stem’s premises, and during and even after the end of the employee’s employment with Stem. This duty of confidentiality also applies to communications transmitted by Stem’s electronic communications. A violation of this policy will lead to immediate termination and possible civil suit.

As a condition of employment with Stem, all employees must sign a Non-Disclosure Agreement.



Qualifications & Training

Marijuana Establishment Agents

Stem shall apply for Marijuana Establishment Agent Registrations for all board members, directors, employees, executives, managers, and volunteers who are associated with the Marijuana Establishment. The Cannabis Control Commission will issue a Marijuana Establishment Agent registration card to each individual determined to be suitable for registration. All individuals shall: be at least 21 years old, never been convicted of an offense involving distribution to minors and be determined to be suitable for registration consistent with provisions of 935 CMR 500.800 and 500.802. Registration cards are valid for one year from the date of issue and shall be renewed on an annual basis upon determination by the Commission.

Stem will immediately terminate employment of any Marijuana Establishment Agent who has:

- Diverted Marijuana, which shall be reported to law enforcement officials and the Commission;
- Engaged in unsafe practices with regard to operation of the Marijuana Establishment, which shall be reported to the Commission; or
- Been convicted or entered a guilty plea, plea of nolo contendere, or admission to sufficient facts of felony drug offense involving distribution to a minor in the Commonwealth, or a like violation of the laws of another state, the United States or a foreign jurisdiction, or a military, territorial, or Native American tribal authority.

Marijuana Establishment Staffing Goals & Training

The sale of cannabis and cannabis related products will require a certain level of expertise to ensure that our customers receive the information needed to make an informed purchasing decision. Wherever possible, we will look to recruit experienced and qualified individuals coming from the medical cannabis industry or other licensed marijuana establishments, especially as it pertains to the foundational staff. These foundational employees will be required to have an understanding or willingness to understand the rules and regulations around recreational cannabis sales. They will need to demonstrate knowledge of cannabis plant, various product benefits and effects, able to answer consumer questions and educate consumers on safe use.

A secondary goal, since this is a consumer business, will be to employ honest and customer centric individuals that are willing to put the time in to help us grow this new business and maintain long-term customer relations. They will need to be fully educated on the product, process and needs of each customer including past purchases and any eligibility for customer loyalty benefits.

Training of Marijuana Establishment Agents

Stem strives to become the premiere recreational cannabis business in Haverhill Massachusetts and looks forward to working with members of the community, which includes the hiring and training of qualified applicants within

the city. Through a comprehensive *Responsible Vendor Training Program* under 935 CMR 500.105(2)(b), the organization will have the ability to develop product experts who share our passion for the city and its residents. Staff will also be required to receive 8-hr of ongoing training annually. While we look to employ passionate individuals with industry experience, the organization is confident that it can work with vendors to develop this knowledge over time with residents who have intimate relationships with future customers, community leaders and cooperative businesses in the city of Haverhill, MA.

Marijuana Establishment Agents will go through the state's mandatory licensing regulations including fingerprinting, a criminal record check, and background check.

The specific protocols the all Stem agents will be trained in include:

- A. Stem agents will be trained in the specific uses of cannabis, cannabis derived products, and cannabis plant science.
- B. Stem agents will be trained to use state of the art software to ensure valid 21+ IDs and to look up customer's allowable daily purchase limit.
- C. Stem agents will be trained to wear their ID badges at all times during their work shift.
- D. Stem agents will be trained in the risks and side effects of marijuana
- E. Stem agents will be trained in the specific strains of marijuana which can provide relief for different physical ailments
- F. Stem agents will be trained in transaction management and the point of sale system.
- G. Stem agents will be trained on cash drops, inventory security, and inventory and cash reconciliation.
- H. Stem agents will be trained in CPR and first aid.
- I. Stem agents will be trained in recommended dosages for consumers with specific ailments
- J. Stem agents will be trained to recognize symptoms of substance abuse and report it to management.
- K. Stem agents will be trained in safe food handling techniques for the sale of edibles.
- L. Stem agents will be trained in emergency procedures and responses for burglary, theft, discovered diversion of product, accidents, and any other issue that may arise during business hours.



Quality Control and Testing

No marijuana or marijuana product may be sold or otherwise marketed for adult use at Stem that is not capable of being tested by an Independent Testing Laboratory, except as allowed under 935 CMR 500.000 (in compliance with the *Protocol for Sampling and Analysis of Finished Medical Marijuana Products and Marijuana-infused Products*) and the product must be deemed to comply with the standards required under 935 CMR 500.160. As a Marijuana Retailer Stem will only purchase and accept delivery of marijuana and marijuana products that have been certified to have been tested and exceeded testing standards. Store inventory will be purchased from a variety of licensed marijuana cultivators, craft cooperatives, micro-businesses, and marijuana product manufacturers, which are responsible for testing their marijuana and marijuana products prior to initiating sales with Stem. All marijuana products will be tested for potential contaminants including pesticides, heavy metals, mycotoxins and microbiological contaminants, as well as cannabinoid profiles and ratios. The results from all testing will be incorporated into product labeling information. In the event that Stem is notified that its inventory contains a product that is the subject of a product recall for failing to meet testing standards Stem will immediately remove said products and follow CCC protocols for the disposal of said product.

All marijuana handled in preparation for sale, will be secured in a limited access production area with handwashing sink. The floors, walls and ceilings of this area will be constructed in such a manner that they may be adequately kept clean and in good repair. Antimicrobial paint will be used in Stems production area, and vaults where product is stored and handled. All contact surfaces in Stem's Production Area, including utensils and equipment, will be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Storage and transportation of finished marijuana products will be kept under conditions that protect them against physical, chemical, and microbial contamination, as well as deterioration of them or their containers.

Marijuana Establishment Agents whose job includes direct contact with marijuana or non-edible marijuana products must comply with the requirements for the food handlers specified in 105 CMR 300.000. Marijuana will be prepared in a safe and sanitary manner. Cannabis will be well cured and free of seeds and stems, free of dirt, sand, debris, and other foreign matter; free of contamination by mold, rot, other fungus, and bacterial diseases; prepared and handled on food-grade stainless steel tables; and packaged in a secure area. Marijuana Establishment Agents will use sanitary practices that include; adequate personal cleanliness and thorough hand-washing. Adequate and convenient hand-washing facilities with running water at a suitable temperature will be located in any production areas. The production area will be supplied with hair nets and rubber gloves. All Marijuana Establishment Agents will wash hands,

apply gloves and hair nets any time working with marijuana products. Any time marijuana products are handled in the Production Area, Stem agents will take necessary sanitary precautions to make sure marijuana products are processed and packaged properly, and ensure all edible products will be prepared, handled, and stored in compliance with the sanitation requirements in 105 CMR 590.000.

All storage and transportation of finished marijuana products by Stem Marijuana Agents will be conducted under conditions that will protect the products against physical, chemical, and microbial contamination as well as against deterioration of finished products or their containers.

Stem will comply with state and local plumbing codes to ensure the Marijuana Establishment's water supply will be sufficient for necessary operation. Any private water source shall be capable of providing a safe, potable, and adequate supply of water to meet Stem's needs. All plumbing on Stem's premises will be of adequate size and design and compliant with state and local plumbing codes. Stem will adequately install and maintain plumbing on the premise to carry sufficient quantities of water to required locations throughout the Marijuana Establishment. Plumbing on Stem's premises will properly convey sewage and liquid disposable waste from the Marijuana Establishment. There will be no cross-connections between potable and waste water lines.

Stem will provide its employees with an ADA complaint and readily accessible restroom on the first floor of the premises. All toilet facilities will be cleaned daily and kept in good repair. Stem will have a designated mop closet with sufficient space for the placement of equipment and storage of materials for the maintenance of sanitary operations. Any toxic cleaning items will be identified, held, and stored in our designated mop closet away from any marijuana or marijuana products. Stem will hire a pest control company for monthly inspections of premises and form a pest control binder to document monthly inspections. There will be a dumpster designated outside, with an industrial dead lock with key. Stem's operating systems for waste disposal will be maintained in an adequate manner pursuant to 935 CMR 500.105 (12).



Record Keeping Procedures

Stem will ensure that the records for Stem are available for inspection by the Commission, upon request. Stem will maintain all records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Written records that are required and subject to inspection include, but are not necessarily limited to, all records required in any section of 935 CMR 500.000, in addition to the following:

- a. Written Operating Procedures as required by 935 CMR 500.105(1);
- b. Inventory Records as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8);
- c. Seed-to-sale tracking records for all marijuana products as required by 935 CMR 500.105 (8)(e);
- d. The following personnel records:
 1. Job descriptions for each employee and volunteer portion, as well as organizational charts consistent with the job descriptions;
 2. A personnel record for each marijuana establishment agent. Such records shall be maintained for at least 12 months after termination of the individual's affiliation with the Marijuana Establishment and shall include, at a minimum, the following:
 - a. All materials submitted for the Commission pursuant to 935 CMR 500.030(2);
 - b. Documentation of verification of references;
 - c. The job description or employment contract that includes duties, authority, responsibilities, qualifications, and supervision
 - d. Documentation of all required training, including training regarding privacy and confidentiality requirements, and the signed statement of the individual indicating the date, time, and place he or she received said training and the topics discussed, including the name and title of presenters;
 - e. Documentation of periodic performance evaluations;
 - f. A record of any disciplinary action taken; and
 - g. Notice of completed responsible vendor and eight-hour related duty training.
 3. A staffing plan that will demonstrate accessible business hours and safe cultivation conditions;
 4. Personnel policies and procedures; and
 5. All background check reports obtained in accordance with 935 CMR 500.030.
- e. Business Records, which shall include manual or computerized records of:
 1. Assets and liabilities;
 2. Monetary transactions;
 3. Books of accounts, which shall include journals, ledgers, and supporting documents, agreements, checks, invoices, and vouchers;
 4. Sales records including the quantity, form, and cost of marijuana products; and
 5. Salary and wages paid to each employee, stipend paid to each board member, and any executive compensations, bonus, benefit, or item of value paid to any individual affiliated with a Marijuana Establishment.
- f. Waste Disposal Records as required under 935 CMR 500.105(12); and

- g. Following closure of a Marijuana Establishment, all records will be kept for at least two years at the expense of the Marijuana Establishment and in a form and location acceptable to the Commission.



Restricting Access to age 21 and older

Requirements to Enter Store

The primary layer of security to resist access to consumers age 21 and older begins the moment the individual walks into the facility from the street entrance. Every individual seeking access to the Marijuana Establishment will be greeted by an employee, seated in a secure guard booth, wearing a clearly visible picture ID who will examine the customer's form of identification to ensure he or she is over 21 years of age, and the document presented is indeed authentic. Proper forms of ID will be a valid driver's license, state issued ID, military ID or passport. A scanner and / or software authentication technology will be on hand should clarification be required. This sally-port location will serve as a secure vestibule, to which access is controlled by the ID checker, ensuring and strictly limiting entry to the main sales floor to only those age 21 and older.



Positive Impact & Economic Empowerment Plan

As a designated economic empowerment applicant, Caroline Pineau, Stem's CEO and founder, has a comprehensive plan for positive impact at the heart of her business model. For the past eight and a half years Caroline has owned and operated a community-centered yoga studio in downtown Haverhill, designated by the Cannabis Control Commission as an area of disproportionate impact. As a woman business owner and long-time Haverhill resident, Caroline has created a yoga studio that serves as a sanctuary for people within the Haverhill community, where the primary population served is disproportionately impacted. The Yoga Tree is a place of empowerment--- a place that fosters health, wellness, education and community.

Caroline will use this same community-centered approach to building Stem. Stem will also work with these organizations to create employment opportunities and to help with job training.

A. Community Programming with Haverhill Boys and Girls Club

The mission of the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club is "to inspire and enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens, and to provide the youth of Greater Haverhill with a safe, clean, wholesome environment that will allow our members to strive towards excellence." Stem and its employees will commit community service time to support special programming at the Club through quarterly in person volunteer visits to the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club, Stem employees will help club staff facilitate the success of the below named programs. As a respected female business owner within Haverhill, Caroline Pineau will personally participate in the club's female empowerment program called "SMART Girls." Caroline has had a long relationship with the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club through her yoga studio and has met with board members and the Executive Director to commit volunteer hours with following programs.

- **SMART Girls** – This program helps girls develop healthy attitudes. It is a small-group health, fitness, prevention/education and self-esteem enhancement program designed to meet the developmental needs of girls in three age groups, spanning ages 8 to 18. Through dynamic sessions, participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own and societal attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good health care and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.
- **Passport to Manhood Program** -- Passport to Manhood encourages boys aged 8 to 14 to develop and mature into young men. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young boys in discussions and activities that reinforce character, leadership and positive behavior. Each participant receives a "passport" to underscore the notion that he is on a personal journey of maturation and growth. Each of the program's 14 sessions use interactive activities to focus on a specific aspect of character and manhood. It also includes a service project where boys learn the importance of giving back to the community.
- **SMART Moves (Skills Mastery and Resilience Training) prevention and education program** – This program addresses problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity. SMART Moves uses a team approach that involves Club staff, peer leaders, parents and community representatives. Young people ages 6 to 15 engage in discussion and role-playing, practicing resilience and refusal skills, developing assertiveness, strengthening decision-making skills and analyzing media and peer influence.

The ultimate goal is to promote abstinence from substance abuse and adolescent sexual involvement through the practice of responsible behavior.

B. Community Programming with Emmaus House

Another charity that Caroline has been involved with in Haverhill for years is Emmaus House, Inc. Emmaus's mission is "We affirm the value of human dignity and self-respect for every person. We are called by our collective spiritual and social responsibility to serve all people in need—the homeless, disadvantaged, disabled, unemployed, and oppressed. Our goal is to enhance societal and personal advancement through provision of housing and support services that empower individuals and families to reach their fullest potential." Emmaus helps people rebuild their lives by creating and renewing a sense of community.

Caroline and Stem will aid Emmaus House through bi-annual service opportunities with Stem staff including off-site projects such as running food or supply drives, preparing and delivering meals, and putting together hygiene or other kits for Emmaus residents. Emmaus House has been contacted by Stem and can receive financial donations that Stem plans on making to their organization and will work with Stem in the furthering goals of the Emmaus House.

C. Participate in local job fairs bi-annually to ensure that 75% of Stem's staff is from Haverhill, an area of disproportionate impact. Stem will employ local citizens with diverse socio-economic backgrounds wherever possible. Through local hiring, Stem will promote and support economic empowerment in Haverhill, a community impacted by high arrests and incarceration. Stem will host its first local Haverhill job fair in July 2019.

D. Participate in at least 100 hours of community service annually in the city of Haverhill. This will be a company-wide initiative in which each employee will participate to help some of the wonderful organizations working to revitalize and economically empower Haverhill. Organizations will include but not limited to the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club, Emmaus House, and Team Haverhill. As attachments to these plans are letters from all the above named Non-Profit organizations memorializing Stem's pledge to partner with the organization.

In addition to Stem's previously stated plans for bi-annual off-site service projects with Emmaus House and quarterly volunteer commitment with the Haverhill Boys and Girls Club, Caroline also wants to further positively impact the Haverhill community and Stem's specific geographic location within Haverhill through its work with Team Haverhill.

Stem will participate in two volunteer opportunities annually with Team Haverhill. The first annual volunteer opportunity with Team Haverhill is its River Ruckus Festival, an annual festival that showcases everything Haverhill has to offer, including the Merrimack River. This community offering is a way to bring community together, to showcase Haverhill's budding historic district, to highlight business and promote commerce in the downtown area. Stem will also volunteer annually with Team Haverhill's Annual "Small Projects Big Impact". Several examples of Small Projects Big Impact include ongoing projects to beautify and brightening up the downtown through clean-up efforts and landscaping. There is also an annual book drive to contribute to 'Haverhill Promise', an initiative started by State Representative Andy Vargas to help acquire books so that kids can get up to grade level reading proficiency by grade 3.

E. Community Education- Stem will host educational seminars bi-annually about the cannabis industry throughout the community to help minimize the stigma surrounding the cannabis plant and industry as whole. Topics discussed in these seminars will include youth use and prevention, impaired driving, and responsible cannabis consumption. Stem will be a good neighbor and corporate citizen.

F. Business Referral Program- In addition to being active participants in the Greater Haverhill Chamber of Commerce and staying very connected to the Haverhill business community, Stem remains committed to being a good neighbor and corporate citizen. With Stem's unique downtown location, Stem will support other local businesses in the WDA & WDA B (Waterfront Districts A & B) by referring its customers on a daily basis to the wonderful restaurants, coffee shops and other retail establishments within walking distance of Stem. Stem believes in synergistically working with other businesses for communal success and empowerment. Stem can play

its part on in this by highlighting all of the wonderful things our growing city epicenter has to offer. When customers patron Stem, they will be given digital recommendations through their ecommerce presence and through written collateral with recommendations by Stem staff of where to visit either while they wait or prior to or post visiting Stem's Licensed Marijuana Establishment, so that downtown Haverhill can become a destination shopping experience.

Program Assessments

Yearly upon application for renewal, Stem will utilize the following proposed metrics to assess its Positive Impact and Economic Empowerment Plan and to account for the progress of the plan.

- Accounting of how many youth have gone through the above-mentioned Boys and Girls Club Programs.
- Assessment of how many people have been impacted by Emmaus House financial donations as well directly impacted through Stem staff participation in off-site volunteer projects such as running food or supply drives, preparing and delivering meals, and putting together hygiene or other kits for Emmaus residents.
- Post mortem debriefs with organizers of Team Haverhill's River Ruckus and Small Projects Big Impact to assess Haverhill community participation in each event and how to enhance such participation in future years.
- Documentation from job fairs attended or hosted by Stem's demonstrating participation and impact with these local job fairs. This documentation will include the number of interviews and or discussions between potential job applicants and Stem at each event.
- Acquiring testimonials from abutters, fellow business owners, and residents in the WDA and WDB districts as to Stem's Positive Impact in the downtown business community and effectiveness of Stems business referral plan.
