Please accept this Notice of Decision for the above-referenced property. This is for Special Permit approval and is ready for recording by the Maynard Town Clerk's Office. The Planning Board is designated as the Special Permit Granting Authority (SPGA) for the required permit(s) or approval(s) required for this project.

I. General

On December 31, 2018, Mass Wellspring, LLC., 18 Powdermill Road, Acton, MA 01720 (hereinafter referred to as "the Applicant") submitted to the Maynard Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") an application requesting a Special Permit to operate a marijuana retailer establishment in the Central Business zoning district at 4-12 Nason Street (later amended to apply only to 4-6 Nason Street).

Mass Wellspring, LLC. was represented during the Public Hearing process by Olof Ingare.

II. Plans and Documents Submitted in Support of the Application

The following documents were submitted to and reviewed by the Planning Board either with the associated application, or during the Public Hearing process, and form the basis of this Decision.

The Planning Board reviewed these materials and subsequent revisions of the same, during the application, public hearing and deliberation processes. The Town Engineer and the Planning Board's Peer Review Consultant reviewed the Applicant's Traffic Impact, Parking and Access Study and deemed it sufficient to evaluate the current conditions.

III. Review Criteria

Section 3.1.2, Use Regulations of the Zoning By-laws (ZBL) allows a Marijuana Retailer by Special Permit of the SPGA within the "Central Business" (CB), Zoning District. Section 7.9 provides the requirements for Marijuana Retailers. The project is located within, developed under, and subject to, the "Central Business" zoning district regulations. It is also located within the Downtown Overlay District (DOD). Because this is a non-residential use in a structure constructed prior to 2007, Section 9.4.9 of the Zoning By-laws allows a "First Floor Rehabilitation Credit" for parking at this location – namely, no dedicated parking spaces are required. However, as part of the Special Permit criteria, the SPGA considered traffic control and parking as part of the review.

The project requires and is subject to Town approval for:

- a. Special Permit Approval to allow a retail Recreational Marijuana establishment is required. Section 10.4.2 of the ZBL provides the criteria that must be considered in order to issue a Special Permit.
- b. DOD Special Permit Because the project is located within the DOD, in addition to the Special Permit criteria identified in Section 10.4 of the ZBL, in order to grant a Special Permit within the DOD, the Board shall apply the review criteria as contained within Section 9.4.6 of the ZBL. Because this is a business going into an existing structure with no exterior improvements or footprint change, not all of the review criteria -if anyare applicable.
- c. Design Guideline Consistency Section 10.6 of the ZBL states in order to grant Site Plan approval within the Central Business, Business, DOD and Health Care Industrial Districts, a project must demonstrate consistency with Section 10.6 Design Review of the ZBL and the Planning Board Rules and Regulations (PBRR). Because this is a business going into an existing structure, with no exterior improvements or footprint change, this By-law is not applicable.

In addition to standard business and building permitting, and to obtaining a Special Permit from the SPGA for a marijuana establishment, an applicant must also:

Be licensed by the Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission.

- Execute a host community agreement with the Town (Board of Selectmen).
- Receive approval of security plan from the Police Department.
- Undergo plan review by the Health Department.

IV. Public Hearings(s) and Vote(s) of the Planning Board

The Planning Board began Public Hearings for the project on March 26, 2019 and closed the Public Hearing on May 14, 2019. Notice of the Public Hearing was published in the Beacon Villager on January 10th and 17th, 2019. Abutters were notified by certified mail according to the Assessors' Certified Abutters List.

After conducting the public hearings, and after its own analysis and deliberation relative to the proposed project and the supporting documents and plans described above and herein, the Board determined the following Special Permit requests are consistent with the requirements for the issuance of Special Permits as described in Section 10.4.2 "Criteria" of the ZBL.

a. Findings:

- Social, economic, or community needs which are served by the proposal;
 The Town voted to allow recreational marijuana uses. The use will allow
 residents to purchase products in Downtown Maynard. It is anticipated that this
 will be a destination for shoppers and will have a spillover effect for surrounding
 businesses.
- 2. Traffic flow and safety, including parking and loading;
 This location is a pre-existing Downtown retail location. The Planning Board's
 Conditions of Approval include mitigation measures to result in minimal traffic
 disruption and ensure pedestrian safety.
- Adequacy of utilities and other public services;
 This site is currently served by utilities. The Planning Board's Conditions of Approval include mitigation measures to result in minimal impact to the Police Department and reimburse them for expenses incurred.
- 4. Neighborhood character and social structures; This location is a pre-existing Downtown retail location. It is sited in a location consistent with the requirements of the Zoning By-laws. The Planning Board's Conditions of Approval include mitigation measures to ensure minimal –if anydisruption to the social structure.
- Impacts on the natural environment;
 The project as proposed has no additional effect on the natural environment.
- 6. Potential fiscal impact, including impact on town services, tax base, and employment.

 The use will generate significant tax revenue from a previously vacant storefront. Maynard residents will receive employment priority.

Planning Board Vote: to GRANT a Special Permit allowing a marijuana retailer establishment in the Central Business zoning district at 4-6 Nason Street subject to the Conditions of Approval as contained in Section V of this Decision.

V. Conditions of Approval

The following conditions apply to the Planning Board's approval of this project:

- Hours of operation authorized by this permit are 10AM 8PM seven days a week.
 Other approving authorities may further restrict these hours.
- Applicant shall appear before the Planning Board at their regularly posted meeting
 within 45 days after opening of establishment for review. If the Planning Board
 deems the modification of the Special Permit and/or additional Conditions of
 Approval necessary, the applicant shall be responsible for the cost of a Public
 Hearing for any required modification.
- 3. The Planning Board retains all authority to modify or otherwise address all aspects of the Permit at any time. This includes, but is not limited, to the Planning Board's determination if there are circumstances the Board deems problematic, dangerous, hazardous or that otherwise require modification to comply with the intent of the Permit or the Zoning By-law.
- 4. The applicant shall modify the exterior of the subject property based on Police Department recommendations to ensure security of the premises, of other properties, its employees and the public at all times. This includes the Police Department's consideration of exterior security for all times including times the establishment is, or is not, open to the public, or accepting deliveries, disposals, transfers or other activities associated with the use of the subject property.
- 5. Unless/until authorized by the Planning Board at a regularly posted meeting, retail business at the subject establishment shall be by appointment only. Appointments shall be in 12 minute blocks consisting of no more than five customers per block; thus 25 maximum appointments her hour.
- 6. During hours of operation, a detail shall be provided by the Maynard Police Department (at the applicant's expense) on Nason and Main Streets to ensure there is limited traffic congestion. The Maynard Police Chief shall have the authority to modify conditions of this approval addressing pedestrian/ public safety and traffic "at will". This condition meets the criteria for "at will" modification by the Police Chief. The Police Chief shall notify the Planning Board of any modification of this condition, and the Police Chief has the authority to discontinue Police Details at his discretion if determined that they are no longer needed.

- 7. Discharge of passengers on Nason Street or Main Street or in a location other than a designated drop-off area or parking lot approved by the Department of Public Works (DPW) and the Police Department, is prohibited. The Maynard Police Chief shall have the authority to modify conditions of this approval addressing pedestrian/public safety and traffic "at will". This condition meets the criteria for "at will" modification by the Police Chief. The Police Chief shall notify the Planning Board of any modification of this condition.
- 8. The Applicant shall notify the police in the event there is a congregation of persons that block or otherwise impedes circulation of the public at any location connected with the use of subject property. This condition shall apply on or off the subject premises. The Maynard Police Chief shall have the authority to modify conditions of this approval addressing pedestrian/ public safety and traffic "at will". This condition meets the criteria for "at will" modification by the Police Chief. The Police Chief shall notify the Planning Board of any modification of this condition.
- 9. As directed by DPW, the Applicant shall at his/her own expense: a) provide and install signage, as needed for the entire period the Special Permit is valid. b) provide and install landscaping (consisting of four trees and mulch in Town-owned sidewalk wells) located in front of the subject properties. The design, size and other specifications of signage and landscaping shall be as directed by DPW. The initial signage and tree installation shall be consistent with attached Figures #1 and #2 (Prepared by VHB).
- 10. The Applicant shall lease the adjacent property (6 Nason Street) to function as a waiting room for customers.
- 11. The Applicant shall conduct a Traffic Assessment six months after the establishment has opened and provide a summary memorandum of current traffic conditions and any recommendations to improve any persistent traffic problems. The Assessment shall be completed in conjunction with the Town Engineer and be presented to the Planning Board during a regularly scheduled Public Meeting in which the project is advertised on the agenda.

Plan for Positive Impact (Revised June 2020)

1. Introduction. Mass Wellspring LLC recognizes that certain people and groups of people have been disproportionate harmed by cannabis prohibitions and enforcement. Mass Wellspring LLC is committed to devoting resources to positively impact those that have suffered such disproportionate harm as described in this Plan for Positive Impact (this "Plan"). Mass Wellspring LLC welcomes the opportunity to support the Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission (the "Commission") in its mandate to adopt procedures and policies to promote full participation in the regulated cannabis industry by individuals from communities disproportionately harmed by cannabis prohibition and enforcement and to positively impact those communities. This Plan sets forth Mass Wellspring LLC's plan to contribute to this objective.

2. Disproportionately Harmed People – Generally.

The Commission has identified five populations as "People Disproportionately Harmed by Cannabis Prohibition" in the Commission's Guidance on Plans to Positively Impact Disproportionately Harmed People" available on the Commission's website.

3. Disproportionately Harmed People Specifically Intended to Benefit from this Plan.

This Plan is intended to benefit persons within categories 1, 4 and/or 5; specifically:

- Past or present residents of the geographic areas of disproportionate impact which have been defined by the Commission and identified in its Guidance for Identifying Areas of Disproportionate Impact. (Mass Wellspring LLC understands that some disproportionately impacted geographic locations are cities or towns and others are neighborhoods identified by census tracts.)
- Massachusetts residents who have past drug convictions; and
- Massachusetts residents with parents or spouses who have drug convictions.

4. Goals.

We will offer a program of three to six-month paid internships to individuals within categories 1, 4 and/or 5 (a "Disproportionately Impacted Person"). The goal of this Plan is to train and mentor Disproportionately Impacted Persons to be managers, cultivators or other key employees of a licensed cannabis business or related businesses or to be an entrepreneur in the licensed cannabis industry or related businesses.

The specific goals of this Plan are: (i) to offer one (1) internship during the first twelve (12) months after opening the Maynard adult use retail location; (ii) to offer two (2) internships during months thirteen through twenty-four (13-24) after opening the Maynard adult use retail location, (iii) for the one (1) intern during the first twelve (12) months after opening the Maynard adult use retail location to secure a job in the licensed cannabis business or related businesses or to be an entrepreneur in the licensed cannabis industry or related businesses or another paying job that utilizes some of the skills learned during the internship; and (iv) for the two (2) interns during months thirteen through twenty four (13-24) after opening the Maynard adult use retail location to secure a job in the licensed

cannabis business or related businesses or to be an entrepreneur in the licensed cannabis industry or related businesses or another paying job that utilizes some of the skills learned during the internship.

5. **Program.**

Mass Wellspring LLC will offer to Disproportionately Impacted Persons a paid internship program of three to six-months each. Mass Wellspring LLC will offer training and mentoring in the licensed cannabis business with the intern working and gaining hands-on experience in the cultivation, harvesting, processing, packaging, dispensing, retail sales, marketing, wholesale ordering and regulatory compliance of Mass Wellspring LLC. The program will offer one internship during the first twelve months after opening the Maynard adult use retail location, scaling up to two internships during months 13-24. Each intern will have an in-person evaluation at the conclusion of their internship to give them feedback on their performance and progress. Each intern will work a maximum of 35 hours per week. We may permit an intern to have more than one internship to develop an expertise in one or more elements of the business, such as cultivation.

We will also solicit input from the interns at the conclusion of their internship to solicit their suggestions on the program, focusing on aspects that they found most helpful and those that were less helpful so that we can constantly improve the program. Mass Wellspring LLC will reassess and modify the program at least semiannually on the basis of this feedback.

Mass Wellspring LLC plans to keep in touch with past interns to keep track of their continuing involvement in the licensed cannabis business or related businesses in Massachusetts.

Mass Wellspring LLC will conduct an outreach program to find qualified candidates by advertising the paid internship in the Lowell Sun, the Eagle Tribune or another newspaper in applicable geographic areas of disproportionate impact. We will advertise monthly until a suitable candidate is found.

6. **Measurements**.

Mass Wellspring LLC will review the success of our outreach program by tracking the number of Disproportionately Impacted Persons who respond to the outreach program and apply for the internships. We will redirect or expand the outreach program if we are unable to fill the quarterly internships.

Success of the internship program's goals will be measured as follows:

<u>Goal</u>: To provide one (1) internship during the first twelve (12) months after opening the Maynard adult use retail location.

<u>Measurement</u>: Mass Wellspring LLC will track the number of interns in the program during months 1-12 after opening the Maynard adult use retail location compared to the stated goal of (1).

<u>Goal</u>: To provide two (2) internships during months thirteen through twenty-four (13-24) after opening the Maynard adult use retail location.

<u>Measurement</u>: Mass Wellspring LLC will track the number of interns in the program during months 13-24 after opening the Maynard adult use retail location compared to the stated goal of two (2).

<u>Goal</u>: For one (1) intern during the first twelve (12) months after opening the Maynard adult use retail location to secure a job in the licensed cannabis business or related businesses or to be an entrepreneur in the licensed cannabis industry or related businesses or another paying job that utilizes some of the skills learned during the internship.



LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY AGREEMENT OF MASS WELLSPRING LLC

This Limited Liability Company Agreement of Mass Wellspring LLC (the "Company") is entered into as of $\Delta p \alpha 1$, 2018 by Windmill Advisors LLC as sole member of the Company (the "Member").

The Member will carry on the Company as a limited liability company in accordance with the provisions of the Massachusetts Limited Liability Company Act (the "Act") and pursuant to the following terms:

- 1. Name; Jurisdiction of Organization. The name of the Company is Mass Wellspring LLC. The Company is a limited liability company organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The Company is the result of the conversion of Mass Wellspring, Inc., a Massachusetts business corporation (the "Business Corporation"), into a Massachusetts limited liability company pursuant to an Agreement and Plan of Conversion adopted and approved by the Business Corporation (the "Plan"). The Business Corporation was the result of the conversion of Mass Wellspring, Inc., a Massachusetts non-profit corporation (the "Non-Profit Corporation"), into a Massachusetts business corporation pursuant to an Agreement and Plan of Conversion adopted and approved by the Non-Profit Corporation.
- 2. Purpose. The general character of the business of the Company is to engage in the cultivation, transportation and distribution of cannabis, to the extent permitted and in accordance with Massachusetts law, and to engage in any other lawful business.
- 3. Office; Agent for Service of Process The principal office of the Company (and its resident office in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts pursuant to Section 5 of the Act) shall initially be 18 Powdermill Road, Acton, MA 01720. The name and address of the resident agent of the Company for service of process pursuant to Section 5 of the Act shall initially be Olof Ingare, 18 Powdermill Road, Acton, MA 01720. The Member may, upon compliance with the applicable provisions of the Act, change the Company's principal office, its resident office or resident agent from time to time, all as determined by the Member.
- 4. Management. The management of the Company and its business and affairs shall be vested solely in the Member, and the Member shall have the power and authority to exercise all of the rights, powers and privileges granted under the Act, any other applicable law and this Agreement. The Member may appoint one or more individuals as agents of the Company with, in each case, such title, duties, power, and authority as the Member shall determine from time to time, and such agents may be referred to as officers of the Company. Unless the authority of the agent designated as an officer in question is limited in the document appointing such officer or is otherwise specified by the Member, any officer so appointed shall have the same authority to act for the Company as a corresponding officer of a Massachusetts corporation would have to act for a Massachusetts corporation in the absence of a specific delegation of authority. Any number of offices may be held by the same person, as the Member may determine. Unless otherwise provided in the appointment of any officer, each officer shall be chosen for a term that shall continue until such officer's successor shall have been chosen and

qualified or such officer's earlier resignation or removal by the Member. The initial officers are as set forth in the Plan.

5. Term.

- (a) The term of the Company shall continue until the Company is terminated by the Member unless earlier dissolved upon the occurrence of an event of dissolution under Section 43 of the Act (subject to the right to continue the Company contained in Section 5(b), below, or pursuant to the Act).
- (b) The Member may continue the business of the Company upon the occurrence of any event that constitutes an event of dissolution of a limited liability company under the Act by electing to do so within 90 days after the occurrence of any such event.
- **6. Limited Liability**. Except as otherwise required by the Act, the debts, expenses, obligations and liabilities of the Company, whether arising in contract, tort or otherwise, shall be solely the debts, expenses, obligations and liabilities of the Company.
- 7. Capital Contributions. Capital contributions shall be made in the form of cash, assets or other property by the Member. A record of the capital contributions shall be maintained by the Company.
- 8. Membership Interests. Membership interests of the Company may be represented by certificates at the sole discretion of the Member.

9. Membership Interest Transfers.

- 10. Allocations and Distributions. Each item of income, gain, loss, deduction and credit of the Company for federal income tax purposes shall be allocated to the Member. All distributions in respect of the ownership interests in the Company shall be made to the Member.

- 11. Tax Matters Partner. The Member is hereby designated as the "Tax Matters Partner" under Section 6231(a)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- 12. Fiscal and Tax Year. The fiscal and tax year of the Company shall be determined by the Member.
- 13. Method of Accounting. The method of accounting used by the Company shall be determined by the Member.
- 14. Conversion to Corporation. The Member may cause the Company to convert to corporate form, in its sole discretion, through one or more structures, including without limitation a merger or formation of a holding corporation. The Member shall have the exclusive power and authority to effect such a conversion and to make all determinations, decisions and elections in connection therewith.
- 15. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Company, the Member and their respective successors, successors-in-title, legal representatives, heirs and assigns. Except as provided in Section 9(b) hereof, none of the provisions of this Agreement shall be for the benefit of or enforceable by any person or entity other than a member or the Company, including without limitation any creditor of any member or the Company.
- 16. Amendments; Waivers. No waiver, modification or amendment of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless such waiver, modification or amendment is in writing duly executed by the Member. No delay or omission in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right.
- 17. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the internal laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

MASS WELLSPRING LLC - BUSINESS PLAN (Revised April 2020)

The Company. Mass Wellspring LLC (the "Company") is a locally, privately owned and controlled limited liability company organized under the laws of Massachusetts. The Company is engaged in the cultivation, processing and sale within Massachusetts of cannabis and cannabis products. The Company is applying for a license from the Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission (the "Commission") to own and operate a Marijuana Establishment in Maynard, Massachusetts for the retail sale for adult use only of cannabis and cannabis products. The Company has an existing Commission licensed cultivation facility and medical marijuana dispensary located in Acton, Massachusetts (the "Existing Facilities").

Short Term Goals. The Company's short term business goal is to open, own and operate the proposed new facility in Maynard for the retail sale for adult use only of cannabis and cannabis products (the "**Proposed Adult Use Facility**") and to operate it in accordance with applicable Massachusetts laws and regulations and applicable Maynard laws and regulations. The Company is committed to operating a first class adult use cannabis retail facility that reflects well on Maynard and adds to the tax and other revenues of Maynard. The Proposed Adult Use Facility in Maynard will be a separate, stand-alone operation from the Existing Facilities which are located in Acton, and the Proposed Adult Use Facility will not be collocated with the Existing Facilities. The Company intends to continue to own and operate the Existing Facilities after opening the Proposed Adult Use Facility.

Long Term Goals. The Company's longer term goals are to open, own and operate up to three (including the Proposed Adult Use Facility) adult use retail Marijuana Establishments in Massachusetts, while continuing to own and operate the Existing Facilities. The Company expects it to be increasingly challenging to obtain suitable locations in other cities or towns in Massachusetts for adult use retail cannabis facilities. A large number of cities and towns have banned (or adopted moratoriums for) Marijuana Establishments. Many of the available cities and towns already have one or more existing or planned Marijuana Establishments or there are no available locations because of zoning and other restrictions. The Company originally planned to open an adult use retail facility at the Acton location but Acton narrowly approved a moratorium/ban after the Company obtained a long term lease for the Acton property. That necessitated that the Company start over again for a suitable location in a town willing to accept cannabis businesses. The Company's focus is therefore on getting the Proposed Adult Use Facility open while mindful of its longer term goals.

Operations Limited to Massachusetts. Currently the Company has no plans to expand operations outside of Massachusetts.

Competition. There is already one competing adult use retail facility opening in Maynard and the Company has been advised by Maynard that the town may approve additional retail facilities. Each of these will be direct competitors of the Proposed Adult Use Facility. In addition, there are existing or planned adult use retail facilities is one or more surrounding towns that will also compete for adult use customers. The Company plans to compete by offering what the Company believes are superior products combined with excellent customer service by a locally owned and operated establishment. The Company is NOT a national or international company or a public

company with a disparate focus on a range of businesses. The Company will seek to attract customers through the "shop locally" mantra. The Company hopes to have the same success with retail sales and retail customers that the Company has had (despite the vaping ban) with customers of its existing medical marijuana facility which has remained open to serve patients despite the pandemic risks.

Management. The Company is managed and controlled by Dr. Stefanie M. Lipton and her husband Olof Ingare, both residents of Massachusetts. Dr. Lipton and Mr. Ingare have been directly involved with the Company since its inception. Both have been actively involved in all aspects of the Company's business. Mr. Ingare focuses on product selection and sourcing, security, finance and sales while Dr. Lipton focuses on strategic planning, state licensing, local permits, community outreach, advertising and facility design. The Company plans to hire a manager and retail agents for the Proposed Adult Use Facility once the final license has been granted and will comply with its Diversity Plan in making these hires. The Company will provide training to all new hires before allowing them to check potential customer ID's, accept or process orders, handle cannabis or cannabis products or handle cash. The Company expects to have either Mr. Ingare or Dr. Lipton on site at the Proposed Adult Use Facility to oversee opening and initial operations. The Company expects to have either Mr. Ingare or Dr. Lipton on site at the Proposed Adult Use Facility for all product deliveries.

Target Market. The Company intends to offer a selection of premium cannabis and cannabis products to adult consumers at the Proposed Adult Use Facility, while fulfilling its contractual and legal obligations and duties to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Town of Maynard. The Company intends to charge prices for its products that are competitive with other adult-use cannabis facilities in Maynard and surrounding towns, generating a reasonable rate of return for the Company's owners, while paying at least competitive salaries and benefits to employees. The Company hopes to have sufficient revenue from its adult use retail sales at the Proposed Adult Use Facility to cover both the ongoing expenses of opening and operating that facility, as well as the sunk costs it has already incurred for that facility (e.g. rent since 2018, renovation and fit out costs, professional fees, licensure and permit costs). Any profits will depend on the Company maintaining control over expenses while charging competitive prices. Many of the operating costs are outside the control of the Company, especially wholesale costs of cannabis and cannabis products which is a significant component of overall expenses. If wholesale prices increase dramatically in Massachusetts, the Company may not be able to pass all of that increase on to consumers, while consumers are likely to expect to see commensurate reductions in retail prices if wholesale prices drop in Massachusetts. The Company has existing arrangements with wholesale producers in Massachusetts for the supply of the existing medical dispensary in Acton and the Company has been satisfied with the quality, pricing and availability of supply from its existing wholesale suppliers. The Company therefore has reason to believe that it can obtain from those same wholesale producers the same quality product (although variety may expand) for the Proposed Adult Use Facility at competitive prices and needed quantities. However, a repeat of the vaping ban or other ban or mandated closures or other force majeure events would have significant adverse effects on the Company's financial condition (and those of its competitors) since many of the expenses of the Proposed Adult Use Facility are fixed costs. To date, the Company has managed to avoid layoffs due to economic or regulatory constraints.

Pandemic Based and Other Downturns. The Company anticipates that downturns in general economic and market conditions, such as the world is experiencing today in response to the pandemic, are likely to have a material adverse effect on the Proposed Adult Use Facility's business. Consumer desire for cannabis is expected to decline during such downturns or recessionary periods since cannabis is generally viewed as a discretionary item. The unprecedented spike in unemployment is expected to severely constrain consumer spending, at least for the short term. Fortunately, medical marijuana sales are still permitted and often continue (at least to some extent) in a downturn. The Company therefore views the cash flow from the Company's Existing Facilities to be a countercyclical cushion to interrupted or reduced sales at the Proposed Adult Use Facility.

Lease of Proposed Adult Use Facility. The Company has secured a lease for the proposed location of the Proposed Adult Use Facility in Maynard and has worked closely with the Town of Maynard for approvals for this location.

Source of Products; Quality. The Proposed Adult Use Facility does not have its own cultivation facility and therefore the Company must obtain cannabis and cannabis products from wholesale sellers for resale at the Proposed Adult Use Facility. The Company intends to offer consumers an appealing variety of cannabis and cannabis products, including edibles, and intends to update the menu of products as consumer preferences and tastes evolve. The Company intends for the Existing Facilities to be a source of cannabis and (to the extent produced by the Existing Facilities) cannabis products for sale at the Proposed Adult Use Facility. The Company believes that the cultivation facility at the Existing Facilities offer a superior and attractive variety of cannabis. If needed (as is expected), the Company intends to purchase for resale at the Proposed Adult Use Facility cannabis and cannabis products from reputable wholesale suppliers in Massachusetts in compliance with applicable Massachusetts laws and regulations. The Company has existing relationships with reputable wholesale suppliers in Massachusetts and believes it will be able to obtain sufficient quantities of high quality cannabis and cannabis products for the Proposed Adult Use Facility.

Testing. All cannabis and cannabis products sold at the Proposed Adult Use Facility will be tested and verified in accordance with applicable Massachusetts regulation by independent laboratories licensed as such by the Commission.

Maynard Approvals. The Company was the first cannabis company to approach the Town of Maynard to open an adult use retail facility and devoted months and countless hours of business and legal resources to negotiate a state of the art Host Community Agreement with Maynard. The Host Community Agreement between the Company and Maynard has been approved by Maynard and signed by both parties. In addition, the Company obtained a special zoning permit from the Town of Maynard allowing the operation of an adult-use cannabis retail facility at the proposed location. Extensive traffic studies were conducted and repeated by the Company at its expense to demonstrate the limited impact of the Proposed Adult Use Facility on parking and congestion in the applicable area of Maynard. The Company met several times with each of the Maynard Board of Health, Police Department and other Maynard town departments to answer questions, address concerns and provide all requested information. The Company also worked

with the Town of Maynard to develop their first ever planning board regulations, zoning bylaw, health regulations and security requirements for cannabis businesses in the town. The companies opening competing cannabis businesses in Maynard have utilized this work and effort by the Company without covering any of the costs.

Limited Market Data and Difficulty to Forecast. As a result of recent and ongoing regulatory and policy changes in the adult-use cannabis industry, the market data available is limited and often unreliable. Federal and State laws prevent widespread participation and hinder market research. Therefore, the Company will need to rely largely on its own data (when available) to forecast sales as detailed forecasts are not generally obtainable from other sources at this stage of the industry in Massachusetts. Market research and projections by the Company of estimated total sales, demographics, demand, and similar consumer research will, when available, be based on assumptions from limited and unreliable market data, and will represent only the current personal opinions of the Company's senior management team. The recent mandated closure of adult use retail facilities as well as other non essential businesses has made it much more challenging to develop projections.

Subject to the foregoing, the following are Mass Wellspring LLC's current projections¹ that are based on the assumption that the Proposed Adult Use Facility opens in the summer of 2020.

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MASS WELLSPRING LLC PLAN TO OBTAIN LIABILITY INSURANCE (April 2020)

Mass Wellspring LLC will comply with the insurance requirements of the Commission and will obtain general liability and product liability insurance coverage of no less than \$1 million per occurrence and \$2 million in the aggregate annually, with a deductible for each policy of no higher than \$5,000 per occurrence. Mass Wellspring LLC is working with insurance agents that work with Massachusetts cannabis companies to obtain such policies prior to opening the Proposed Adult Use Facility.

Separating Recreational from Medical Cannabis

Not applicable. Mass Wellspring- Maynard will only sell adult-use cannabis.

Personnel Policies/Background Checks

We have developed policies & best practices that meet or surpass industry benchmarks: Employee Handbook: All staff receives clear expectations for compliance with state, local, and federal laws; patient interaction; dispensary policies about being a drug-smoke-and alcohol-free workplace; reporting procedures; and what staff can expect from us in terms of benefits and ensuring a safe, healthy workplace.

Wages: FT Mgr \$60k-90k/Y, FT Non-Mgr \$30k-45k/Y, PT \$12-15/h.

Benefits: Group health insurance to comply with state employment laws, including Section 125 that lets staff buy health insurance with pre-tax dollars, paid vacation, dental & life insurance; 401k plans. Allowances are standard for Family Medical Leave, Jury Duty & Military Leave.

Advancement: Offered based on documented goals agreed upon between employees & managers; twice-yearly performance evaluations and skills development opportunities. Such factors underpin advancement & pay raise decisions.

All staff must complete Compliance & Training Programs, including compliance with 935 CMR 500 for operating procedures, confidentiality, inventory control, dispensing to qualified customers, proper handling & maintenance, security, incident reporting, HIPAA, discrimination, disabilities, sexual harassment, security and safety of employees and customers, employment rights, workplace violence, & confidentiality.

As per 935 CMR 500.105(d), Mass Wellspring will maintain Personnel records that include:

- 1. Job descriptions for each employee and volunteer position, as well as organizational charts consistent with the job descriptions;
- 2. A personnel record for each marijuana establishment agent. Such records shall be maintained for at least 12 months after termination of the individual's affiliation with the Marijuana Establishment and shall include, at a minimum, the following:
 - a. all materials submitted to the Commission pursuant to 935 CMR 500.030(2);
 - b. documentation of verification of references;
 - c. the job description or employment contract that includes duties, authority, responsibilities, qualifications, and supervision
 - d. documentation of all required training, including training regarding privacy and confidentiality requirements, and the signed statement of the individual indicating the date, time, and place he or she received said training and the topics discussed, including the name and title of presenters;
 - e. documentation of periodic performance evaluations;
 - f. a record of any disciplinary action taken; and
 - g. notice of completed responsible vendor and eight-hour related duty training.
- 3. A staffing plan that will demonstrate accessible business hours and safe cultivation conditions;
- 4. Personnel policies and procedures; and All background check reports obtained in accordance with 935 CMR 500.030.

Staff must pass a Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) check, and re-take annually. The reports must comply with the Commission's *Suitability Standard for Registration as a Marijuana Establishment Agent*:

- (1) 935 CMR 500.802 shall apply to marijuana establishment agents or applicants in their capacity as employees or volunteers for a Marijuana Establishment licensed pursuant to 935 CMR 500.100 and shall be used by the Marijuana Establishment executive registered with the Department of Criminal Justice Information Systems pursuant to 803 CMR 2.04: *iCORI Registration* and the Commission for purposes of determining suitability for registration as a marijuana establishment agent with the licensee.
- (2) For purposes of determining suitability based on background checks performed in accordance with 935 CMR 500.030(1):
- (a) all conditions, offenses, and violations are construed to include Massachusetts law or like or similar law(s) of another state, the United States or foreign jurisdiction, a military, territorial or Native American tribal authority, or any other jurisdiction.
- (b) all criminal disqualifying conditions, offenses, and violations include the crimes of attempt, accessory, conspiracy, and solicitation. Juvenile dispositions shall not be considered as a factor for determining suitability.
- (c) where applicable, all look back periods for criminal conditions, offenses, and violations included in 935 CMR 500.802: *Tables B* through *D* commence upon the date of disposition; provided, however, that if disposition results in incarceration in any institution, the look back period shall commence upon release from incarceration.
- (3) All suitability determinations will be made in accordance with the procedures set forth in 935 CMR 500.800. In addition to the requirements established in 935 CMR 500.800, the Suitability Review Committee shall:
- (a) consider whether offense(s) or information that would result in a Presumptive Negative Suitability Determination under 935 CMR 500.802: *Tables B* through *D* renders the subject unsuitable for registration regardless of the determination of the licensee; and
- (b) consider appeals of determinations of unsuitability based on claims of erroneous information received as part of the background check during the application process in accordance with 803 CMR 2.17: Requirement to Maintain a Secondary Dissemination Log and 2.18: Adverse Employment Decision Based on CORI or Other Types of Criminal History Information Received from a Source Other than the DCJIS.

Qualifications and Training

As per 935 CMR 500.105(2)(b), All Employees and Owners of Mass Wellspring shall attend a responsible vendor program to be designated a responsible vendor. All employee candidates must successfully complete a responsible vendor program within 90 days of hire and will repeat the course, yearly, to maintain "responsible vendor" status. Candidates are hired on a 3 month probationary status, at which time they will receive a development plan, an employee handbook (EHB), Commission regulations and be trained/evaluated for suitability. Mass Wellspring shall maintain records of responsible vendor training compliance for four years and make them available to the Commission upon request during normal business hours.

Quality Control and Testing (Revised April, 2020)

Cultivation/post-harvest areas will be maintained in clean, sanitary conditions and kept at constant temperature and humidity to ensure a healthful environment.

Personnel will wear protective gloves and hairnets while handling plants and products.

We will cure cannabis for four to six weeks, depending on the strains, to produce quality cannabis. Only OMRI certified organic 25b pesticides, or beneficial predator insects, will be used as preventatives, not for treatment of contaminated plants.

Plants in all life-stages and products will be subject to rigorous continual monitoring and inspection for signs of mold, disease, and pests. Pursuant to 935 CMR 500.002, we are contracted with an ISO 17025-accredited, third-party and independent lab (MCR Labs or CDX Labs) to test for, at minimum, cannabinoid profile, and contaminants, including mold, mildew, heavy metals, plant-growth regulators, and the presence of non-organic pesticides.

Testing will be conducted at a frequency determined by the Commission. Any plants found with mold or other contaminants will be guarantined and destroyed immediately.

The certified results of each test will be reported on all product labels pursuant to 935 CMR 500.105(5)(6) whether they fall below the Commission's established limits or not.

MIPs will be manufactured with certified (tested and approved) cannabis and labeled according to 935

MIPs will be manufactured with certified (tested and approved) cannabis and labeled according to 935 CMR 500. Mass Wellspring LLC will maintain the results of all testing for at least a year.

As per 935 CMR 500.160:

Testing of Marijuana and Marijuana Products:

- (1) No marijuana product, including marijuana, will be sold or otherwise marketed for adult use that is not capable of being tested by Independent Testing Laboratories, except as allowed under 935 CMR 500.000. Testing of marijuana products shall be performed by an Independent Testing Laboratory in compliance with the *Protocol for Sampling and Analysis of Finished Medical Marijuana Products and Marijuana-infused Products*, as amended in November, 2016, published by the DPH. Testing of environmental media (e.g., soils, solid growing media, and water) shall be performed in compliance with the *Protocol for Sampling and Analysis of Environmental Media for Massachusetts Registered Medical Marijuana Dispensaries* published by the DPH.
- (2) Mass Wellspring LLC shall have a written policy for responding to laboratory results that indicate contaminant levels are above acceptable limits established in the DPH protocols identified in 935 CMR 500.160(1). Any such policy shall include notifying the Commission within 72 hours of any laboratory testing results indicating that the contamination cannot be remediated and disposing of the production batch. The notification must be from both Mass Wellspring LLC and the Independent Testing Laboratory, separately and directly. The notification from Mass Wellspring LLC must describe a proposed plan of action for both the destruction of the contaminated product and the assessment of the source of contamination.
- (3) Mass Wellspring LLC shall maintain the results of all testing for no less than one year;
- (4) The sale of seeds is not subject to these testing provisions.
- (5) Clones are subject to these testing provisions, but are exempt from testing for metals.
- (6) All transportation of marijuana to and from Independent Testing Laboratories providing marijuana testing services shall comply with 935 CMR 500.105(13).

- (7) All storage of marijuana at a laboratory providing marijuana testing services shall comply with 935 CMR 500.105(11);
- (8) All excess marijuana will be disposed in compliance with 935 CMR 500.105(12), either by the Independent Testing Laboratory returning excess marijuana to the source Marijuana Establishment for disposal or by the Independent Testing Laboratory disposing of it directly; and
- (9) No marijuana product shall be sold or otherwise marketed for adult use that has not first been tested by an Independent Testing Laboratory and deemed to comply with the standards required under 935 CMR 500.160.
- (10) All agents of Mass Wellspring LLC at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard whose job includes contact with marijuana will be required to comply with the applicable requirements for food handlers specified in 105 CMR 300.000.
- (11) Hand-washing facilities will be located in production areas at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard and where good sanitary practices require employees to wash and sanitize their hands. 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (12) There will be sufficient space at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard for placement of equipment and storage of materials as is necessary for the maintenance of sanitary operations. 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (13) Litter and waste at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard will be properly removed so as to minimize the development of odor and the potential for the waste attracting and harboring pests. 935 CMR 500.105(12). 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (14) Floors, walls, and ceilings at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard will be constructed in such a manner that they may be adequately kept clean and in good repair. 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (15) All contact surface at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard will be maintained, cleaned, and sanitized as frequently as necessary to protect against contamination. 935 CMR 500.105(3).
- (16) All toxic items at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard will be identified, held, and stored in a manner that protects against contamination of marijuana. 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (17) Water supply for Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard will be sufficient for necessary operations. 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (18) Plumbing at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard will be of adequate size and design and maintained to carry sufficient quantities of water to required locations throughout the establishment. 935 CMR 500.105(3)
- (19) Mass Wellspring LLC will provide its employees at Mass Wellspring LLC Maynard with adequate, readily accessible toilet facilities. 935 CMR 500.105(3)

Record Keeping Procedures (Revised April 2020)

Mass Wellspring LLC will use BioTrackTHC, an industry-leading, HIPAA-compliant, cannabis software vendor, which will be tailored for seed-to-sale and patient sales. It has transparent accountability and tracks cultivation location, strain, inventory, patient data, sales activity and accounting. It generates timelines for inventory discrepancies. BioTrackTHC permits electronic and paper records. Paper records are secured in a locked filing cabinet and only authorized personnel have access to records.

Mass Wellspring LLC will maintain records in accordance with all sections of 935 CMR 500.105(9)

All documentation/records required are available for inspection by the Commission including operating procedures, inventory, seed-to-sale business, waste disposal, inventory & seed-to-sale for all marijuana/MIPs as required by the regulations.

Mass Wellspring LLC records shall be available for inspection by the Commission, upon request. Our records shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Written records that are required and are subject to inspection include, but are not necessarily limited to, all records required in any section of 935 CMR 500.000, in addition to the following:

- (a) Written operating procedures as required by 935 CMR 500.105(1);
- (b) Inventory records as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8);
- (c) Seed-to-sale tracking records for all marijuana products as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8)(e);
- (d) The following personnel records:
- 1. Job descriptions for each employee and volunteer position, as well as organizational charts consistent with the job descriptions;
- 2. A personnel record for each marijuana establishment agent. Such records shall be maintained for at least 12 months after termination of the individual's affiliation with the Marijuana Establishment and shall include, at a minimum, the following:
- a. all materials submitted to the Commission pursuant to 935 CMR 500.030(2);
- b. documentation of verification of references;
- c. the job description or employment contract that includes duties, authority, responsibilities, qualifications, and supervision
- d. documentation of all required training, including training regarding privacy and confidentiality requirements, and the signed statement of the individual indicating the date, time, and place he or she received said training and the topics discussed, including the name and title of presenters;
- e. documentation of periodic performance evaluations;
- f. a record of any disciplinary action taken; and
- g. notice of completed responsible vendor and eight-hour related duty training.
- 1. A staffing plan that will demonstrate accessible business hours and safe cultivation conditions;
- 2. Personnel policies and procedures; and
- 3. All background check reports obtained in accordance with 935 CMR 500.030.
- 4. Waste disposal records as required under 935 CMR 500.105(12); and
- 5. Following closure Mass Wellspring LLC, all records must be kept for at least two years at the expense of Mass Wellspring LLC and in a form and location acceptable to the Commission.
- 6. Shipping manifests are retained for 2 years.

The Marijuana Establishment will maintain waste records for at least three years. 935 CMR 500.105(12)

The Marijuana Establishment will maintain Seed-to-sale tracking records for all marijuana as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8)(e). 935 CMR 500.105(9)

The following business records will be maintained by Mass Wellspring LLC:

Assets and liabilities; Monetary transactions; Books of accounts; Sales records; and Salary and wages paid to each employee. 935 CMR 500.105(9

Maintaining of Financial Records (Revised April 2020)

As per 935 CMR 500.105(9)(e), Mass Wellspring LLC will maintain business records, which shall include manual or computerized records of:

Assets and liabilities;

Monetary transactions;

Books of accounts, which shall include journals, ledgers, and supporting documents, agreements, checks, invoices, and vouchers;

Sales records including the quantity, form, and cost of marijuana products; and Salary and wages paid to each employee, stipend paid to each board member, and any executive compensation, bonus, benefit, or item of value paid to any individual affiliated with a Marijuana Establishment, including members of the nonprofit corporation, if any.

Mass Wellspring LLC will not and is prohibited from utilizing software or other methods to manipulate or alter sales data. 935 CMR 500.140(6) (required for retail only)

Mass Wellspring LLC will conduct a monthly analysis of equipment at the Maynard adult use retail dispensary to determine that no software has been installed that could be utilized to manipulate or alter sales data a. 935 CMR 500.140(6)

Mass Wellspring LLC will maintain records that it has performed the monthly analysis required by 935 CMR 500.140(6)

If Mass Wellspring LLC determines that software or other methods have been installed/utilized to manipulate or alter sales data: it will immediately disclose the information to the Commission, cooperate in any investigation, and take such other action directed by the Commission. 935 CMR 500.140

Mass Wellspring LLC will comply with 830 CMR 62C.25.1: Record Retention and DOR Directive 16-1 regarding recordkeeping requirements. 935 CMR 500.140(6)

Mass Wellspring LLC will adopt separate accounting practices at the point-of-sale for marijuana and non-marijuana sales. 935 CMR 500.140(6)

Mass Wellspring LLC, if co-located, will maintain and provide to the Commission on a biannual basis accurate sales data during the six months immediately preceding its application for the purpose of ensuring an adequate supply of marijuana and marijuana products under 935 CMR 500.140(10). 935 CMR 500.140(6)

Restricting Access (Revised April, 2020)

As per 935 CMR 500.110 (1) (a), no person under twenty-one years of age shall be admitted into the Maynard adult use retail dispensary.

No person shall be allowed entry to Mass Wellspring LLC -Maynard without one of the following:

- A. Valid driver's license
- B. Valid I.D. card
- C. Valid passport

All forms of identification must contain a photo and date of birth.

Employees will undergo training to identify valid and forged or false identification documentation to ensure no person under21 years of age can enter. Mass Wellspring LLC employees will notify the Maynard Police Department should we encounter issues of forged documentation or false identification.

All forms of identification will be checked at the door of the Maynard adult use retail dispensary. Upon entry into the premises of Mass Wellspring LLC-Maynard by an individual, a registered agent shall immediately inspect the individual's proof of identification and determine the individual's age. An individual shall not be admitted to the premises unless the retailer has verified that the individual is 21 years of age or older by an individual's proof of identification. Mass Wellspring LLC shall comply with additional operational requirements as stated in 935 CMR 500.140.

In addition, as required by 935 CMR 500.029 or 500.030, all employees and registered agents of Mass Wellspring LLC will be 21 years of age or older.

Diversity Plan (Revised June 2020)

1. Introduction. Mass Wellspring LLC recognizes that there is not sufficient equity among minorities, women, veterans, and people who identify as LGBTQ+.

2. Individuals Within Commission Designated Demographics.

In compliance with requirements of the Commission, this Plan is intended and designed to promote equity among the following four demographics:

- 1. Minorities;
- 2. Women;

Individuals within these 4 demographics are defined in this Plan as "**Plan Demographics**". This Plan is not intended to apply to or benefit any other demographics.

3. Plan For Promoting Equity Among Plan Demographics.

A. Goal for Promoting Equity Among Plan Demographics.

1. Mass Wellspring LLC has a goal of having at least 15% of new hires consist of individuals within the Plan Demographics, with an intent to target (i) minorities for 33 1/3% of this goal, (ii) women for 33 1/3% of this goal, (iii) veterans for 6 11% of this goal, , and (iv) people who identify as LGBTQ+ for 22 1/3% of this goal.

B. Programs for Promoting Equity Among Plan Demographics.

The specific detailed actions, activities and processes that will be utilized or implemented by Mass Wellspring LLC to achieve the goals outlined above are as follows (numbers correspond to numbered goals above):

1. Hiring:

- a. In new hires, Mass Wellspring LLC will give priority to individuals within the Plan Demographics who are qualified for the applicable positions, all to the extent permitted by applicable law.
- b. Mass Wellspring LLC will advertise any available employment opportunities at least monthly in The Rainbow Times or another publication targeting LGBTQ+ persons.
 - i. Mass Wellspring LLC will post any available employment opportunities at least quarterly in The Edith Nourse Rogers Memorial Veterans Hospital in Bedford, MA or another facility or center focused onveterans.

C. Measurements to Assess Progress and Success of Diversity Plan.

The specific metrics (both qualitative and quantitative) that will be implemented by Mass Wellspring LLC to assess and demonstrate the progress and success of this program are as follows (numbers correspond to numbered goals above):

1. This goal will be measured quarterly (and at the one year anniversary of date of grant of the adult-use retail license and upon each renewal of the final adult-use retail license) by Mass Wellspring LLC counting how many new hires by Mass Wellspring LLC (as a percentage of total new hires) consisted of individuals within the Plan Demographics.

4. Required Affirmative Statements.

- A. The Applicant Mass Wellspring LLC acknowledges and is aware, and will adhere to, the requirements set forth in 935 CMR 500.105(4), which provides the permitted and prohibited advertising, branding, marketing, and sponsorship practices of every Marijuana Establishment.
- B. Any actions taken, or programs instituted, by the Applicant Mass Wellspring LLC will not violate the Commission's regulations with respect to limitations on ownership or control or other applicable state laws.
