- 9. The Commission sent a municipal notice with a copy of the application to the municipality on April 15, 2021. The Commission did not receive a response within 60 days pursuant to 935 CMR 500.102(1)(d).

- 12. There were no concerns arising from background checks on the individuals or entities associated with the application.



RECOMMENDATION

Commission staff recommend provisional licensure with the following conditions:

- 1. Final license is subject to inspection to ascertain compliance with Commission regulations.
- 2. Final license is subject to inspection to ascertain compliance with applicable state laws, local codes, ordinances or bylaws, and local licensing requirements.
- 3. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, with a detailed list of all proposed products to be produced with specific information as to types, forms, shapes, colors, and flavors.
- 4. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, an updated Diversity Plan that identifies any hiring goals for veterans, individuals with disabilities and LGBTQ residents.
- 5. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, an updated Plan to Positively Impact Disproportionately Harmed People that includes a hiring strategy for residents of Fitchburg.
- 6. Final licensure is subject to the applicant ensuring that all remaining required individuals be fingerprinted pursuant to previous Commission notifications.
- 7. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, an amended Diversity Plan that includes more than just hiring and that it "promotes and encourages full participation in the regulated cannabis industry by individuals from communities disproportionately harmed by cannabis prohibition and enforcement and to positively impact those communities under M.G.L. c. 94G, § 4 in Massachusetts."
- 8. The applicant shall cooperate with and provide information to Commission staff.
- 9. Provisional licensure is subject to the payment of the appropriate license fee.

The applicant has demonstrated compliance with the laws and regulations of the Commonwealth and suitability for licensure. Therefore, the applicant is recommended for provisional licensure.
