- 7. The applicant and municipality executed a Host Community Agreement on January 25, 2022.
- 8. The applicant conducted a community outreach meeting on December 29, 2021 and provided documentation demonstrating compliance with Commission regulations.
- 9. The Commission received a municipal response from the City/Town of Boston on August 23, 2022 stating the applicant was in compliance with all local ordinances or bylaws.
- 10. The applicant proposed the following goals for its Plan to Positively Impact Disproportionately Harmed People:

2	Donate at least \$15,000, annually to CultivatED and the Big Hope Project.
3	Host quarterly expungement clinics with a goal of expunging at least ten (10)
	records.

- 4. Provisional licensure is subject to the payment of the appropriate license fee.
