- 8. The applicant conducted a community outreach meeting on December 17, 2020 and provided documentation demonstrating compliance with Commission regulations.
- 9. The Commission received a municipal response from the municipality on July 15, 2021 for its cultivation operations and July 16, 2021 for its product manufacturing operations stating the applicant was in compliance with all local ordinances or bylaws.

RECOMMENDATION

Commission staff recommend provisional licensure with the following conditions:

- 1. Final license is subject to inspection to ascertain compliance with Commission regulations.
- 2. Final license is subject to inspection to ascertain compliance with applicable state laws, local codes, ordinances or bylaws, and local licensing requirements.
- 3. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, with a detailed list of all proposed products to be produced with specific information as to types, forms, shapes, colors, and flavors.
- 4. The applicant shall cooperate with and provide information to Commission staff.
- 5. Provisional licensure is subject to the payment of the appropriate license fee.
- 6. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, clarification as to Plan to Positively Impact Disproportionately Harmed People focusing on Springfield, considering the proposed operation is in the Commission-recognized Disproportionately Impacted community of Holyoke.
- 7. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, their anticipated spending goals regarding "sourcing contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers" within the LGBTQ+ and Disabled Citizen-owned certified businesses.
- 8. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff, upon inspection, an updated Diversity Plan to include information for job postings which include veterans' publications jobsites and other veteran outreach strategies when advertising employment opportunities.

The applicant has demonstrated compliance with the laws and regulations of the Commonwealth and suitability for licensure. Therefore, the applicant is recommended for provisional licensure.
