- Applicant's priority status:

General Applicant

- The applicant and municipality executed a Host Community Agreement on May 10, 2021.
- The applicant conducted a community outreach meeting on April 22, 2021 and provided documentation demonstrating compliance with Commission regulations.
- The Commission received a municipal response from the City/Town of Dartmouth on August 4, 2022 stating the applicant was in compliance with all local ordinances or bylaws.
- The applicant proposed the following goals for its Plan to Positively Impact Disproportionately Harmed People:

#	Goal
1	Recruit 25% of staff that are past or present residents of its designated areas of disproportionate impact, specifically Fall River, New Bedford, Taunton, and Wareham or residents with past cannabis related drug offenses.
2	Host four (4) educational seminars and workshops to include resume writing and interview skills training, annually.
3	Implement a quarterly charitable giving program to raise funds to be donated to organizations/charities that provide services to past or present residents of areas of disproportionate impact specifically Fall River, New Bedford, Taunton, and Wareham or residents with past cannabis related drug offenses.

The applicant plans to obtain marijuana from its affiliated licenses. If the need arises, the applicant will obtain marijuana or marijuana products by contracting with other licensed establishments.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Commission staff recommend provisional licensure with the following conditions:

1. Final license is subject to inspection to ascertain compliance with Commission regulations.
2. Final license is subject to inspection to ascertain compliance with applicable state laws, local codes, ordinances or bylaws, and local licensing requirements.
3. The applicant shall cooperate with and provide information to Commission staff.
4. Provisional licensure is subject to the payment of the appropriate license fee.
5. Prior to final licensure, in accordance with 935 CMR.140 (6) (a-j) please provide the commission with a copy of your consumer education. To ensure compliance, consumer educational materials shall include subsections; a – j, as listed in said regulation and must also include the phone number for the Massachusetts Substance Use Helpline.



The applicant has demonstrated compliance with the laws and regulations of the Commonwealth and suitability for licensure. Therefore, the applicant is recommended for provisional licensure.
