Minutes:

- 1) Call to Order



- The Chairman recognized a quorum and called the meeting to order.
- The Chairman gave notice that the meeting is being recorded.

2) Chairman's Comments and Updates

- The Chairman thanked staff for the quick turn around on preparing for this meeting, even with the close proximity for the last meeting.
- The Chairman also thanked the Joint Committee on Cannabis Policy for reporting out bills that address Commission concerns.
- The Chairman also commented on the energy and environmental regulations and full compliance with these regulations that will allow the Commission and the industry to be a greener sector. The Chairman thanked staff and former Commissioner Doyle for their work establishing those provisions and ensuring compliance.
- Commissioner Camargo thanked the Chairman for his comments. Commissioner Camargo echoed the sentiments with respect to the work of the Joint Committee on Cannabis Policy and other legislators. Commissioner Camargo recognized Black History Month, a way to recognize the achievements and contributions of Black Americans and to reflect on the work that needs to be done to break down the challenges that still face Black people. Commissioner Camargo thanked staff for their work preparing for the meeting.
- Commissioner Concepcion thanked Commissioner Camargo for her remarks regarding Black History Month. Commissioner Concepcion said that it meant a lot as the first, and hopeful not last, African-American Commissioner. Commissioner Concepcion said that she wants to recognize the progress made and the progress yet to be made. Commissioner Concepcion also recognized staff and the legislature for all that has been accomplished since the very recent January meeting. Commissioner Concepcion also thanked staff for their work ensuring compliance with security requirements.
- Commissioner Roy thanked her fellow Commissioners and the staff for their work. Commissioner Roy also recognized that for the first time excise tax on marijuana exceeded that for alcohol, perhaps suggesting that folks are leaving the legacy market. Commissioner Roy also thanked her fellow Commissioners for the robust discussion at last month's meeting regarding a policy statement. Commissioner Roy noted that she is wearing red in honor of Women's Heart Health Month and Valentines Day, sending love to all staff.
- Commissioner Stebbins thanked staff for the effort taken with respect to preparing for meetings, but also for how they used the extra time in December, when there was no meeting, to advance other projects that they might not otherwise have time for.
- The Chairman gave an overview of the agenda.

3) Minutes for Approval – 00:12:41

- January 20, 2021
 - The Chairman asked if the Commissioners had a chance to review the minutes and whether there were questions or edits.



- Commissioner Roy asked to correct the vote for adjournment to reflect the Chairman’s vote as yes.
- Commissioner Stebbins moved to approve the minutes of the January 20, 2022, subject to the amendment requested by Commissioner Roy.
- Commissioner Roy seconded the motion.
- The Chairman took a roll call vote:

- The Commission unanimously approved the minutes for the public meeting on January 20, 2022, subject to the amendment requested by Commissioner Roy.

4) Executive Director’s Report – 00:15:21

- The Executive Director gave an overview of licensing data, starting on page 164 of the [Meeting Packet](#).
- The Chairman asked with respect to Research Licenses and whether there’s any movement or interest.
 - The Executive Director noted that the Commission has not seen as much progress that it would like to see. The Executive Director noted that other licensees can do Research and Development under their existing license type, so may not be interested in the license type. The Executive Director also noted that the two step process of licensing for the Research Facility may deter folks from applying for that license type.
- Commissioner Camargo asked for clarification around a Marijuana Transporter with Other Existing Marijuana Establishment License and what that authorizes the licensee to do.
 - The Executive Director noted that such a status would allow a licensee to act as a distributor.
- Commissioner Roy asked whether Precertification applies to all license types and if so, how does the Commission make people aware of it.
 - The Executive Director said that it is only available for delivery license types and eventually social consumption. The precertification was designed to address the barriers of entry that Economic Empowerment Applicants and Social Equity Program participants, specifically access to capital and real estate.
 - Commissioner Roy clarified that it should not be confused with expedited review and can be obtained prior to obtaining a Host Community Agreement.
 - The Executive Director confirmed both.
- The Chairman said that it is heartening to see the concentration of cultivation at lower tier, suggesting access to the market by small farmers.



- The Executive Director gave an update with respect to the report regarding Area's of Disproportionate Impact noting that there is a public comment period on the report, which is open through March 4, 2022.
 - Commissioner Roy commented that discussion being had on this topic are really meaningful and highlighted that in addition to ensuring proper communities are designated as Areas of Disproportionate Impact, but also what the Commission can do for Areas of Disproportionate Impact.
- The Executive Director gave an update on the budgeting, comparing the Commission's request and House Bill 2 in its current form and highlighting the revenue generated by the Commission and cannabis industry.
 - The Chairman commented that there is a long way to go before budgets are final and there is opportunity to advocate for the Commission's full request. The Chairman also thanked the legislature for funding the Commission over the past four years, largely at the request amount.
 - Commissioner Camargo asked how the legislature reports out the use of funds raised through the sale of cannabis and revenue generated by the Commission.
 - The Executive Director note that there is a "revenue note" in budgets to say where the money is coming from. It would require someone to trace those notes through various appropriations. It would require someone to comb through the budgets.
 - Commissioner Roy asked whether the tax revenue figures shared included the local tax option.
 - The Executive Director said it did not.
 - Commissioner Roy noted that that is even more revenue generated for local communities.
- The Executive Director gave a hiring update including for Associate Enforcement Counsel, Constituent Services manager, Budget Director, Manger of Government Affairs and Policy, Project Coordinator for Equity Programming and Community Outreach, and Multimedia Content Producer.
- The Chairman thanked the Executive Director for the report.

5) Staff Recommendations on Changes of Ownership – 00:50:28

- Commissioner Roy requested a condition to apply to all applications, noting the significant changes of ownership which raises question of whether the Positive Impact Plan is changing, and it would be helpful to know sooner rather than later.
 - Proposed condition: To help ensure compliance with 500.104(5), 501.104(5), it is required that an update be provided to the Commission within 5 days of any changes, modifications, or implementation issues by new ownership of prior ownerships' Commission approved Diversity Plan and/or Positive Impact Plan, including but not limited to goals, programs, measurements, and accountability.
- Commissioner Concepcion asked whether this was a similar to the condition from last month.



- Commissioner Roy said it was, but that it properly references 935 CMR 104(5).
- Commissioner Camargo thanked Commissioner Roy for her attention to Changes of Ownership.

Massachusetts State House Update

Hearings

Legislative committees were required to report out all legislation by February 2, 2022 for the 2021-2022 General Court. The Joint Committee on Cannabis Policy reported out 56 bills: five favorable and the rest either accompanied a favorable report or were sent to study. Bills that are sent to study effectively conclude them for the remainder of the session.

Legislative Meetings

Commissioners Nurys Camargo, Bruce Stebbins, and Senator Julian Cyr participated in a tour and roundtable discussion with Marijuana Establishments on Cape Cod.

Chairman Steven Hoffman, Executive Director Collins, and Commission staff met with House Ways and Means Chairman Aaron Michlewitz to discuss the Commission's FY 2023 budget request.

Outreach – Commission Recommendations

Commissioners Nurys Camargo, Ava Concepcion, and Government Affairs staff held meetings with the Office of the Speaker, House Ways and Means Chairman Aaron Michlewitz, and Rep. Daniel Hunt regarding the Commission's endorsement of a social equity fund and as a general update on the Commission's Legislative and Executive Branch outreach policy. This advocacy is one of the outreach activities undertaken in response to the Commission's November public meeting vote.

Chairman Steven Hoffman, Executive Director Shawn Collins, and Commission staff met with Senate Ways and Means Chairman Michael Rodrigues to discuss the Commission's endorsement of a social equity fund, social consumption policy statement, host community agreement recommendations, and to offer a general update on the Commission's work.

Chairman Steven Hoffman and Government Affairs staff met with Senator Julian Cyr to discuss the Commission's endorsement of a technical amendment to state law regarding social consumption licensing. This advocacy is one of the outreach activities undertaken in response to the Commission's November public meeting vote.

Hinsdale: *Approved, with comments.* The Town has updated a number of definitions regarding license types.

Uxbridge: *Approved.* The Town has updated warrant articles regarding the zoning of commercial marijuana operations.

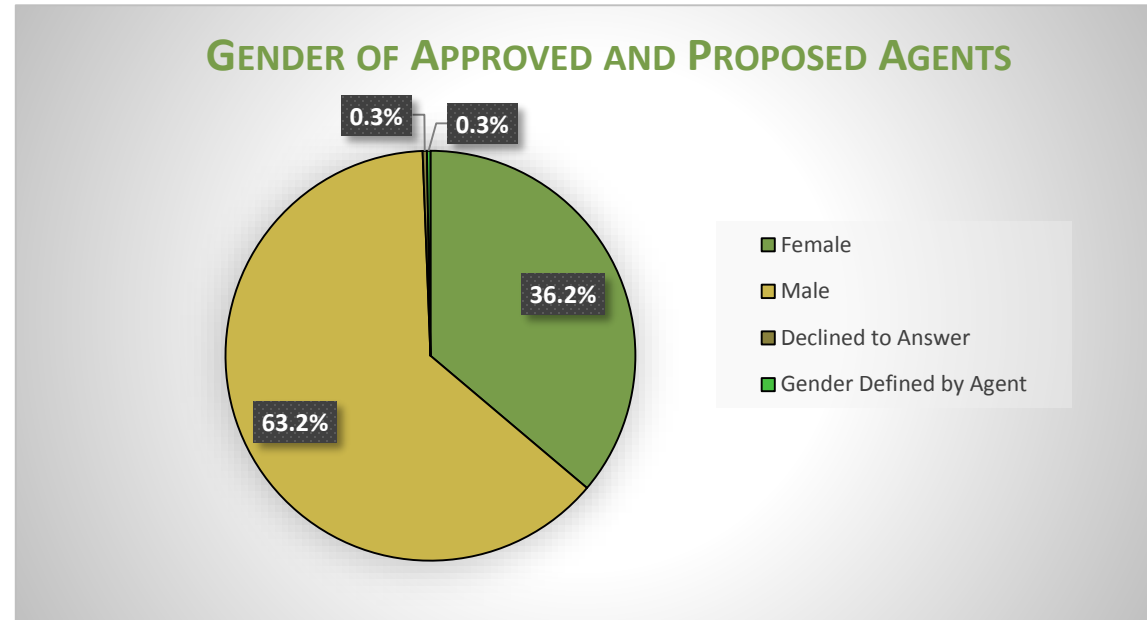

Demographics of Approved and Pending Marijuana Establishment Agents

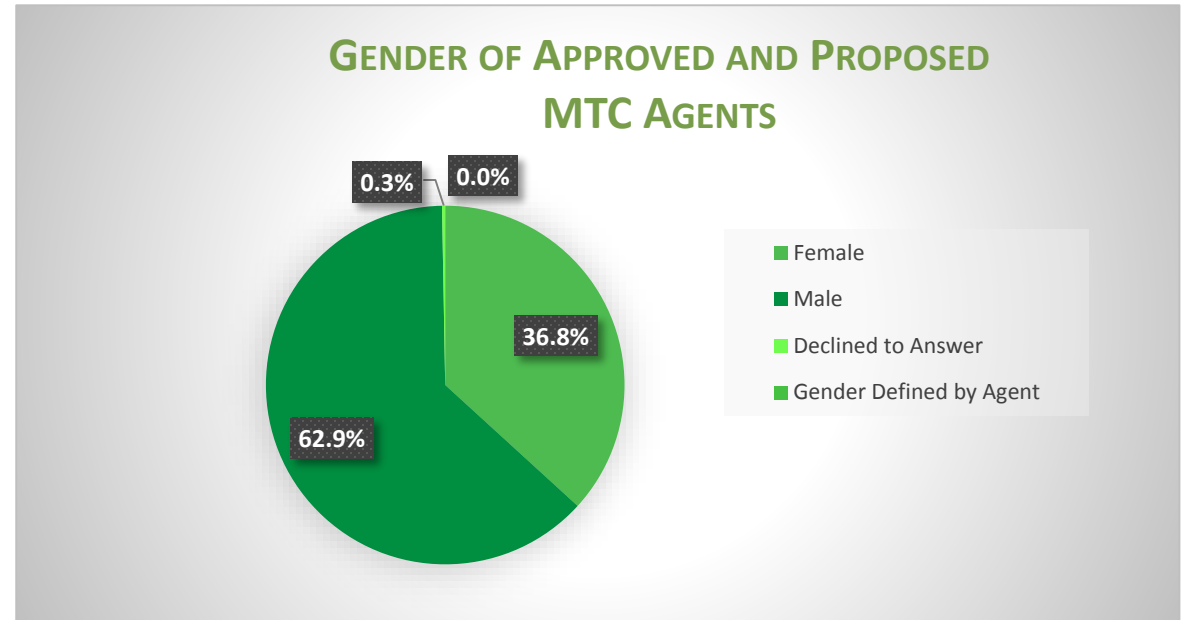

Demographics of Approved and Pending Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Agents

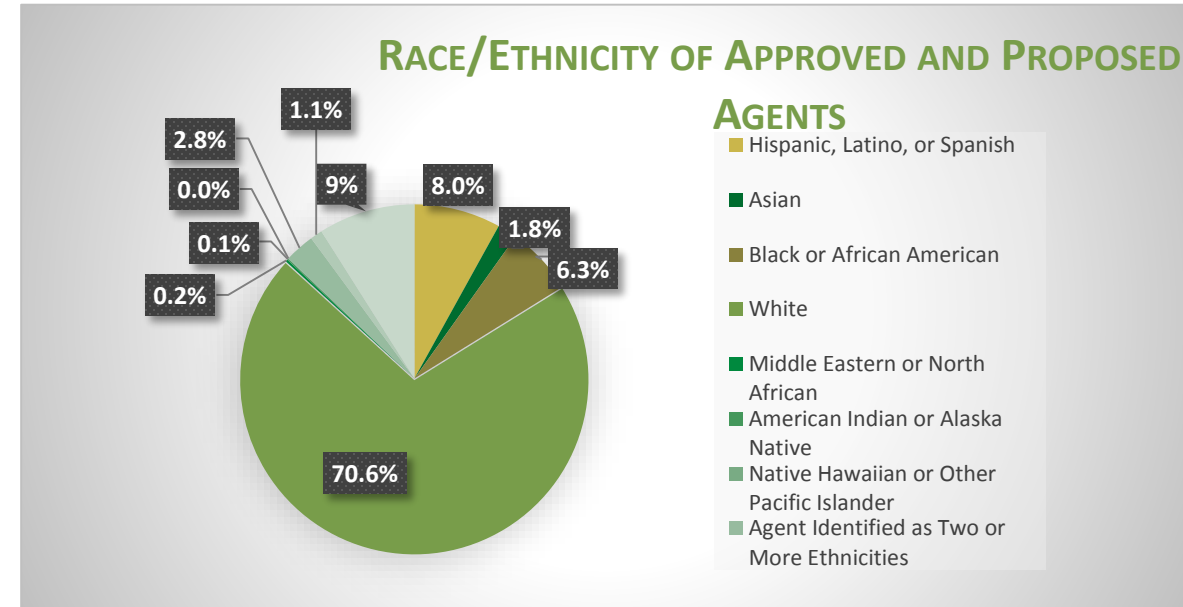

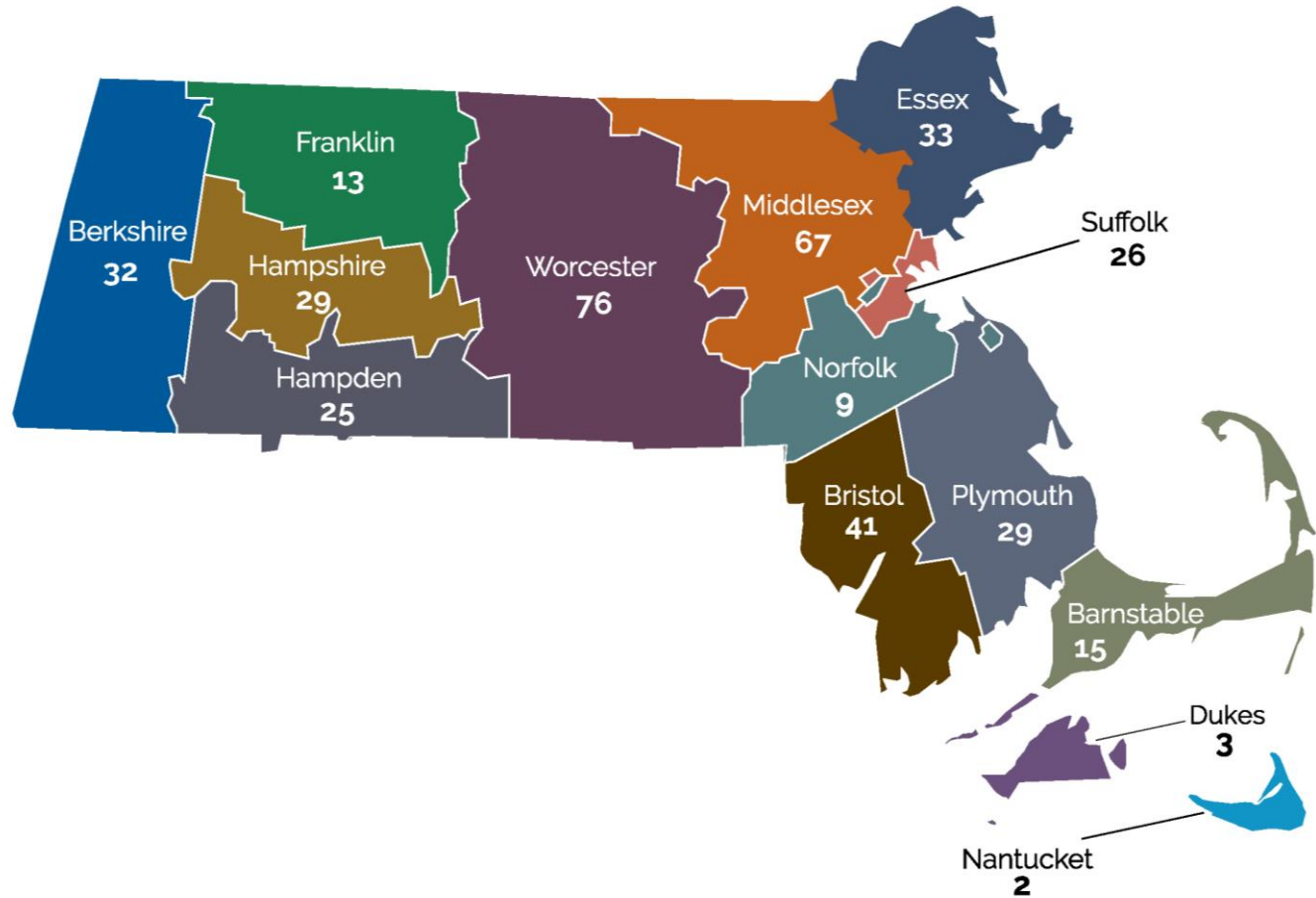
