I. Summary


This Business Plan is for the operation of Tree Beard, Inc., as a future licensed recreational marijuana establishment for cannabis cultivation, manufacture, retail sale, and transportation upon the issuance of the appropriate licenses from the Cannabis Control Commission (CCC). This plan summarizes our best practices to minimize any potential harms associated with this business as well as maximize potential benefits for the New Bedford community. Through our economic empowerment and social responsibility initiatives we plan to rejuvenate our city that has been so harshly affected by the disproportionate impact of the criminalization of cannabis.

Tree Beard, Inc., comprises of executive officers, board members and close affiliates with particularized skills including extensive knowledge of the local New Bedford area and cannabis industry, legal compliance, real estate investment, insurance, finance, medical, marketing, cannabis cultivation and manufacturing, construction, information technology, retail sales, and existing client relations and networks. Tree Beard intends to initially obtain one of each available license to allow for vertical integration of products from seed to sale in one location. Utilizing one location for the first set of licenses will allow us to be the first to market in our area, maximize profits from selling our own products, and minimize risks associated with transporting products between the license types.

As a certified economic licensee, we intend to prioritize our progressive company policies, community improvements, and employee base of New Bedford residents. Tree Beard intends to lead the state as a shining example of corporate responsibility through our diverse hiring practices and allocating 3% of our gross funds to the City of New Bedford and 1.5% for local programs that deliver substance abuse prevention and education in the City's elementary and secondary school. We believe in correcting the social economic in-justice through the opportunity of providing quality local grown cannabis. Tree Beard is potentially going to be the first locally owned vertically integrated cannabis establishment in a distressed gateway city.

II. Site Control: 1 Nauset Street, New Bedford, Massachusetts









Tree Beard currently has site control over one of the few parcels in the City of New Bedford that meets their zoning ordinance. Phase one is obtaining licensing and permitting for the first set of licenses to perform complete vertical integration of cannabis cultivation, manufacture, transportation, and retail sale of cannabis at 1 Nauset Street, New Bedford, Massachusetts. Phase one vertical integration is required for brand viability in an unprecedented market in Massachusetts with a narrow selection of available properties. Phase one allows for a self-sustaining, efficient, safe, and economic start of the company. 1 Nauset Street is an existing car dealership consisting of 8,901 square feet on a .82 acre lot zoned for industrial use in compliance with the City's Zoning Ordinance for a Marijuana Establishment. Nauset Street is highly desirable because of its zoning compliance, spacious existing showroom and garage, large parking lot for customers and employees, two electric vehicle charging stations, and close proximity to transportation nodes including the Mt. Pleasant/Nauset Street Bus Stop (SRTA), Route 140, and Interstate I95. Tree Beard, Inc., will be the first recreational dispensary in New Bedford and will be a model of how cannabis can properly fit into society while adding societal benefit and minimizing the dangers associated with the industry.

III. Group of Companies





Tree Beard's cultivation, manufacture, and retail license will be under the trade name **Old Soul Gardens**. Old Soul Gardens is an award winning independent craft cannabis company discreetly styled to provide secure and safe access to only the highest quality cannabis flower from our very own proprietary strains and the highest quality hand-crafted cannabis products including flower, kief, hash, concentrates, edible infusions, custom handrolls, oils and topicals. OSG will be the premier craft cannabis company known for its "never settle approach in crafting high-quality products and promoting a remarkably distinct "lifted life®" for our clients." Our mantra establishes our commitment to providing our clients with the highest quality of cannabis products to attain wellness on all levels they may seek. Old Soul Gardens will strive to grow and manufacture cannabis products of the highest quality to then be dispensed at several of our own uniquely branded retail stores and possibly wholesale to third party retail establishments. Tree Beard intends to capture the broadest market of individuals by creating distinct retail establishments to appeal to everyone's unique interests. Old Soul Gardens' craft vibe will attract the existing recreational cannabis consumer, cannabis connoisseurs seeking high-quality hand-crafted products, and a new market of potential cannabis consumers interested in the offering of OSG as a new "modern classic."

IV. Executives:

The transportation license is operated by Daphney Williams and Leona Leaver who are taking their expertize from owning two successful medical transportation services in Massachusetts and Rhode Island with twelve vehicles per business and transitioning into the cannabis industry. Daphney Williams's parents came to this country from Haiti when she was 9. She learned a deep respect for the need of safety from her father who was in the security industry. This mindset allowed her to create, New Generation Transportation as well as qualify for the "Women-Owned Small Business Federal Contract Program." As a board member of the RI Non-emergency Medical Transportation Association, she has fought for the elderly population at the

state level. Her goal has always been to ensure quality service from experienced, qualified, and properly trained drivers. Her existing transportation company already implements security and safety protocols for elderly patients. Daphney's other passion is serving on the board of the Wickford SDA Church as well as helping young children in the Pathfinder program.

Leona Leaver, Managing Director, has successfully owned LL Medical Transportation for the past 4 years with one of the highest customer service ratings. Leona has assisted the community with her work at the Humane Society rescuing kittens and pets. Leona was severely injured as a pedestrian in an automobile accident resulting in a spinal cord injury. After being forced to take disability benefits she thought working again, never mind owning a business, was out of reach. After a long recovery, she took the very little money she had and 30 yrs. of knowledge in paratransit to start her own transportation business. Leona's perseverance and rigid work ethic allowed her to return to the work force and she is now flourishing.

The Tree Beard Group of Companies consists of six original officers and owners. Jeffrey Pepi is the original founder of the Tree Beard concept of companies. Jeffrey Pepi has successfully owned an insurance company since 1998. Jeff diversified his company to specialize in health insurance under a new company, Health Plan Solutions, which assisted businesses staying legally compliant with Massachusetts' Fair Share Contributions. The company evolved to assist patients navigate the arduous task of completing Mass Health & Connector Care enrollments. Tree Beard was realized when medical marijuana became legal in Massachusetts and Jeff saw an opportunity to continue his passion for helping people.

Joshua R. Craig is the founder of the Old Soul Gardens brand and is a master cannabis cultivator. Joshua has over ten years' experience with cultivation of cannabis including lead-management of large-scale operations out-of-state and strain development. Joshua's hand-crafted techniques and attention to detail creates a premium cannabis product fitting of the OSG "never settle" mantra. Joshua is recognized by his peers as an artisanal cultivator and has received top placement in awards for concentrate and flower.

Marijuana Retailer: means an entity licensed to purchase and transport cannabis or marijuana product from Marijuana Establishments and to sell or otherwise transfer this product to Marijuana Establishments and to consumers. Retailers are prohibited from delivering cannabis or marijuana products to consumers; and from offering cannabis or marijuana products for the purposes of on-site social consumption on the premises of a Marijuana Establishment.

Marijuana Transporter: an entity, not otherwise licensed by the Cannabis Control Commission, that is licensed to purchase, obtain, and possess cannabis or marijuana product solely for the purpose of transporting, temporary storage, sale and distribution to Marijuana Establishments, but not to consumers. Marijuana Transporters may be an Existing Licensee Transporter or Third Party Transporter.

Medical Marijuana Treatment Center, also known as a Registered Marijuana Dispensary (MMTC): means an entity registered under 105 CMR 725.100 that acquires, cultivates, possesses, processes (including development of related products such as edible cannabis or marijuana products, tinctures, aerosols, oils, or ointments), transfers, transports, sells, distributes, dispenses, or administers marijuana, products containing cannabis or marijuana, related supplies, or educational materials to registered qualifying patients or their personal caregivers for medical use.

Substance abuse treatment facility: a facility that provides substance abuse treatment programs, as that term is defined in 105 CMR 164.006, licensed by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

4130B. General.

4131B. Location Requirements and Restrictions.

- Marijuana Establishments and Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers shall only be located in Industrial Districts A (IA), B (IB), and C (IC).
- (ii) No Marijuana Establishment or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center shall be located within:
 - (a) 500 feet of any public or private school providing education in kindergarten or any of grades 1 through 12, licensed daycare center, nursery school, preschool, building operated as part of the campus of any private or public institution of higher learning, playground, park, public library, church, excluding chapels located within a cemetery, substance abuse treatment facility, Marijuana Establishment, or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center; or

(b) 200 feet of any dwelling or dwelling unit.

The distance under this provision shall be measured in a straight line from the nearest point of the property line in question to the nearest point of the property line where the Marijuana Establishment or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center will be located.

- (iii) No Marijuana Establishment or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center shall be located inside a dwelling or building containing a dwelling unit or inside any building containing transient housing, including a hotel, motel, or dormitory.
- (iv) Marijuana Establishments shall satisfy the conditions and requirements of all other applicable sections of the Zoning Ordinance, including but not limited to dimensional and parking requirements.

4132B. Physical Requirements and Restrictions.

- (i) All Marijuana Establishments and Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers shall be contained within a building or structure. All operations of a Marijuana Establishment or a Medical Marijuana Treatment Center must take place at a fixed location within a fully enclosed secured building and shall not be visible from the exterior of the building.
- (ii) Except for a Marijuana Transporter, no Marijuana Establishment or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center may be located in a trailer, storage freight container, motor vehicle, or other similar movable enclosure.
- (iii) No Marijuana Retailer or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center that dispenses marijuana or marijuana products to the public shall have a total gross floor area of more than 5,000 square feet.

4133B. Operational Requirements and Restrictions.

- (i) The hours of operation shall be set by the special permit granting authority, but in no event shall a Marijuana Establishment or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center that dispenses marijuana or marijuana products to the public be open to the public between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m., Monday through Sunday.
- (ii) No drive-through service shall be permitted at a Marijuana Establishment or Medical Marijuana Treatment Center.

CORPORATE BYLAWS OF TREE BEARD INCORPORATED

ARTICLE 1. OFFICES OF THE CORPORATION.

Section 1. Principal Office. The principal office of the corporation and other offices of the corporation shall be at the locations, within or without the corporation's state of incorporation (the "State"), as the directors may specify from time to time. The secretary of this corporation will keep a copy of the corporation's Articles of Incorporation (or similar incorporating document), these bylaws, minutes of directors' and shareholders' meetings, stock certificates and stubs, a register of the names and interests of the corporation's shareholders, and other corporate records and documents at the principal office.

Section 2. Registered Agent. For receipt of official legal and tax correspondence from the State of Incorporation, the registered agent of the corporation (sometimes known as a resident agent, statutory agent, agent for service of process, or delivery of service address) shall be maintained in accordance with the requirements of the State of Incorporation.

ARTICLE 2. SHAREHOLDER'S MEETINGS.

Section 1. Annual meeting. The annual meeting of shareholders shall be held in the month following the end of each fiscal year of the corporation on any day of that month as determined by the board of directors.

Section 2. Special meetings. Special meetings of the shareholders for any purpose or purposes permitted by law may be called by the president of the corporation or by the board of directors. Such meetings shall also be called by the president at the request of the holders of not less than one tenth of the outstanding shares of the corporation entitled to vote at the meeting.

Section 3. Location. Meetings of the shareholders may be held at any location, within or without the State, designated by the board of directors or, in the absence of a designation by the board of directors, by the person or persons who call such meeting. If no designation is made, the meeting shall be held at the principal office of the corporation.

Section 4. Notice. Notices of meetings, annual or special, must be given in writing to shareholders entitled to vote at the meeting by the secretary or an assistant secretary or, if there is no such officer, by any director or shareholder.

Notices of shareholders' meetings must be given either personally or by first-class mail or other means of written communication, addressed to the shareholder at the address of the shareholder appearing on the stock register of the corporation or given by the shareholder to the corporation for the purpose of notice. Notice of a shareholders' meeting must be given to each shareholder no less than two weeks prior to the meeting.

This notice will state the place, date, and hour of the meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted. The notice of an annual meeting and any special meeting at which directors are to be elected will include the names of the nominees that, at the time of the notice, the board of directors intends to present for election.

Section 5. Waiver of Notice. Any shareholder may waive notice of any meeting before or after the meeting. Such waiver must be in writing signed by the shareholder and delivered to the secretary of the corporation for inclusion in the minutes of the meeting.

Section 6. Quorum and voting. Every shareholder entitled to vote is entitled to one vote for each share held, except as otherwise provided by law. A shareholder entitled to vote may vote part of his or her shares in favor of a proposal and refrain from voting the remaining shares or vote them against the proposal. If a shareholder fails to specify the number of shares he or she is affirmatively voting, it will be conclusively presumed that the shareholder's approving vote is with respect to all shares the shareholder is entitled to vote.

Except as otherwise required by applicable law, a majority of the outstanding shares of the corporation entitled to vote, represented in person or by proxy, shall constitute a quorum at a meeting of the shareholders. Each outstanding share entitled to vote shall be entitled to one vote upon each matter voted on at a meeting of

shareholders. Except as otherwise required by applicable law, the vote of a majority of the shareholders present in person or by proxy at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the shareholders.

Section 7 Proxies. At meetings of the shareholders, a shareholder may vote in person or by proxy executed in writing in compliance with applicable law and filed with the secretary of the corporation at or before the time of the meeting.

Section 8. Informal action by shareholders. Any action required or permitted by law to be taken by the shareholders at a meeting may be taken without a meeting if one or more consents in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the shareholders entitled to vote at a meeting.

ARTICLE 3. DIRECTORS.

Section 1. General powers. The business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the board of directors.

Section 2. Initial directors. The initial board of directors shall be comprised of the following initial directors:

Section 3. Number. The number of directors constituting the board of directors shall be not less than one nor more than seven. Within such limits, the number may be fixed or changed from time to time by the vote of a majority of the shareholders or by vote of a majority of the directors.

Section 4. Election and Tenure of Office. The directors are elected at the annual meeting of the shareholders and hold office until the next annual meeting and until their successors have been elected and qualified.

Section 5. Regular meetings. A regular meeting of the board of directors shall be held immediately after, and at the same place as, the annual meeting of shareholders. The board of directors may, by resolution, provide for additional regular meetings of the board.

Section 6. Special meetings. Special meetings of the directors for any purpose or purposes permitted by law may be called by the president of the corporation or by any two directors. The person or persons who call such meeting may fix any time or place for the holding of such meeting.

Section 7. Notice. Notices of meetings, annual or special, must be given in writing to directors by the secretary or an assistant secretary or, if there is no such officer, by any director or shareholder.

Notices of directors' meetings must be given either personally or by first-class mail or other means of written communication, addressed to the director at the address of the director appearing on the records of the corporation or given by the director to the corporation for the purpose of notice. Notice of a directors' meeting will be given to each director at least two weeks prior to the meeting, unless a greater period is required under the state corporation statutes for giving notice of a meeting.

This notice will state the place, date, and hour of the meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted. The notice of an annual meeting and any special meeting at which directors are to be elected will include the names of the nominees that, at the time of the notice, the board of directors intends to present for election.

Section 8. Waiver of Notice. Any director may waive notice of any meeting before or after the meeting. Such waiver must be in writing signed by the director and delivered to the secretary of the corporation for inclusion in the minutes of the meeting.

Section 9. Quorum and voting. Except as otherwise required by applicable law, a majority of the directors shall constitute a quorum at a meeting of the directors. Each director shall be entitled to one vote upon each matter voted on at a meeting of the directors. Except as otherwise required by applicable law, the vote of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the board of directors.

Section 10. Informal action by directors. Any action required or permitted by law to be taken by the directors at a meeting may be taken without a meeting if one or more consents in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors entitled to vote at a meeting.

the chairperson of the board of directors, the president, the secretary, or the board of directors, unless the notice specifies a later time for the effectiveness of the resignation. If the resignation is effective at a later time, a successor may be elected to take office when the resignation becomes effective.

Directors may be removed from office, and vacancies on the board of directors may be filled, in any manner allowed by applicable law.

ARTICLE 4. OFFICERS.

Section 1. Number. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, a secretary, and a treasurer (or officers with different titles that perform the similar duties of these officers), which are appointed by the board of directors, with the optional appointment of one or more vice-presidents at the discretion of the board. The board of directors may appoint such other additional officers as it may see fit from time to time. Subject to contractual agreements approved by the board of directors, officers of the corporation shall serve at the pleasure of the board of directors, and shall have the authority and duties specified from time to time by the board of directors, and shall receive salary and benefits as may be approved by the board.

Section 2. President. The president has general supervision, direction, and control of the day-to-day business and affairs of the corporation, subject to the direction and control of the board of directors. The president presides at all meetings of the shareholders and directors and is an ex officio member of all the standing committees, including any executive committee of the board, and has the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of president or chief executive officer of a corporation and other powers and duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the board of directors or these bylaws.

Section 3. Treasurer. The treasurer will keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and records of accounts of the properties and business transactions of the corporation.

The treasurer will deposit monies and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the corporation with the depositories designated by the board of directors. He or she will disburse the funds of the corporation in payment of the just demands against the corporation; will render to the president and directors, whenever they request it, an account of all his or her transactions as chief financial officer and of the financial condition of the corporation; and have such other powers and perform such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the board of directors.

Section 4. Secretary. The corporate secretary (or other corporate officer designated by the board of directors to maintain and keep corporate records) will keep, or cause to be kept, at the principal office of the corporation, a book of minutes of all meetings of directors and shareholders. The minutes will state the time and place of holding of all meetings; whether regular or special, if special, how called or authorized; the notice given or the waivers of notice received; the names of those present at directors' meetings; the number of shares present or represented at shareholders' meetings; and an account of the proceedings.

The secretary will keep, or cause to be kept, at the principal office of the corporation, or at the office of the corporation's transfer agent, a share register, showing the names of the shareholders and their addresses, the number and classes of shares held by each, the number and date of certificates issued for shares, and the number and date of cancellation of every certificate surrendered for cancellation.

The secretary will keep, or cause to be kept, at the principal office of the corporation, the original or a copy of the bylaws of the corporation, as amended or otherwise altered to date, certified by him or her.

The secretary will give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of shareholders and directors required to be given by law or by the provisions of these bylaws. He or she will prepare, or cause to be prepared, an alphabetical listing of shareholders for inspection prior to and at meetings of shareholders as required these bylaws.

The secretary has charge of the seal of the corporation (if applicable) and has such other powers and may perform such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the board or these bylaws.

ARTICLE 5. BOOKS AND RECORDS.

Section 1. Books and records. The corporation shall create and maintain such books and records, including minutes of meetings, stock ledgers, and financial records, as may be required by law and any such additional records as may be specified by the directors and officers from time to time.

Section 2. Inspection by shareholders. To the extent required by applicable law, and to the additional extent permitted from time to time by the directors, shareholders shall have the right to inspect the books and records of the corporation.

ARTICLE 6. MISCELLANEOUS.

Section 1. Share certificates. Shareholders of the corporation shall be entitled to one or more certificates representing shares owned by such shareholders. Share certificates shall be in the form specified from time to time by the board of directors.

Section 2. Dividends and distributions. The board of directors may from time to time declare, and the corporation may pay, dividends on outstanding shares of the corporation, subject to limitations provided by law and the articles of incorporation of the corporation.

Section 3. Regular and executive committees. The board of directors may designate one or more regular committees to report to the board on any area of corporate operation and performance.

To the extent allowed under state corporate statutes, the board of directors also may designate and delegate specific decision-making authority to one or more executive committees, each consisting of two or more directors, that have the authority of the board of directors to approve corporate decisions in the specific areas designated by the board of directors.

Section 4. Seal. The board of directors may adopt, and from time to time modify, a corporate seal.

Section 5. Fiscal year. The fiscal year of the corporation shall be the period designated by the board of directors.

Section 6. Amendment. These bylaws may be amended from time to time by the directors or the shareholders in the manner permitted by applicable law.



An individual shall not be admitted to the premises unless the retailer has verified that the individual is 21 years of age or older by an individual's proof of identification using digital age verification.
- 3. <u>Limitation on Sales</u>. In accordance with M.G.L. c. 94G, § 7, a Marijuana Retailer may not sell more than one ounce of cannabis or five grams of cannabis concentrate to a consumer per transaction.
- 4. <u>Unauthorized Sales and Right to Refuse Sales</u>. We shall refuse to sell cannabis to any consumer who is unable to produce valid proof of identification. We may refuse to sell cannabis products to a consumer if, in the opinion of the marijuana establishment agent based on the information available to the agent at that time, the consumer or the public would be placed at risk. Tree Beard Inc. shall not sell to an individual more than one ounce of marijuana or five grams of marijuana concentrate per transaction. Tree Beard Inc will not sell cannabis products containing nicotine or alcohol.
- 5. Recording Sales: Tree Beard Inc. shall only utilize a point-of-sale (POS) system and sales recording module approved by the Commission, in consultation with the DOR. We shall conduct a monthly analysis of our equipment and sales data to determine that no software has been installed that could be utilized to manipulate or alter sales data and that no other methodology has been employed to manipulate or alter sales data. We will maintain records of performing the monthly analysis and produce it upon request to the Commission. If it is determined that software has been installed for the purpose of manipulation or alteration of sales data or other methods have been utilized to manipulate or alter sales data: we shall immediately disclose the information to the Commission; we shall cooperate with the Commission in any investigation regarding manipulation or alteration of sales data; and take such other action directed by the Commission to comply with 935 CMR 500.105.
- 6. <u>Record Retention:</u> shall comply with 830 CMR 62C.25.1: *Record Retention* and DOR Directive 16-1 regarding recordkeeping requirements.
- 7. <u>Point-of-sale</u>: Tree Beard Inc. utilizes separate accounting practices at the point-of-sale for cannabis and cannabis product sales, and non-cannabis sales. The Commission and the DOR may audit and examine the point-of-sale system used by a retailer in order to ensure compliance with Massachusetts tax laws and 935 CMR 500.000.
- 8. Consumer Education. Tree Beard Inc. will make available educational materials about marijuana products to consumers and will have an adequate supply of current educational material available for distribution. Educational materials must be available in commonly spoken languages designated by the Commission, which will include, but not be limited to appropriate materials for the visually- and hearing-impaired. Such materials shall be made available for inspection by the Commission upon request. The educational material must include at least the following:

- (a) A warning that cannabis has not been analyzed or approved by the FDA, that there is limited information on side effects, that there may be health risks associated with using cannabis, and that it should be kept away from children;
- (b) A warning that when under the influence of cannabis, driving is prohibited by M.G.L. c. 90, § 24, and machinery should not be operated;
- (c) Information to assist in the selection of cannabis, describing the potential differing effects of various strains of cannabis, as well as various forms and routes of administration;
- (d) Materials offered to consumers to enable them to track the strains used and their associated effects:
- (e) Information describing proper dosage and titration for different routes of administration. Emphasis shall be on using the smallest amount possible to achieve the desired effect. The impact of potency must also be explained;
- (f) A discussion of tolerance, dependence, and withdrawal;
- (g) Facts regarding substance abuse signs and symptoms, as well as referral information for substance abuse treatment programs;
- (h) A statement that consumers may not sell cannabis to any other individual;
- (i) Information regarding penalties for possession or distribution of cannabis in violation of Massachusetts law; and
- (j) Any other information required by the Commission.
- 9. <u>Testing</u>: No cannabis product, including cannabis, may be sold or otherwise marketed for adult use that is not capable of being tested by Independent Testing Laboratories, except as allowed under 935 CMR 500.000. The product must be deemed to comply with the standards required under 935 CMR 500.160.

- 1. General: Tree Beard, Inc., is committed to a diverse and inclusive workforce in the operation of its cannabis establishment. Tree Beard's diversity plan was created to enrich our community members and level the playing field for all individuals after years of oppression, discrimination, and inequality for minorities in society and the workforce. Tree Bead strives to promote equity among minorities, women, veterans, people with disabilities, and people of gender identities and sexual orientation who self-identity as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or questioning such identities and commonly known as LGBTQ+ (hereinafter "equitable demographic group"). Tree Beard intends to promote equity by providing the equitable demographic group of individuals with tools and opportunities they need to achieve social and economic self-sustainability. Our company is seeking to create an inclusive work environment welcoming and respecting all people based on merit and skill regardless of race, creed, colors, national origins, disabilities, gender, age, sexuality and orientation. Our diversity will make our company stronger and improve our ability to empower our community.
- 2. <u>Equitable Demographic Group defined:</u> The equitable demographic group this diversity plan seeks to benefit shall be further defined where applicable for percentage purposes as follows:

3. <u>Compliance:</u> Tree Beard shall adhere to all laws in fulfilling its diversity plan, including, but not limited to the requirements set forth in 935 CMR 500.105(4) which provides the permitted and prohibited advertising, branding, marketing, and sponsorship practices of Marijuana Establishments. This plan, and all actions taken by Tree Beard, will not violate the Commission's regulations with respect to limitations on ownership or control or other applicable state laws. The progress or success of this plan will be demonstrated upon each license renewal period, commencing one year from provisional licensure.

4. Goals:

I. Increasing the ownership interest of individuals from the equitable demographic group in Tree Beard, Inc., to 50%.

- II. Increasing the number of individuals from the equitable demographic group holding management and executive positions in Tree Beard, Inc., to 50% of all managers and executives.
- III. Increasing the number of individuals from the equitable demographic who are employed by Tree Beard, Inc., to 50% of all employees.
- IV. Providing at least 25 individuals from the equitable demographic group with tools and opportunities to achieve their goal of entering the adult-use cannabis industry each year.
- V. Increasing the number of businesses owned by individuals from the equitable demographic group that contract or otherwise do business with Tree Beard, Inc. to 50% of all businesses.
- 3. <u>Programs to achieve Goals:</u>
- I. Increasing the ownership interest of individuals of the equitable demographic group in Tree Beard, Inc., to 50% through the use of non-discriminatory sales, targeted advertisement of stock sales, and priority offerings.
- I. Tree Beard's original owners support the company's perpetual commitment to an inclusive environment and economic opportunities for all based upon merit regardless of their own race, sex, status, gender identities, and sexual orientation. Tree Beard intends to increase the ownership interest of individuals of the equitable demographic group by offering any future sales of any ownership interest in the company in a non-discriminatory manner. Tree Beard intends to increase its future ownership interest of individuals of the equitable demographic group by publicizing future public offerings with a focus of interest for persons of the equitable demographic group in the local Standard Times (New Bedford) and Herald (Fall River) newspapers. Tree Beard will prioritize sale offerings to companies and individuals certified for minority business enterprises, women business enterprises, and veteran business enterprises.
- II. Increasing the number of individuals from the equitable demographic group holding management and executive positions in Tree Beard, Inc., to 50% of all managers and executives.
- II. Tree Beard seeks to increase the management and executive positions held by individuals from the equitable demographic group to 50% of all employees. Tree Beard intends to increase its number of skilled managers and executives from the equitable demographic group through its hiring and training procedures. Tree Beard will seek to hire local individuals from the equitable demographic group through the use of targeted hiring focusing on the equitable demographic group, rigorous applicant review, and advertisement of employment opportunities in local newspapers with high population demographics matching the equitable demographic group, including the local Standard Times (New Bedford) and Herald (Fall River) newspapers.
- III. Increasing the number of individuals from the equitable demographic group who are employed by Tree Beard, Inc., to 50% of all employees.

III. Tree Beard's commitment to equity leadership will shine across the Commonwealth and beyond with its intent to employ as many individuals from the equitable demographic group from the City of New Bedford as possible. The City's minimum request is to ensure at least 20% of residents are employed, but Tree Beard strives to increase the number of employed residents to 80%. Additionally, Tree Beard will ensure 50% of all employees are from the equitable demographic group. Tree Beard intends to heavily advertise employment opportunities in the City of New Bedford and Fall River through local publication in the Standard Times (New Bedford) and Herald (Fall River) newspapers, social media, and word-of-mouth contact to our local networks and chamber of commerce. Tree Beard intends on increasing its resident employees and equitable demographic group employees by hosting several initial job fairs and future reoccurring job fairs as necessary. Tree Beard intends to maintain its employees by our hiring and training procedures.

Tree Beard utilizes a non-discriminatory hiring practice for employees. Tree Beard intends to reach out to its employees through an internal process on many matters relative to keeping them apprised of our company. Utilizing this internal process we intend to encourage our employees to recommend friends and family who are within the demographic group for employment. Tree Beard intends to promote employees based on merit of performance of duties, but will establish a promotion process that employs equity principles for a fair opportunity for all including the equitable demographic group.

IV. Providing at least 25 individuals from the equitable demographic group with tools and opportunities to achieve their goal of entering the adult-use cannabis industry each year.

IV. Tree Beard seeks to increase the opportunities for individuals from the equitable demographic group to enter the adult-use cannabis industry beyond its local hiring commitments by sponsoring donations to the International Cannabis Physicians Association nonprofit that conducts cannabis educational seminars and teaches skills to individuals helpful for entering the adult-use cannabis industry. Tree Beard's donations shall be made quarterly and in the minimum monetary amount of \$1,000.00 and in-kind volunteer hours of 20 hours. Tree Beard seeks to make meaningful impact with its donations and intends to increase its donation and volunteer amounts with higher frequency as revenue allows. Tree Beard and the ICPA will keep statistical tracking data to ensure at least 25 of the individuals assisted are from the equitable demographic group. Tree Beard will operate an internship program to assist individuals from the equitable demographic group obtain skills from our trained employees to strengthen opportunities to enter the industry. At least 25 individuals per year shall be in the internship program. Tree Beard will provide informational sessions to provide knowledge of employment opportunities, and training seminars for skill-building.

V. Increasing the number of businesses owned by individuals from the equitable demographic group that contract or otherwise do business with Tree Beard, Inc. to 50% of all businesses.

V. Tree Beard seeks to partner with as many individuals from the equitable demographic group that contract with Tree Beard. Tree Beard intends to further seek partners from the equitable demographic group that own small businesses in the cities in which we operate. Tree Beard utilizes a non-discriminatory hiring practice for third party vendors.

5. Reconciliation of Plan Success through Metrics:

Tree Beard will reconcile the success of its diversity plan by performing quarterly reviews of company statistics, third-party publications, and personnel reports relative to all actions taken to reach the seven goals. The progress or success of this plan will be demonstrated upon each license renewal period, commencing one year from provisional licensure. In an effort to fully understand the impact of Tree Beard's success, quality reporting from employees involved in effectuating the diversity plan will be reviewed and recommendations implemented. Tree Beard's measurement metrics seek to identify the:

- 1. the number of individuals from the equitable demographic group who were hired, retained and promoted;
- 2. the number of new positions created for individuals from the equitable demographic group since initial licensure;
- 3. the number and type of trainings, community outreach events, informational sessions,
- 4. the number of and type of community outreach events, information sessions, and third-party sponsorships
- 5. the number of postings in diverse publications and general publications in the City; and

MAINTAINING FINANCIAL RECORDS

- 1. General: Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that there is a locked office for the purpose of keeping its business records, including financial records, for inspection by the Cannabis Control Commission upon request.
- 2. Maintenance: Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that all records of a Marijuana Establishment shall be maintained in a secure location within the facility and in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.
- 3. Confidentiality: Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that all records will be kept in a locked area within a secured location within the facility not accessible to the public nor easily accessible to an unauthorized individual. Access to confidential records shall be limited to only those reasonably necessary for the operation of the business.
- 4. Closure: Following closure of Tree Beard Inc. all records will be kept for at least two years at its own expense in a form and location acceptable to the CCC.
- 5. Accounting and Auditing: All of Tree Beard Inc.'s financial records shall be reviewed by an accountant or other tax professional for accuracy. Independent audits on the financial records shall be conducted annually.
- 6. Financial Records: All financial records of Tree Beard Inc. shall be kept as required by 935 CMR 500.000, including, but not limited to:

OPERATING PROCEDURES SUMMARY

Written Operating Procedures: Tree Beard Inc. written operating procedures include:

- 1. Security measures in compliance with 935 CMR 500.110;
- 2. Employee security policies, including personal safety and crime prevention techniques;

2. Agent Training:

All employees and agents of Tree Beard Inc., must perform training prior to performing job functions. Training shall be tailored to the roles and responsibilities of the job function the employee/agent is expected to perform. In addition to specific job function training, all employees/agents shall be required to take a Responsible Vendor Program under 935 CMR 500.105(2)(b). All employee/agents shall be required to receive at least eight hours of ongoing training each year.

3. Responsible Vendor Training Program:

Upon licensure or renewal of licensure, as applicable, all current owners, managers, and employees of Tree Beard that are involved in the handling and sale of marijuana shall attend and successfully complete a responsible vendor program, and maintain Tree Beard's status as a "responsible vendor." Tree Beard shall select a Commission approved Responsible Vendor Training Program for its Responsible Vendor Training. All owners,

managers, and employees involved in the handling and sale of marijuana shall successfully complete the responsible vendor program once a year thereafter. All new employees involved in the handling and sale of marijuana shall be required to successfully complete a responsible vendor program within ninety days of hire. Tree Beard shall offer the responsible vendor program to administrative employees to take on a voluntary basis. All records of responsible vendor training program compliance, including test results, shall be kept for four years and made available to inspection by the Commission and any other applicable licensing authority upon request during normal business hours.

QUALITY CONTROL AND TESTING PROCEDURES

- 1) <u>General</u>: Tree Beard is committed to providing its clients with only high quality safe cannabis products. All employees are required to follow the strict quality control and testing procedures contained below.
- 2) Independent Testing No cannabis product shall be sold or otherwise marketed for adult use that has not first been tested by an Independent Testing Laboratory and deemed to comply with the standards required under 935 CMR 500.160. Testing of marijuana products shall be performed by an Independent Testing Laboratory in compliance with the *Protocol for Sampling and Analysis of Finished Medical Marijuana Products and Marijuana-infused Products*, as amended in November, 2016, published by the DPH. Testing of environmental media (e.g., soils, solid growing media, and water) shall be performed in compliance with the *Protocol for Sampling and Analysis of Environmental Media for Massachusetts Registered Medical Marijuana Dispensaries* published by the DPH.
- 3) Adverse Laboratory Results: Tree Beard Inc. shall immediately respond to laboratory results that indicate contaminant levels are above acceptable limits established in the DPH protocols identified in 935 CMR 500.160(1), including notifying The Cannabis Control Commission within 72 hours of any laboratory testing results indicating that the contamination cannot be remediated and disposing of the production batch. The notification must be from both Tree Beard Inc. and the Independent Testing Laboratory, separately and directly. Tree Beard Inc. notification must describe a proposed plan of action for both the destruction of the contaminated product and the assessment of the source of contamination. Records of such testing shall be maintained for one year. All transportation of cannabis to and from Independent Testing Laboratories providing cannabis testing services shall comply with 935 CMR 500.105(13). All storage of cannabis at a laboratory providing cannabis testing services shall comply with 935 CMR 500.105(11). All excess cannabis must be disposed in compliance with 935 CMR 500.105(12), either by the Independent Testing Laboratory returning excess cannabis to the source Marijuana Establishment for disposal or by the Independent Testing Laboratory disposing of it directly.
- 4) Tree Beard Inc. will ensuring that only the leaves and flowers of the female marijuana plant are processed accordingly in a safe and sanitary manner as prescribed below:
- Well cured and generally free of seeds and stems;
- Free of dirt, sand, debris, and other foreign matter;
- Free of contamination by mold, rot, other fungus, and bacterial diseases;
- Prepared and handled on food-grade stainless steel tables; and
- Packaged in a secure area.
- 5) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that all agents whose job includes contact with marijuana is subject to the requirements for food handlers specified in 105 CMR 300.000
- 6) Tree Beard will ensure that any agent working in direct contact with marijuana shall conform to sanitary practices while on duty, including:

- Maintaining adequate personal cleanliness; and
- Washing hands appropriately with soap and running water at a suitable temperature.
- 7) Tree Beard Inc. shall ensure that all employees will have access to hand-washing facilities with appropriate sanitization equipment such as soap, sanitary towels and dryers, that will be located in production areas and where good sanitary practices require employees to wash and sanitize their hands.
- 8) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that there is sufficient space for placement of equipment and storage of materials as is necessary for the maintenance of sanitary operations. All storage areas shall be kept clean, orderly and free of clutter.
- 9) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that all litter and waste shall be properly removed so as to minimize the development of odor and the potential for the waste attracting and harboring pests. At a minimum, all waste shall be removed from the building to appropriate locked waste disposal receptacles daily. All waste disposal areas shall be kept clean, orderly, and free of waste and clutter so as to attract and harbor pests.
- 10) Tree Beard Inc. will have floors, walls, and ceilings that are constructed in such a manner that they may be adequately kept clean and in good repair. The property, fixtures, and building shall be kept in good clean order and repair to maintain a sanitary work condition.
- 11) Tree Beard Inc. will use equipment and utensils designed and of such workmanship and material as to be adequately cleanable and sanitary.
- 12) All edible products shall be prepared, handled, and stored in compliance with the sanitation requirements of 105 CMR 590.000.
- 13) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that all contact surfaces, shall be maintained, cleaned, and sanitized as frequently as necessary to protect against contamination. All surfaces shall be cleaned and sanitized with products approved by the US Environmental Protection Agency, in accordance with all labeled instructions.
- 14) Tree Beard in will ensure that adequate lighting will be installed and maintained throughout the building, including, but not limited to all processing and storage areas, and areas where utensils and equipment are cleaned.
- 15) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure all toxic items shall be identified, held, and stored in a manner that protects against contamination of marijuana.
- 16) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure sufficient water supply is available in an adequate size and design in order to maintain necessary operations with safe, potable, and adequate supply of

Municipal water. The establishment shall have separate lines for potable and waste water lines.

- 17) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure that all employees will have access to adequate, readily accessible toilet facilities that are maintained in a sanitary condition and in good repair. Tree Beard Inc. shall monitor against and regularly sanitize against the growth of undesirable microorganisms in all areas including toilet facilities.
- 18) Tree Beard Inc. will ensure the storage and transportation of finished products will be under conditions that will protect them against physical, chemical, and microbial contamination. Finished products shall be stored, transported, and handled in a manner so as to prevent against deterioration of finished product or their containers.

RECORD KEEPING

- 1. <u>General</u>: Tree Beard Inc. shall keep an office for the purpose of keeping its business records for inspection by the Cannabis Control Commission ("Cannabis Control Commission") upon request.
- 2. <u>Maintenance</u>: The records of a Marijuana Establishment shall be maintained in a secure location within the facility and in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.
- 3. <u>Confidentiality:</u> All records shall be kept in a locked area within a secured location within the facility not accessible to the public nor easily accessible to an unauthorized individual. Access to confidential records shall be limited to only those reasonably necessary for the operation of the business.
- 4. <u>Closure</u>: Following closure of Tree Beard Inc., all records must be kept for at least two years at its own expense in a form and location acceptable to the CCC.
- 5. Required Records: All records shall be kept as required by 935 CMR 500.000, including, but not limited to:
 - (a) Written operating procedures as required by 935 CMR 500.105(1);
 - (b) Inventory records as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8);
 - (c) Seed-to-sale tracking records for all cannabis products as required by 935 CMR 500.105(8)(e);
 - (d) A staffing plan that will demonstrate accessible business hours and safe cultivation conditions:
 - (e) Personnel policies and procedures;
 - (f) Waste disposal records as required under 935 CMR 500.105(12)
 - (g) Business records, which shall include manual or computerized records of:
 - Assets and liabilities;
 - Monetary transactions;
 - —. Books of accounts, which shall include journals, ledgers, and supporting documents, agreements, checks, invoices, and vouchers;
 - —. Sales records including the quantity, form, and cost of marijuana products; and
 - —. Salary and wages paid to each employee, stipend paid to each board member, and any executive compensation, bonus, benefit, or item of value paid to any individual affiliated with a Marijuana Establishment, including members of the nonprofit corporation, if any.
 - (h) The following personnel records:
 - 1. Job descriptions for each employee and volunteer position, as well as organizational charts consistent with the job descriptions;
 - 2. A personnel record for each marijuana establishment agent. Such records shall be maintained for at least 12 months after termination of the individual's affiliation with the Marijuana Establishment and shall include, at a minimum, the following:
 - a. all materials submitted to the Commission pursuant to 935 CMR 500.030(2);
 - b. documentation of verification of references;
 - c. the job description or employment contract that includes duties, authority, responsibilities, qualifications, and supervision
 - d. documentation of all required training, including training regarding privacy and confidentiality requirements, and the signed statement of the individual indicating the date, time, and place he or she received said training and the topics discussed, including the name and title of presenters;
 - e. documentation of periodic performance evaluations;
 - f. a record of any disciplinary action taken; and
 - g. notice of completed responsible vendor and eight-hour related duty training.
 - 3. All background check reports obtained in accordance with 935 CMR 500.030.

RESTRICTING ACCESS TO INDIVIDUALS UNDER 21

- 1. <u>General:</u> Tree Beard, Inc., is committed to a safe and secure cannabis establishment so that individuals twenty-one and older may access quality recreational cannabis products.
- 2. <u>Identification:</u> All individuals seeking access to the premises shall be positively identified with a government issued identification card to limit access solely to individuals 21 years of age or older. No individual under the age of 21 years of age shall be allowed access to the premises.
- 3. <u>Employees:</u> All employees and registered agents must be 21 years of age or older.
- 4. Visitors: All visitors must be 21 years of age or older.

POSITIVE IMPACT PLAN

- 1. <u>General:</u> Tree Beard, Inc., is rooted in the community of New Bedford and intends to be a major resource and advocate for the economic empowerment of the City and its inhabitants. Tree Beard's positive impact plan is focused on benefiting the City of New Bedford and its inhabitants as they have been negatively impacted in the areas of median income, drug convictions, and substance abuse. As an area designated as disproportionately impacted, we will focus on promoting economic opportunity, assisting individuals and family members impacted by past drug convictions, and substance abuse prevention.
- 2. <u>Compliance:</u> Tree Beard shall adhere to all laws in fulfilling its positive impact plan, including, but not limited to the requirements set forth in 935 CMR 500.105(4) which provides the permitted and prohibited advertising, branding, marketing, and sponsorship practices of Marijuana Establishments. This plan, and all actions taken by Tree Beard, will not violate the Commission's regulations with respect to limitations on ownership or control or other applicable state laws. The progress or success of this plan will be demonstrated upon each license renewal period, commencing one year from provisional licensure.
- 3. Goals:
- I. Creating economic opportunity for the community.
- II. Assisting individuals impacted directly and indirectly by past drug convictions.
- III. Promoting wellness information, healthy lifestyles, and substance abuse prevention.
- 4. <u>Programs:</u>
- I. Creating economic opportunity for the community.

Tree Beard will create economic opportunity for the community directly through its hiring practices for employees and third-party vendors with a focus on hiring local New Bedford residents and businesses. Tree Beard seeks to hire 50% of its employees and third-party vendors from New Bedford. Tree Beard promotes full participation in the cannabis industry and intends to benefit the local New Bedford community and economy. Tree Beard will keep statistical data to ensure at least 50% of its employees and third-party vendors are from New Bedford.

As a fellow Economic Empowerment company, Tree Beard intends to expand upon its economic impact indirectly through programs designed to assist the local economy and Commission-designated Economic Empowerment applicants and Social Equity Program participants from New Bedford. We intend to assist individuals in entering the adult-use cannabis industry by reducing access barriers. Our hiring practices, community outreach, education seminars, training seminars, and volunteer training program will ensure increased economic opportunities in the adult-use cannabis industry is realized for residents of New Bedford and those who are designated as Economic Empowerment and Social Equity. Tree Beard will keep statistical

data to ensure at least its positive impact programs assist individuals from New Bedford and Commission-designated Economic Empowerment and Social Equity statuses. Tree Beard's ultimate intention is for 100% of its positive impact programs to assist individuals from New Bedford. We will be providing our time, skills, and finances towards promoting our own employee base as well as helping others seeking to enter the industry. Our owners and employees will work together on our initiatives to ensure our goals are met. The owners are members of the non-profit, the International Cannabis Physicians Association, currently seeking 501c3 approval. The Owners plan to continue volunteering and hosting educational seminars on cannabis in the City of New Bedford. The entity provides cannabis education on safe consumption, uses, history, homegrowing, and industry specific workshops. These education and training seminars will be more frequent and industry specific upon licensure and funding. We intend to offer grants, training, and hands-on industry-space. Statistical data will be gathered to ensure at least 50% of our programs are reserved for individuals from New Bedford and other areas designated as disproportionately impacted by the Commission.

Tree Beard seeks to create economic opportunity indirectly by partnerships with local companies and organizations focusing on creating economic opportunities in the local community. The International Cannabis Physicians Association (ICPA) has agreed to be our partner and donee to promote small businesses and cannabis related businesses in our designated areas. Our goal is the ICPA will create a local "empowerment ecosystem" to allow new businesses to flourish with a focus on those in the cannabis related area. The ICPA will assist by providing grants, mentorship, equity funding, group clean-ups, substance abuse prevention, elderly and homelessness assistance, and fundraising initiatives.

II. Assisting individuals impacted directly and indirectly with past drug convictions.

Tree Beard intends to assist individuals who have direct past drug convictions and their friends and families dealing with the collateral effects of those charges. Tree Beard intends to sponsor the local non-profit, Justice Bridge, affiliated with the University of Massachusetts School of Law, which provides low-moderate income individuals with access to justice. Tree Beard's Chief legal officer, Nicholas A. Gomes, Esq., is a participant of the Justice Bridge program and will continue on a limited basis to assist with cases regarding individuals dealing with issues from past drug convictions. Attorney Gomes has successfully held New Bedford's first expungement workshop focused on crimes associated with the war on drugs in September of 2019. Attorney Gomes will continue through Justice Bridge in providing legal services for expungement and sealing of criminal records with a focus on crimes associated with the war on drugs. Tree Beard will also seek to sponsor peer groups for assisting families and friends affected by past drug convictions. Tree Beard has not identified any peer groups assisting families and friends affected by past drug convictions, but will specifically engage the community for a sponsor peer group through the ICPA quarterly. Tree Beard will post quarterly advertisements in the local newspaper, The Standard Times, and engage in monthly online marketing promotions seeking Massachusetts residents who have past drug convictions for employment and sponsoring peer groups for such individuals and their families. Tree Beard seeks to hire 50% of its staff that are Massachusetts residents who have past drug-convictions or past drug-charges.

III. Promoting wellness, healthy lifestyles, and substance abuse prevention.

Tree Beard will promote wellness, healthy lifestyles, and substance abuse prevention as priority initiatives. We are focusing on improving the lives of the people in our community and believe health is just as important as financial well-being. New Bedford was one of the hardest hit communities by economic inequality, illicit substance abuse, gang activity, and the opioid epidemic. Tree Beard believes promoting wellness and active lifestyles through sports and recreation is important to deter from illicit drug use. Tree Beard will be donating annually to the International Cannabis Physicians Association to assist in substance abuse education in an effort to teach younger generations of the dangers from illicit substance use.

Tree Beard will make further donations annually in its partnership with the International Cannabis Physicians Association (ICPA) to promote wellness, healthy lifestyles and substance abuse prevention in New Bedford will improve the community's well-being and ability to prosper. Tree Beard has performed three informational sessions through the International Cannabis Physicians Association in New Bedford thus far and will continue doing so as part of its positive impact plan. The ICPA provides cannabis advocacy and community outreach. Most recently, Dr. Kellie Roberge, from Tricann Alternatives of Maine, came to New Bedford to speak about the endocannabinoid system and opioid addiction. Tree Beard is also sponsoring the creation of a community room and wellness center located at 246 Union Street, New Bedford. The community room is open as a rotating local artist gallery with Zen Garden sessions for the general public and is expanding its offerings to include educational events and small-business work-space opportunities. Tree Beard's efforts in the community room will serve and help the residents of New Bedford in their wellness, healthy lifestyles, and substance abuse prevention. Tree Beard will keep statistical data to ensure its positive impact programs assist individuals from New Bedford at a high frequency to meet the needs of the community. Tree Beard's goal is to have 100% of its positive impact programs to assist individuals from New Bedford.

5. Reconciliation of Plan Success through Metrics:

Tree Beard will reconcile the success of its positive impact plan by performing quarterly reviews of company statistics, third-party publications, and personnel reports relative to all actions taken to reach the three goals. In an effort to fully understand the impact of Tree Beard's success, quality reporting from employees involved in effectuating the positive impact plan will be reviewed and recommendations implemented. The progress or success of its plan shall be documented upon renewal of its license each year, commencing upon one year from a provisional licensure. Tree Beard will secure letters from the organization detailing the donations made and volunteer hours spent a part of its metric of compliance and success of the Positive Impact Plan. Tree Beard's measurement metrics seek to identify the:

- 1. the value of economic opportunity created for the community including new employment and new businesses in the City;
- 2. the number and type of trainings, community outreach events, third-party sponsorships, and informational sessions pertaining to economic enrichment;
- 3. the number of successful drug convictions being sealed;

- 4. the number of support groups attended for individuals indirectly affected by past drug convictions;
- 5. the number of events and seminars held for promoting wellness information, industry employment, workforce development, healthy lifestyles, and substance abuse prevention; and
