## **Cannabis Industry**

Did you know as of 2022, 37 U.S. states have legalized medical marijuana use, and 19 have legalized adult-use?

- A 2022 Leafly report states there are a total of 428,059 full-time cannabis-related jobs nationwide.
- Since 2018, the Massachusetts adult-use market has generated \$3 billion in sales and supports 20,163 active jobs.
- Business Insider reports the U.S. cannabis industry is projected to be a \$100 billion market by 2030.

## The regulated industry employs a range of people with varying levels of expertise and knowledge.

- Cannabis recruiting firm Vangst surveyed 150,000 positions and found 34% of business employees had less than one year of experience before entering the workforce.
- Across the U.S., cannabis retail salaries are increasing at all employment levels. Vangst reports Dispensary General Managers and Directors saw pay increases of 13% and 22%, respectively from 2019-2020. Nationally, Budtenders' average wages are \$15 per hour. However, in Massachusetts the average wage is \$16 per hour and as high as \$18 in some markets.
- The number of ancillary businesses that contract with Marijuana Establishments are also on the rise.
