

Medical Use of Marijuana Program: New Caregivers

Personal Caregivers may assist Registered Qualifying Patients with their use of medical marijuana.

To register as a Caregiver with the Cannabis Control Commission's Medical Use of Marijuana Program, you must:

1. Obtain a PIN from the Patient;
2. Have a valid ID;
3. Obtain a passport-style photo, if needed;
4. Register via the Commission's Medical Use of Marijuana Program Online System (MMJOS). Helpful tutorials are available at MassCannabisControl.com.



FACT

Caregiver duties may include transporting Patients to and from a Medical Marijuana Treatment Center, obtaining and transporting medical marijuana, and preparing and administering products to Patients for consumption.



The fastest and easiest way to become a Caregiver in Massachusetts is to register online through the Commission's MMJOS.

Once approved, Caregivers will receive a Program registration card, which they must always carry while in possession of medical marijuana.

What Every Caregiver Should Know:

- Caregivers must be 21 years or older.
- A Patient may designate up to two Personal Caregivers.
- An individual may not serve as a Personal Caregiver for more than five Patient at one time.
- Caregivers may possess up to 10 ounces of medical marijuana.
- Caregivers may not receive compensation nor sell or consume the Patient's medical marijuana products.
- Caregivers do not need to be residents of Massachusetts.
- Both Patient and Caregiver must maintain an active registration with the Massachusetts Medical Use of Marijuana Program.
