

Renewing Your Medical Marijuana Registration

All Patients of the Massachusetts Medical Use of Marijuana Program must renew their registration annually.

As a Patient, it is important to stay up to date on all requirements. Your registration must be renewed annually and can be completed online. Step-by-step renewal instructions are available at MassCannabisControl.com.

If your Patient certification has expired, you must visit your Certifying Healthcare Provider to get re-certified prior to renewing your registration. In-person and telehealth options may be available for your convenience.



FACT

There is no fee to register for a Medical Marijuana registration card through the Cannabis Control Commission. However, Certifying Healthcare Providers may charge Patients a fee for annual certification visits.



What Every Renewing Patient Should Know

1. Annual Renewal

Your Patient registration requires annual renewal, but you can start the process up to 60 days in advance in the Medical Use of Marijuana Program Online System (MMJOS).

2. Certification Required

Make sure your certification is current before renewing. If it is expired, consult with your Certifying Healthcare Provider to renew.

3. No State Fee to Register

While there's no fee to register with the state's Program, Providers may charge their own fee for Patients to become certified.

4. Update Contact Info

Update any changed personal information details in MMJOS within five days.

5. Carry Your Card

Always have your Program ID card on hand when in possession of medical marijuana. Patients may possess up to a 60-day supply (a maximum of 10 oz).
